**In-Pew Sunday:** Obviously, the normal Sunday liturgy should not be interrupted except in unusual circumstances. The Cardinal's annual Stewardship Appeal is such a circumstance – and the officials of the Archdiocese agree, because they have encouraged pastors in the Archdiocese to conduct an “In-Pew” appeal on a weekend in the early stages of the Appeal.

Every parishioner will be invited this weekend to complete one of the pledge envelopes that have been placed in the pews. Even if you have already made a pledge, we ask you to complete this “In-Pew” pledge form and check the appropriate box. Those who have been prayerfully considering a pledge are asked to make a decision today – in the presence of our parish family. No one is asked to write a check or to make a payment today, we will send reminders to everyone after the pledge envelopes are processed. We do urge everyone to make a pledge – not a one-time gift. A pledge is a promise to journey in faith into the future. Your pledge will help us to ensure that the critical pastoral, educational and charitable work of the Archdiocese will continue.

## **S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**February 26, 2017**

**EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME:** Today's liturgy speaks to us about the providential care of God, who loves us as a mother loves her child and who provides for us as a father looks after his family. Today's reading from the prophet Isaiah (Is. 49:14-15) is brief – only two verses! – but it delivers a powerful message: although we (like the Israelites of old) often question whether God has forsaken us, He reassures us with a beautiful comparison: just as no loving mother could forget her child, so God could never forget us – his chosen ones.

The Corinthians – to whom St. Paul writes in today's second reading (1Cor 4:1-5) seem to share some of the doubts of the ancient Israelites, but in time St. Paul insists, all doubts will be resolved – for Christ will reveal all in His own good time.

Finally, in the gospel (Mt. 6:24-34) we continue with another section of Our Lord's Sermon on the Mount. In this passage, Jesus seems to want to put to rest his disciples' worries and anxieties: consider, Jesus tells us, the birds of the air and the flowers of the field – God provides for them; how much more will He care for us? Our Heavenly Father, Jesus assures us, knows what we need. Instead of worrying about trifles, we must "seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness."

### **SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK**

#### **Friday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> – St. Katherine Drexel**

Born into a very wealthy Philadelphia family in 1858, Katherine grew up in a strongly religious household that believed that with great wealth comes greater responsibility. When she inherited a fortune after her parents' death, Katherine was determined to use her money to help America's poor – especially African American and Indians. She eventually devoted her life to that cause and established a religious order – The Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament which built missions, rural schools – and even a university: Xavier University in New Orleans, the first American university for African Americans.

#### **Saturday, March 4<sup>th</sup> – St. Casimir**

Born in Poland in 1458, Casimir was the son of the King of Poland, but Casimir eschewed the trappings of royalty and preferred to live simply, studying, praying and serving the poor. He died of consumption in 1484 before he reached his 24<sup>th</sup> birthday.



### **ASH WEDNESDAY**



**Ash Wednesday:** This Wednesday, March 1<sup>st</sup>, is the beginning of a solemn day that begins a 40 day period of penance during which we reflect in a special way on the mercy of Almighty God. It is a day of fast and abstinence. Ashes will be distributed after the Gospel at each of our Masses that day. On Ash Wednesday, we will have three Masses: 8:00 a.m., 12:00 noon and 7:30 p.m. In addition, there will be two prayer services at 9:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at which ashes will be both blessed and distributed.



### **LENT**



**Lent:** is a holy season in our Church's year, it is holy because it calls us in a special way to holiness and encourages us to adopt holy habits of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

**Prayer:** We should try to attend Mass as often as we can during Lent and pray the Rosary and make the Stations of the Cross (which is publicly celebrated every Friday in Lent during the Eucharistic Holy Hour that begins at 7:30 p.m.)

**Almsgiving:** We should try to make special sacrifices during Lent – and it is fortunate that the annual Cardinal's Appeal continues throughout Lent so that we have a very practical opportunity to assist the Church's works of charity in New York.


**Fasting:** We should try to practice some form of self-discipline during Lent – so that we might in some small way identify ourselves with Christ who was crucified for us.


