S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS April 30, 2017

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER: Today's readings show how deeply devoted to the Hebrew scriptures Jesus' earliest followers were. Still part of the Jewish tradition, they easily apply passages from the Psalms and Exodus to Jesus.

The passage from our reading from the Acts of the Apostles (2:22-28) is the first of six great sermons, all dealing with the heart of the Christ event: dying, you destroyed our death; rising you restored our life. St. Peter's use of Psalm 16 declares confidently that all who believe in God will be saved from destruction. We echo this as we repeat the words of Psalm 16. In our second reading (1 Pt. 1:17-21) St. Peter speaks to us again in a letter, likening our earthly pilgrimage to that of the early Israelites. Christ himself is the spotless lamb, chosen before the world's foundation and offered for all.

John Shea, in one of his prayer-poems, describes the Jesus in St. Luke's Emmaus gospel as "the arsonist of the heart." Luke, the master storyteller, depicts two downcast souls who pour out their sorrow and disappointment to a sympathetic stranger. Luke includes a detail which is often overlooked: they asked Jesus to stay when "he acted as if he were going farther." Had they not, they would never have been given the opportunity to recognize Him in the breaking of its bread. It was their willingness to listen and their hunger for hope that earned for them this joyous reward. Note that they immediately returned to their friends to share this wonder.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS -THIRD WEEK OF EASTER

Monday, May 1st – St. Joseph the Worker


St. Joseph was not only the protector of Mary, his wife, and Jesus, his foster son. He was also a man who had to work to provide for his family. By honoring the carpenter of Nazareth today, we affirm the dignity of work, we respect the rights of working people and encourage workers to persevere in their religious faith.

Tuesday, May 2nd – St. Athanasius

Here is true defender of the faith! Born in Alexandria, Egypt, in 295, Athanasius eventually became bishop of that city during one of the most challenging periods in the history of the early Church. The challenge was posed by an insidious heresy known as "Arianism" - which denied the true divinity of Jesus Christ. Athanasius was one of the Church's most eloquent and vigorous defenders of orthodoxy.

Wednesday, May 3rd – Sts. Philip and James

These two apostles remind us of the foundations on which our Church stands. Philip had been a disciple of St. John the Baptist before becoming Jesus' follower; James, a cousin of Jesus, took charge of the first Christian community in Jerusalem and wrote the epistle that bears his name.

Easter Traditions: The Alleluia: The very familiar Easter exclamation "Alleluia" has long history in the praise and celebration given to God by His faithful people. The word itself is a combination of two Hebrew words: the imperative form of the verb "Hillel" (meaning "to praise") and "Jah" (an abbreviated form of "Jahweh," the Hebrew name of God). So "Alleluia" is an ancient form of "praise God" that became quite a common part of the Jewish prayer life – figuring prominently in many of the Old Testament Psalms. In the New Testament, it appears only in the Book of Revelation to describe the heavenly praise given to the triumphant Lamb of God. In the history of the Church the term "Alleluia" became more and more a part of the Church's official prayer (The Divine Office) and her liturgical formulas – especially in the responses, acclamations and antiphons that were used in the most joyful seasons of the Church year. (The use of "Alleluia" is not permitted during Lent). Easter as the most joyous season in the liturgical

Easter Season: The fifty days from Easter to Pentecost are celebrated with joy as one extended feast day by the Church. One of the early Fathers of the Church, St. Athanasius, referred to the 50 day period as one "Great Sunday". These above all others are the days for singing "Alleluia". The first eight days of the Easter season make up the "octave" of Easter and are celebrated as solemnities of the Lord. At Mass during these days, we read the different New Testament accounts of the Lord's resurrection and the early preaching of the disciples who were witnesses to His resurrection.
