Independence Day: The 4th of July holiday is an occasion for legitimate pride in our country and its achievements. It is a time of reflection – on the need to defend the freedoms which are so precious to us. We should also set aside some time on

this Independence Day to give thanks for the religious freedom we enjoy in this country. One very appropriate way to celebrate this freedom is to join with your fellow parishioners here at St. John's on July 4th at the 8:00 a.m. Mass. Let us pray that God will continue to bless this great land of ours.

<u>July 4th Holiday Schedule</u>: This official federal holiday marking Independence Day falls on Monday, July 4th; our rectory and school offices will be closed that day. We will have only <u>one</u> Mass on July 4th at 8:00 a.m., and the church and the chapel will be closed after that Mass.



FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Our scriptures today are filled with symbolic language and symbolic experiences. The overriding symbol is that of peace; indeed, peace abounds today. The impression of peace is created throughout our first reading from the prophet Isaiah (Is. 66:10-14) where God's people are described as being cared for by Mother Jerusalem. In the second reading (Gal. 6:14-18) St. Paul speaks of peace and mercy as hallmarks of the followers of Jesus. And in the gospel (Luke 10:1-12, 17-29) we sense the wellbeing the disciples felt when they returned from their mission and told Jesus about the healings that had come at their hands. They experience the peace that comes from a mission accomplished. Peace of mind – peace of soul – are things everybody longs to have – no matter what one's age or social background. For Jesus, peace is an unfailing sign of the proximity of God. The disciples would be quick to realize it as they exchange peace with those whom they visit. It would appear as a hallmark of the harvesters who labor to bring about the new creation, the new Jerusalem. So important is this peace, that when it is not present, the disciples must look for another place. Sandals are to be shook as the fate of Sodom is called upon the inhospitable town. The way of peace is a two-lane avenue. Sometimes in order to achieve that peace, a new direction needs to be taken. That direction is the way of Jesus, the way of everlasting peace.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Tuesday, July 5th - St. Anthony Zaccaria and St. Elizabeth of Portugal

St. Anthony lived in the 16th century; born in Cremona (Italy), he studied at Padua, became a priest and founded a small society of priests that was devoted to the reform of people's morality. May the spirit of St. Anthony help our efforts to bring back values and moral standards to our permissive culture!

Born into a Spanish royal family in 1271, Elizabeth married the King of Portugal and raised two children. After her husband died, she devoted herself to the poor. She died in 1331.

<u>Wednesday, July 6th - St. Maria Goretti</u>
Today we honor a 20th century saint, Maria Goretti, the young Italian girl who died in 1902 at the age of 12 resisting a sexual assault. Maria was the daughter of a poor Italian tenant farmer; she had no chance to go to school, never learned to read and write. But in a century noted for sexual promiscuity, she became a model of purity and chastity. At her canonization in 1950, Maria's attacker (who spent nearly 30 years in prison) knelt among the throngs gathered in St. Peter's Square and wept. On this day let us pray for our young people and – in a special way, for victims of rape and sexual abuse.

Saturday, July 9th – St. Augustine Zhao Rong and Companions

Newly included in the calendar of saints, Augustine Zhao Rong was a Chinese priest – who (along with 119 other priests, seminarians and catechists) was cruelly tortured and martyred by Chinese authorities who tried to stamp out Christianity in China in the early 19th century.



School Summer Project: We are off to a great start! In the very first week we have received gifts and donations totaling over \$25,000! That's more than a quarter of our goal in one week! Thank you! As Sister Maryalice made clear when she spoke at all our Masses two weekends ago, after more than 60 years of service, parts of our school are in serious need of repair and restoration. Most especially in need of replacement are our school windows; it is pointless to

repair them anymore; they need to be replaced by modern, energy efficient windows. The gym ceiling is also in need of serious repair – and the cost of all this – about \$100,000!! – is well beyond our regular school and parish budgets. We are appealing to all St. John's families and S.J.B. school alumni to contribute to a special Summer Project School Fund. We are hoping for a contribution of at least \$100 from all of our parish families. In addition, for everyone who contributes \$1000, we will have a small plaque on one of our school windows with the name of the donor, the donor's family, or a loved one in whose memory the donor would like to create a memorial which will be cherished for generations to come. Letters have been sent out to everyone on our parish mailing list and this weekend envelopes are available for anyone not on our mailing list who might wish to participate. Our school is an important part of who we are as a parish. It is an expression of our commitment to future generations. The fact that our school is strong and highly regarded draws young families to our parish. Please pray for the success of this project!
