On Tuesday afternoon he will begin his trip to Florida where he will spend the winter assisting at St. Patrick's parish in Palm Beach Gardens and missing all of us at St. John's desperately! THIRTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Perhaps nowhere is the real depth of meaning contained in "ordinary time" expressed more powerfully than in today's Scriptures. The designation itself, "ordinary time," is easily misunderstood precisely because it is so, well, ordinary. We tend to forget that most of us live most of life neither on peaks of joy nor in valleys of despair, but on the broad plains of ordinary time.

In our first reading (Sir. 35:12-18) the author of Sirach assures us that ordinary lives are extraordinarily precious in the eyes of God. No matter what our situation, God wishes to enter into a personal relationship with us.

For our part, we respond through a life of prayer and worship. And while God "knows no favorites," there is something especially appealing about the prayers of the poor, the widowed, the oppressed. The psalmist goes on to say that the prayer of the just adds to the joy of the poor, a beautiful allusion to the intimate connection between true worship of God and work for justice and peace.

It must have been prayer that sustained St. Paul through the distress of his trial, which he shares with Timothy in an uncharacteristically poignant passage. In today's second reading (2 Tim. 4:6-18), Paul doesn't hide his feeling of sorrow at being abandoned by those he counted on, but refuses to harbor feelings of hatred or revenge. Instead, he relies on the God who has always stood by him.

Finally, in the gospel (Lk. 18:9-14) Jesus emphasizes that prayer by itself is not enough, our inner attitude must be reflected in the way we live and treat others. The Pharisee is not faulted because he fasts and prays and pays tithes. These are all good practices. Rather, he is criticized for reducing the whole of biblical religion to those external observances.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, October 24th - St. Anthony Mary Claret

Born in Spain in 1807, Anthony founded a society of missionary priests ("the Claretians"): he became a bishop in Cuba and was noted for his preaching and for championing spiritual and social reforms.

<u>Friday, October 28th – Sts. Simon and Jude</u>
These two saints are numbered among the chosen twelve – but they are apostles about whom we know very little. Simon is the "zealot" (not Simon Peter) who is said to have preached in Egypt; Jude (or Thaddeus) is known today as the saint of impossible cases.

<u>Election Preparation</u>: All Catholics should be active informed citizens who participate in our democratic process by voting for all local, state, and national officials. It is important to know a candidate's position on critical issues of our time – issues regarding our defense against terrorism, our economy, education and health care. Catholics should demand that candidates maintain high standards of personal character and ethics. In addition, Catholics have a particular obligation to be informed about positions of candidates (especially for state and national offices) on such matters as abortion, partial-birth abortion, cloning, care of the elderly and infirm, and stem cell research. In this Respect Life Month of October, Catholics should make sure that their voices are heard clearly in the political process. In their statement, "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship," the Bishops of the United States wrote: "As Catholics, we should be guided more by our moral convictions than by our attachment to a political party or interest group. When necessary, our participation should help transform the party to which we belong; we should not let the party transform us in such a way that we neglect or deny fundamental moral truths. We are called to bring together our principles and our political choices, our values and our votes, to help build a better world."
