

Remembrance: This Sunday, as we are all well aware, is the fifteenth anniversary of the terrible attacks that

caused so much loss of life and destruction. It will be a solemn day of mourning, remembrance, prayer, and commitment for New Yorkers, for Americans and for all people who are dedicated to freedom and justice. We will remember those who died in the terrorist attacks and those who gave their lives trying to rescue them. We will ask God to give strength and hope to families who lost loved ones. We will pray for the men and women of the Armed Forces who are defending freedom against terrorism. We will pray for our leaders – that they will be wise, prudent and courageous. May God bless America!



TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: It should come as no surprise that feeling themselves abandoned by Moses, the Israelites reverted to the customs they had so recently left behind. In today's first reading (Ex. 32:7-14), Moses daringly petitions God on behalf of the people, and God turns away from the threatened punishment. Living up to the ethical demands of Yahweh and the covenant requires continuing conversions. Like our ancestors in the desert, we will be tempted to fall back into other ways, to put money and power before the needs of others, to worship at the shrines of greed and exploitation. Only sincere repentance and a deep love for God will keep us on the right path.

In our second reading (1Tm. 1:12-17), St. Paul exemplifies this attitude when he describes himself as the worst of sinners. Unembarrassed by this admission, Paul rejoices that he can serve as a model for us; if Jesus treated Paul with mercy and forgiveness, He will surely be just as generous with all who believe and seek His grace.

Luke's three parables of loss in today's gospel (Lk. 15:1-32) are variations on this same theme of God's willingness to search out and forgive those who stray. The images of father, shepherd and homemaker assure us that each of us is precious in God's eyes. When we are lost through sin, the community is incomplete. Our acceptance of forgiveness is cause for joy and celebration.

SPECIAL LITURGICAL CELEBRATIONS THIS WEEK

Monday, September 12th - The Most Holy Name of Mary

Our late Holy Father, Pope John Paul II restored this celebration to the liturgical calendar. Because of her special role in salvation history, Mary's name is a name of honor, a holy name; today we celebrate her role as Mother of the Church.

<u>Tuesday, September 13th – St. John Chrysostom</u> Elected Bishop of Constantinople in 397, John was an eloquent preacher, a deeply prayerful and kindly "shepherd of souls" who defended Catholic doctrine so persuasively that he was nicknamed "Golden-mouth".

<u>Wednesday, September 14th – Exaltation of the Holy Cross</u>
Today's feast has its origin in the dedication of a basilica erected by Constantine in 335 on the site of the crucifixion – Mt. Calvary. The basilica remains one of the most important Christian shrines in the world.

<u>Thursday, September 15th – Our lady of Sorrows</u>
Today we honor not only the personal sorrows of Mary, Mother of Jesus – but the sufferings she shares as Mother of the Church with all the poor, the persecuted, the oppressed of the world. May her faith and courage inspire us in our trials!

Friday, September 16th - Sts. Cornelius and Cyprian

Both these men lived in the 3rd century and were engaged in the struggles of the early Christian Church against internal heresies and external persecution. Both were martyred for the faith.

Saturday, September 17th - St. Robert Bellarmine

This brilliant Jesuit scholar, preacher, writer and theologian lived in the 17th century, and promoted the Christian education of youth. He is the patron of catechists and catechumens.



School Summer Project: It was just a little over two months ago when Sr. Maryalice spoke at all our Masses about the need to repair the ceiling of our school gym and to replace our school windows with new, energy-efficient windows. That was the start of the 2016 Summer Project Campaign – to raise \$100,000 to cover the cost of this work. Your response has been most generous – and, as this bulletin is being prepared, we are very close to the goal we set last June. The work on the gym ceiling

has been completed; the work on the windows will not begin until later in the fall. In the next few weeks we plan to conclude the fund-raising part of this project – but for now, we invite parishioners who have not as yet made a contribution (and who wish to do so) to take one of the envelopes marked "Summer Project" which can be found at the exits of the church (or in the rectory). Those envelopes contain letters explaining how you can make your contribution; also enclosed is a return card and envelope. We are hoping that many more parishioners will help during this final stage of our project because – no surprise!! – it turns out the work involved will cost a few thousand dollars more than originally estimated! We are very grateful to everyone who has helped make this Summer Project such a success.

Sunday Report: Last weekend 1,250 parishioners attended Mass; our collection totaled \$7,551.00; average contribution: \$6.04. Thank you for your continued financial support of St. John's and its many needs. Your generosity is essential and greatly appreciated.


