

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS September 24, 2017

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today's readings, particularly Our Lord's parable in today's gospel (Mt. 20:1-6) are among the most challenging in biblical literature. Human expectations are turned upside down; natural concepts of fairness are shaken; society's standards of success are questioned. Our nation's much touted ideal of "the good life" is redefined. Anyone who has ever been tempted to dismiss the Bible as naïve and fanciful is faced with defeat today. These passages are so real, so down to earth, and so completely demanding, that they leave no room for naïveté or fancy. This is the life, the "ordinary time" of the committed Christian.

What do the prophet Isaiah, St. Paul and Our Lord say that is so difficult? Put simply, they tell us that we must let God be God. Much as we might wish it were so, God does not play by our rules. God's thoughts are as high above our thoughts "as the heavens are above the earth."

In today's first reading (Is. 55:6-9) Isaiah reminds Israel that redemption and forgiveness are at hand solely because of God's generosity. Nothing the Israelites might do, nothing we might do, "earns" God's forgiveness; it is a gift freely given. In our second reading (Phil. 1:20-27) St. Paul, writing from prison and facing the possibility of death, voices his conviction that both life and death are desirable since living means working for Christ and dying means union with Him.

Our Lord's parable of the workers in the vineyards can cause even the most devoted of us to cringe. We often sympathize with the grumbling all-day workers, not because the owner doesn't value their work, but because we think he "owes" them more than the others. For all of us, the parable presents the opportunity to search our hearts and discover whether we really love one another deeply enough to rejoice in God's universal generosity.

<u>SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK</u>

Tuesday, September 26th - St. Cosmos and Damian

These two brothers lived at the end of the 3^{rd} century. They both became physicians who worked with the Church in Syria to take care of the sick poor – whom they served without charge. They are patrons of doctors, surgeons, and pharmacists.

Wednesday, September 27th - St. Vincent de Paul

In 17th century France, Vincent established religious groups to care for the spiritual and physical needs of the poorest of the poor. It is a tribute to his life and mission that to this day organizations all over the world continue to serve the poor in his name.

Thursday, September 28th - St. Wenceslaus

A familiar Christmas carol reflects this saint who was King of Bohemia in the 10th century ("Good King Wenceslaus went out on the feast of Stephen"). He was known for his concern for the poor and his dedication to the Church.

Friday, September 29th – Michael, Gabriel and Raphael - Archangels

The Archangels are portrayed as ministering spirits who protect and watch over us, each in his own way. They also serve as intermediaries, carrying our hymns and prayers to the Lord. In the 13th century, St. Thomas Aquinas (called the "Angelic Doctor") wrote that each angel is its "own order in the universe,

far greater than a star".

Saturday, September 30th - St. Jerome

Born in Dalmatia in 340 A.D., Jerome studied in Rome where he was baptized. He returned to the East, became a monk and because of his reputation as a scholar, he was asked by the Pope to translate the Bible from Hebrew and Greek into Latin. His translation, known as the Vulgate, remained in use for over a thousand years. He lived a life of prayer and asceticism. He once wrote "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ". He died in Bethlehem in 420.

Often adult and young adult Catholics (for a variety of reasons) have never received confirmation.
