

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS January 22, 2017

SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: As the gospel is proclaimed throughout the year, the message go and make disciples appears in a myriad of images and stories. Today's Opening Prayer addressed to our ever present Father summarizes it well in stating "your watchful care reaches from end to end and orders all things; help us to embrace your will and follow your call so that truth may live in our hearts." What teaching will the Gospel stories reveal to us about the truth that needs to be known? How will our baptismal commitment find a home in the world embraced by our parish?

The readings today "set the stage" to bring us from the Nativity into the week by week telling of the story of our salvation and our embrace of that story. The public phase of that Christian story of salvation is begun in the baptism of Jesus. John the Baptist exclaims in today's gospel (Jn. 1:29-34): "Look there! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" John's baptismal ritual is not just the beginning of the mission of Jesus. It was also the beginning of the mission of the Church – our mission to be Christ's witnesses and evangelists.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Tuesday, January 24th - St. Frances de Sales

Born in Southern France in 1567, Francis became a leader of reform and renewal in the Church of his time. Both as a priest and bishop, he preached eloquently, worked tirelessly for the poor and wrote some profound books on spirituality which are still in print today. The best known of his works is "Introduction to the Devout Life".

Wednesday, January 25^h - Conversion of Paul

This feast celebrates one of the greatest conversions of all time. Saul, a fierce persecutor of the Church became – almost overnight – just as fiercely devoted to Christianity and in a matter of a few years the greatest Christian evangelist in history. Let us pray today for all those who are preparing to enter the Catholic Church.

Thursday, January 26th - Sts. Timothy and Titus

These two men lived in the very first century of the Christian era; they were disciples and associates of St. Paul and they were appointed bishops of the Church in Ephesus and Crete. The letters written to them in the New Testament give us extraordinary witness to the life of the Church at the very beginning.

<u>Friday, January 27th – St. Angela Merici</u>
In the late 15th century, Angela founded a congregation of women (the Ursulines) dedicated to teaching children and caring for the poor – two of the tasks that have been an essential part of the Church's mission in every age.

Saturday, January 28th - St. Thomas Aquinas

Thomas was the son of noble Italian parents who intended for him to be a Benedictine monk. Thomas was attracted to the newly formed Order of Preachers (Dominicans) and eventually made his way into their ranks.

A great scholar and man of prayer, Thomas preferred a humble way of life. His legacy has prevailed as one of the greatest theologians in the Church. Known as the "Angelic Doctor," Thomas is the patron of schools and colleges.

Second Collection: This weekend we will take up our monthly special collection to support our school and maintain our school facilities. The school is not only used for our grammar school children, our CCD classes and our RCIA program, but for a variety of community and parish activities. It is vital that we keep our school facilities in excellent condition. We ask for a contribution of \$7.00 in this monthly collection and once again express our appreciation for your generosity.



Mass Requests for 2018: The Mass "book" for 2018 will be open for reservations as of Tuesday, February 28th. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses at St.

John's, we must request that Mass reservations be made in person. On February 28th those seeking to make Mass reservations should do so in the <u>lower church</u> (<u>not the rectory</u>) starting at 9:00 a.m. Someone will be there all morning and in the afternoon until 3:00 p.m. After February 28th, Mass requests for 2018 should be made in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. In addition, individual Mass reservations are limited to three on February 28th, so we may accommodate as many parishioners as possible. (After the initial day, more Mass reservations may be made at the rectory later in the week.) We remind everyone that there are a number of retired priests who are able to take Mass requests – even for 2017. We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's.



Holy Communion for **Homebound and Sick**: Special Ministers of Holy Communion are available to bring Holy Communion to the sick and the homebound after Mass weekdays, Saturdays and

Sundays. We contact those parishioners whom we know are in the hospital who wish to receive Holy Communion when they return home, along with parishioners who are homebound. Contact the rectory and Deacon Olivieri will arrange for Holy Communion to be brought home to those who desire it.
