

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS April 2, 2017

<u>FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT:</u> Lent is drawing rapidly to a close. As if to remind us of our ultimate goal, the purpose behind our prayer, fasting and acts of charity, all three readings today speak of resurrection and life beyond life.

Our first reading from the book of the prophet Ezekiel (Ez.37:12-14) comes from the conclusion of the prophet's dramatic vision of dry bones. After describing a field full of bleached, disconnected bones, Ezekiel eloquently pictures Yahweh blowing into them the breath of life, followed by the reemergence of human bodies. Then the punch line: these bones are the whole house of Israel. Utterly destroyed by the Babylonian Exile, Israel will now be restored by the spirit of Yahweh. And this promise rings down through the ages until it reaches us, the latest inheritors of the ancient covenant. When we are tempted to despair or indifference, the Lord will breathe new life into our dry bones and rekindle our hope.

Our second reading from St. Paul's letter to the Romans (Rm. 8:8-10) serves as a reminder that this new life of ours must look new. It must be a life devoted to righteousness, not sin. It must be a life dedicated to the works of justice and peace; of truth and mercy. Only then will we be worthy of the spirit within us. We are not the only ones who are aware of the looming road to Calvary. In today's gospel (Jn. 11:1-45) St. John presents us with the story of the raising of Lazarus, the final straw for those who had already had enough of Jesus, the Galilean upstart. Martha again is the active sister; she runs to meet Jesus while Mary stays in the house. Martha's simple observation that Lazarus would not have died if Jesus had come sooner elicits from Jesus first the revelation that He Himself is the resurrection and the life and then the restoration of her beloved brother. The sign is effective, many more put their faith in Jesus.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK – LENT – WEEK FIVE

<u>Tuesday, April 4th – St. Isidore</u>

Isidore was born in Seville, Spain in 560, came from a family of saints (his brother, sister and father were all named saints!) and was a brilliant student who became a wise and learned bishop who authored an encyclopedia of religion that was used as a textbook in Europe for nine centuries.

Wednesday, April 5th – St. Vincent Ferrer

Born in Spain in 1350, Vincent joined the Dominican Order ("Order of Preachers") and became an influential preacher and Theologian. He was a reformer and an eloquent advocate of Catholic orthodoxy. He died in France in 1419.

Friday, April 7th - St. John the Baptist de la Salle

Born in France in 1651, John was ordained a priest and dedicated himself to the education of poor boys. He eventually brought other men into this ministry and a congregation of teaching brothers was founded. He died in 1719.



<u>Palm Sunday Procession</u>: Next Sunday, April 9th at our 9:30 a.m. Mass, we once again welcome younger boys and girls to a special Mass where they will be excused after the Opening Prayer and go to the Church Hall for a special Liturgy of the Word. Before Mass begins, the children will be asked to go to the vestibule of the church where they will receive palm which they will carry in procession. After this Mass please join us for a Family Coffee and Craft Hour at which we will

have refreshments and make crafts for the family. We are very grateful to the parent-leaders (as well as some older children) who are assisting with this program.

Special Holy Week Confessions: In conjunction with the whole Archdiocese, St. John's will have a "Reconciliation Monday" on April 10th (the Monday of Holy Week). We will have confessions from 4:00 to 5:00 p.m. again from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m. This will be the last opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Penance before Easter.



Advanced Planning: Please note that there is a special schedule for Easter because there is <u>NO</u> 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday. The only Mass allowed on Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil Service at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, April 15th. Our Masses on Easter Sunday will be at 8:00 a.m.; 9:30 a.m. (children's Mass); 11:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Our traditional Easter egg hunt will take place after the 9:30 a.m. Mass in the lower Church (or, if the weather is nice, outside on the lawn). Please note: despite the time between Masses that our schedule affords, Easter has historically caused parking

problems – especially since parents with children will be staying longer after the 9:30 a.m. Mass. If the weather is nice and you don't live too far away, you might consider walking to Church on Easter Sunday!



Sunday Report: Last weekend 1,398 parishioners attended Mass; our collection totaled \$9130.00; average contribution: \$6.53. Thank you for your continued financial

support of St. John's and its many needs. Your generosity is essential and greatly appreciated.

<u>Friday Lenten Devotion</u>: On Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Stations of the Cross and a reflection by Fr. Daniel Ulloa, O.P. on the topic: "Our Call to Holiness." The evening Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.



<u>Lenten Fast and Abstinence</u>: <u>ALL THE</u>
<u>FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE DAY OF</u>
<u>ABSTINENCE -</u>All Catholics above the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on the

days of abstinence (unless poor health excuses). Additionally, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both fast and abstinence. Not only is meat prohibited, but on these two fast days, only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken together should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from 18 to 59 (unless poor health excuses).

Latin Chant: During Lent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Kyrie, Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Kyrie (#839); Sanctus (#841); Agnus Dei (#845).

Monthly Maintenance: Since this Sunday is the first Sunday of the month of April, we will take up our regular "First Sunday of the Month" second collection after Communion next week. This collection helps with the upkeep, maintenance, and cleaning of our beautiful church. Please be generous.

<u>Local Church Concert</u>: Annunciation-Our Lady of Fatima Parish proudly presents "The Seven Last Words of Christ" by Theodore Dubois. The concert will take place on Sunday, April 2nd at 2:30 p.m. at Annunciation Church, 470 Westchester Avenue, Tuckahoe. Samarie Alicea (soprano), Laurence Broderick (tenor) and John Dominick III (baritone) will be featured vocal soloists. Admission is free. All are welcome.

Mass Requests for 2018: The Mass "book" for 2018 is now open for reservations. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses

at St. John's, we must request that Mass reservations be made in person in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. We remind everyone that there are a number of retired priests who are able to take Mass requests – even for 2017. We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's.
