FIFTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today our Scripture readings focus on the power of God's word – and our need to be attentive to that word. Ancient Israel perceived God's word as an expression of His revealed will for mankind, intervening again and again like a "hammer shattering rocks" (Jer. 23-29). Once proclaimed, God's word proved to be a decisive force, guiding the course of Israel's history. In today's first reading (Is. 55:10-11) the prophet Isaiah celebrates the power and effectiveness of God's word. As surely as rain brings growth and fruitfulness to the earth, so God's word will realize the purpose for which it was spoken. St. Paul in our second reading (Rom. 8:13-23) calls on believers to accept the suffering which is part of any acceptance of God's word; present pain will be overwhelmed by joy and glory. Finally in today's gospel (Mt. 13:1-23) Our Blessed Lord tells the familiar parable of the sower which teaches the importance of being attentive and receptive to God's word. The lesson challenges us to examine whether in our own case the soil of a resistant heart prevents God's word from taking full root in our life.

# \*\* SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

<u>Tuesday, July 18<sup>th</sup> – St. Camillus de Lellis</u>
Born in Italy in 1550, Camillus entered military service, then had a change of heart – a religious conversion – and entered the seminary, was ordained and spent his life caring for the poor and the sick. He eventually founded a religious order that established hospitals throughout Italy.

# Thursday, July 20th - St. Appollinaris

This second century bishop and martyr was the first bishop of the city of Ravenna, Italy. Two churches in that city bear his name – and they contain some of the most beautiful mosaics in the world. We know little about his life, but anyone who could inspire such art and beauty must have been a powerful influence for good.

Friday, July 21<sup>st</sup> – St. Lawrence of Brindisi
St. Lawrence lived in the 16<sup>th</sup> century and was able to combine personal holiness, academic scholarship and pastoral leadership. He brought many Jewish converts into the Church because of his mastery of scripture and his personal example.

<u>Saturday, July 22<sup>nd</sup> – Mary Magdalene</u>
Mary was a faithful disciple and St. John in his gospel records that she was the first person to encounter the risen Jesus – and brought news of the resurrection to the apostles. As a result, she has often been called the "apostle to the apostles". Although she often is identified as the women taken in adultery (whom Jesus saved from stoning), most scripture scholars claim this is a mistake. She is revered for her devotion to Our Lord and her total commitment to His gospel.

Welcome to St. John's: Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and a commitment to the

life of the parish family. Being a registered parishioner makes things much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, and when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor. We are often asked to provide affidavits for baptismal and confirmation sponsors. We can only do this if a person is a registered, active, and contributing member in our parish. Registration forms are available at the exits of the church and in the rectory.

Festa Italiana: The Church of St. John the Evangelist and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel in White Plains (on the grounds of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel, 92 So. ### The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (popularly known as "RCIA") is

adults to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion. The goals are to give a complete overview of Catholic teaching and practice and to begin to deepen a Christian spiritual life centered in the Sunday Scripture readings. The sacraments are received at the Easter Vigil Mass.

### It is open to adults who:

- Have never been baptized; they would be preparing for all three sacraments.
- Were baptized in a non-Catholic Christian denomination who are interested in becoming Catholic; they would be preparing for Confirmation and First Communion.
- Were baptized Catholic but never received Confirmation and/or Communion; they would be preparing for the sacraments they have not yet received.

The 2017-2018 program at St. John's which prepares adults (and older adolescents) to receive sacraments will begin in October. However, if you (or anyone you know) is interested in learning more about our program, please leave your name at the rectory 963-1486.

Pastoral Care of the Sick: Anyone who is unable to come to Mass because of illness, age, or physical disability is asked to call the rectory if you wish to receive the sacraments of Penance, Holy Communion or Anointing at home. Also, we ask any parishioner to notify us if you are required to spend time in a hospital. We try to visit our parishioners if it is at all possible, but often we are not notified about a hospital stay until it is over.



**Second Collection**: Next weekend we will take up our monthly special collection to support our school and maintain our school facilities. The COLLECTION school is not only used for our grammar school

children, our CCD classes and our RCIA program, but for a variety of community and parish activities. It is vital that we keep our school facilities in excellent condition. We ask for a contribution of \$7.00 in this monthly collection and once again express our appreciation for your generosity.

**<u>Devotion and Decorum</u>**: We continue to ask everyone to make a special effort to arrive at church before Mass begins and to wait until the priest celebrant has reached the end of the main aisle (or for the final hymn is concluded) before exiting the church. In addition – to allow parishioners who wish to pray and reflect – we ask everyone to maintain a respectful silence in the main body of the church before and after Mass.