**Friday Lenten Devotion:** Starting this Friday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> and on all the remaining Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Stations of the Cross and a reflection by Fr. Daniel Ulloa, O.P. The evening Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.


**Lenten Fast and Abstinence:** **ALL THE FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE DAY OF ABSTINENCE** -All Catholics above the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on the days of abstinence (unless poor health excuses). Additionally, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both fast and abstinence. Not only is meat prohibited, but on these two fast days, only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken together should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from 18 to 59 (unless poor health excuses).

**Lenten Reflections:** Once again we are providing a booklet of reflections to assist with a prayerful preparation for Easter. It is "The Little Black Book" published by the Diocese of Saginaw, Michigan and it offers a brief meditation for each day of Lent based on the Passion according to St. John.


**Sunday Report:** Last weekend 1235 parishioners attended Mass; our collection totaled \$10,025.00; average contribution: \$8.12. Thank you for your continued financial support of St. John's and its many needs. Your generosity is essential and greatly appreciated.

 **Registration Information** **S.J.B. School Registration:** Registration application, for September 2017 (Pre-K through 8<sup>th</sup>) may be picked up in the school office from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. Pre-K registrants must be 4 years old by December 1, 2017. The school office number is 914-965-2356.

 **Mass Requests for 2018:** The Mass "book" for 2018 will be open for reservations as of Tuesday, February 28<sup>th</sup>. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses at St. John's, we must request that Mass reservations be made in person. On February 28<sup>th</sup> those seeking to make Mass reservations should do so in the lower church (not the rectory) starting at 9:00 a.m. Someone will be there all morning and in the afternoon until 3:00 p.m. After February 28<sup>th</sup>, Mass requests for 2018 should be made in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. In addition, individual Mass reservations are **limited to three on February 28<sup>th</sup>**, so we may accommodate as many parishioners as possible. **(After the initial day, more Mass reservations may be made at the rectory later in the week.)** We remind everyone that there are a number of retired priests who are able to take Mass requests – even for 2017. We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's.

**Rosary Altar Society:** Next Sunday, March 5<sup>th</sup> we welcome the Rosary Altar Society to their monthly Mass at 11:00 am. Also, our March meeting will be held in the Church Hall on Monday the 6<sup>th</sup> at 8:00pm it will be a celebration for St. Joseph's and St. Patrick's. Come and enjoy some Irish and Italian specialties.


 **Time Change Alert:** Daylight Savings Time will begin in two weeks on Sunday, March 12<sup>th</sup>. Since clocks are to be turned AHEAD one hour at 2:00 a.m. that morning, better to do it before you go to bed on Saturday. Remember, "Spring ahead! Fall back!" which means – even though it isn't Spring yet, we will lose an hour of sleep!


 **St. John's H.S.A. Raffles:** The Home School Association will be selling their annual raffles tickets next weekend, (March 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>) after each Mass at the exits of the Church. The tickets are \$2.00 and the prize is \$2000.00. This raffle is a major fundraiser for the school. Please help our school if you are able.

 **Tax Advantage:** Once again this year, St. John's has been contacted by a representative of H&R Block regarding a program they have for tax-exempt institutions (like ours!). For every new client who goes to any H&R Block office and has them prepare your tax returns, H&R Block will contribute \$20.00 to St. John's. The only condition is that when you go to the H&R Block office, you take a coupon (which are available this week at the exits of the Church) indicating the special code which will be given to St. John's to distribute to our parishioners. N.B.: This costs you nothing! Obviously, H&R Block is doing this as a promotion to bring in new customers – but if you are considering having someone prepare your tax return (both Federal and N.Y. State) this year, please consider H&R Block. They have an office nearby – on 777 Central Avenue (in the strip mall near the Sunoco station on the corner of Mile Sq. Rd. and Central Ave.) But this offer is good at any H&R Block (you just need to bring the coupon available).

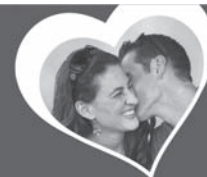
