

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS May 28, 2017

SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER: The tone of our Easter liturgy has changed. We are now preparing for Pentecost, joining the disciples as they prayerfully await the coming of the Spirit.

In today's first reading (Acts 1:12-14) St. Luke recalls the events that followed Our Lord's Ascension. The disciples return to the upper room (where Jesus celebrated the Last Supper on Holy Thursday) to spend some time in prayer and meditation. The pace of contemporary life is so hectic, our days so full of activity, that it is perhaps hard for us to consider spending over a week in quiet reflection. The traditional custom of a yearly retreat however, can be a most effective way to recharge our spiritual batteries.

In today's second reading (1Pt. 1:13-16) St. Peter continues his message of encouragement to Christians who are experiencing difficulties or sorrow in their lives. Sharing Christ's suffering leads to sharing His glory. So long as we avoid being the cause of our own distress through sin or infidelity, we can feel the presence of the Spirit in all the events of our lives.

Today's gospel (Jn. 17:1-11) is taken from the great priestly prayer of Jesus, the words He shared with His friends just before He entered into His passion. Jesus is assured of future glory, because He has never failed to do the will of His Father. And yet, even now, when He can sense "the hour has come," His thoughts are on His disciples. Hard times lie ahead for them, too, and He prays that they will be able to continue His work of spreading the message. Those of us who are the most recent beneficiaries of that prayer can draw strength from the words of Jesus as we struggle daily to be faithful witnesses.

The Spirit will surely come. Filled with the Spirit, we will be able to go about the work of transforming the world.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS - SEVENTH WEEK OF EASTER

Wednesday, May 31st - The Visitation of Mary

Today, the Church remembers the visit the Virgin Mary paid to her cousin Elizabeth who was expecting a child – a boy who would grow up to be St. John the Baptist. The visit shows Mary's concern and compassion – but it also marked the occasion when Elizabeth, inspired by the Holy Spirit, recognized Mary as the Mother of the Savior. Mary, inspired in a similar way, prayed the beautiful words of the "Magnificat" on that occasion.

Thursday, June 1st – St. Justin

St. Justin, philosopher and martyr, was born of pagan parents in Syria at the beginning of the 2nd century. Following his conversion to the faith, he wrote many works in defense of religion. He also opened a school at Rome in which public debates were held. Justin was martyred along with several companions during the reign of Marcus Aurelius around the year 165.

Friday, June 2nd – Sts. Marcellinus and Peter

There were many Christian martyrs during the terrible persecution of the Church during the reign of Roman Emperor Diocletian at the end of the 3rd and the beginning of the 4th centuries. Both of these men, leaders in the Christian community in Rome, were beheaded in 303 A.D.

Saturday, June 3rd – St. Charles Lwanga and Companions

These martyrs of Uganda who died in a bloody persecution in the 1880's were young – mostly in their teens or early twenties. But they showed a maturity beyond their years in the willingness to suffer and die for their faith.





Easter Tradition: The Easter Bunny: There is no mention in the Bible of the long-eared, short-tailed creature (a "rabbit" or a "hare") which has become for many an important symbol of Easter. Rabbits, of course, are noted for their fertility and are therefore often used as symbols of new life —

which is, in a religious context, a critically important aspect of the Christian understanding of the Lord's Resurrection. Some believe the tradition of the Easter bunny can be traced to German immigrants to the United States in the 19th century who brought a custom in which rabbits protected Easter eggs from other animals, so the eggs could be shared at family meals on Easter Sunday. Children were encouraged to leave carrots for the rabbits in case they became hungry from all their hopping.

"Rice Bowl" Report: The practical Lenten penitential practice of almsgiving called "Rice Bowl" is an annual charitable effort which many of our parishioners participate in. This year the total amount we contributed to Catholic Relief Services as a result of our "Rice Bowl" effort was \$1,103.17!
