

<u>Thanksgiving</u>: is one of our nation's most venerable and cherished traditions. It is a day to reflect on the goodness of God and the abundant blessings we have received –

especially in this great country of ours with its history of freedom and opportunity. As is our custom, we will have a special vigil Mass on Wednesday, November 23rd at 7:30 p.m. at which students from our Religious Education program will assist at Mass, our children's choir will sing, and Thanksgiving bread will be blessed and distributed. On Thanksgiving Day (Thursday, November 24th) we will have <u>only one</u> Mass at 9:00 a.m. On the Friday after Thanksgiving we will have <u>one</u> Mass at 8:00 a.m. There will be <u>no noon</u> Mass on Friday, November 25th. Both the rectory and school office will be closed on Friday. Happy Thanksgiving!



<u>CHRIST THE KING</u>: Today's entrance antiphon sets a tone that will be echoed in our gospel passage from St. Luke's passion account: Jesus is King because He submitted Himself to suffering, humiliation, and death on the cross.

The first reading (2 Sam. 5:1-3) describes the northern tribes at the moment they accept David as their king, their anointed one (messiah). What doesn't appear here is the long series of conflicts, rivalries, and setbacks that led to this moment. In its larger context, this scene emphasizes the mystery that God's plan can be served even in the midst of human failings.

Echoing the gospel, St. Paul in our second reading (Col. 1:12-20) connects Jesus' kingship with His cross: He is now the head of the body, the Church. When we unite ourselves to Jesus and His sufferings, we are enabled to share in His glory.

Finally in the gospel (Lk. 23:35-43) St. Luke puts a human face on Jesus at the moment of His deepest suffering. Although the authorities used the title "King of the Jews" mockingly, they unwittingly expressed the whole mystery of our redemption. The dialogue between Jesus and the repentant thief is comforting, because it assures us that conversion is possible till the end. All we have to do is accept Jesus, and He will gladly welcome us into His Kingdom.

<u>SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK</u>

Monday, November 21st – Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary

This feast commemorates the dedication of the church of St. Mary in Jerusalem near the site of the sacred Temple. This feast also recalls the day on which – according to ancient tradition – Mary was presented to the Lord by her parents in the Temple.

Tuesday, November 22nd – St. Cecilia

Ever since the third century, there has been a deep Christian devotion to this young woman – because of her courage in defending her virginity in the face of the paganism of her time and because of the martyrdom she suffered for love of Christ. She has always been associated with music and poetry and is the patroness of sacred music.

Wednesday, November 23rd – St. Clement and St. Columban

St. Clement was the third pope after Peter; he lived at the end of the first century and is remembered for his prayerfulness and devoted leadership. St. Columban was an Irish monk who lived in the 6th century and was instrumental in establishing monasteries both in Ireland and on the continent.

Thursday, November 24th – St. Andrew Dung-Lac

This day honors over 100 martyrs who worked with Fr. Andrew Dung-Lac to spread Christianity in Viet Nam in the 19th century and suffered persecution and death for their efforts.

Friday, November 25th – St. Catherine of Alexandria

This scholarly, learned woman lived in the 4th century; after her conversion to Christianity, she became an evangelizer in the area near Alexandria, Egypt. Under the persecution of the Roman emperor Maximian she was tortured by being placed on a spiked wheel and was eventually beheaded. She is the patroness of philosophers.

Advent: Next Sunday we begin the beautiful, prayerful season of Advent – the beginning of the Church's liturgical year and spiritual preparation for the coming of Christ

at Christmas. Among the deepest hungers we have as human beings is our hunger for meaning – our hunger for God. The sounds, images and prayers of Advent are a response to that hunger. As we begin our journey through this sacred season let us walk together, listening and learning. May Advent fulfill our deep desire to draw closer to God.

Once again we will provide a Advent Booklet: devotional booklet for our parishioners to use during the Advent and Christmas seasons. Entitled the "Little Blue Book", it is produced by the Archdiocese of Saginaw, Michigan, and provides a prayerful reflection (based on the Infancy Narrative in St. Luke's Gospel) for each day of these two seasons. It also includes other prayers, meditations and suggestions on how to make these special seasons of grace. These will be available at all our Masses next weekend.

Latin Chant: During Advent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Sanctus (#841); Agnus Dei (#845).



Second Collection: Next weekend we will take up our monthly special collection to support our school and maintain our school facilities. The school is not only used for our grammar school children, our CCD classes and our RCIA program, but for a variety of community and parish activities.
