S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS October 15, 2017

TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: If today's readings tell us anything, they tell us that God cannot, ultimately, do everything. In a mysterious way, God chose to be limited by granting human beings freedom to make choices about their behavior.

In today's first reading (Is. 5:1-7) the prophet Isaiah's "song of the vineyard" is a magnificent example of the power of the prophetic imagination. In vivid poetic fashion, Isaiah draws his hearers in until we are totally engrossed in the story of his "friend" and the love and care lavished on this chosen piece of land. But then disappointment: when he looked for the crop, it yielded only sour grapes. And then the punch line: God is the vinedresser and Isaiah's hearers are the vineyard that fails to produce the longed-for-harvest. Saint Paul, too, is in a mood for chiding today. Despite his tireless journeying, his constant preaching, and his numerous letters, the communities he has visited often do not live up to his expectations. We can almost hear the longing in his voice as he begs the Philippians to "live according" to what they have been taught. Like Isaiah, Our Lord in today's gospel (Mt. 21:33-43) turns to the image of a vineyard in order to tell a vivid story of divine election, an election abused and neglected by the chosen people. While Jesus' story is more extended, less poetic, and more violent than Isaiah's story, the end result is the same. Those entrusted with the harvest, those on whom so much attention and care have been lavished, have proven themselves unworthy of the gift, unable to fulfill God's great expectation of them.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, October 16th - St. Margaret Mary

Margaret Mary Alacoque lived in the 17th century France and spent most of her life in a convent where she lived, worked and prayed as a Visitation nun. She is remembered as a mystic whose devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus was principally responsible for the spread of that devotion to the entire Church.

Tuesday, October 17th – St. Ignatius of Antioch

One of the greatest and earliest martyrs, Ignatius was bishop of Antioch when he was brought to Rome for execution and martyred there (by being thrown to wild animals) under the Emperor Trajan in the year 107. On his way to Rome he wrote seven letters (still extant) to different Churches on the Christian life and the need for faith and courage in the face of adversity.

Wednesday, October 18th - St. Luke

A physician and a companion of St. Paul, St. Luke wrote the third of our gospels and the Acts of the Apostles which details the structure and activity of the early church. His legacy includes an emphasis on God's love for the poor and the importance of prayer in a Christian's life.

Thursday, October 19th - St. Isaac Jogues and Companions

The "North American Martyrs" commemorated today bring the ancient Church's heroic witnesses of martyrdom to the shores of the New World. These 8 martyrs (Jesuit priests and lay missionaries) worked with the Huron and Iroquois nations in the early 17th century.

Friday, October 20th - St. Paul of the Cross

Born in Italy at the end of the 17th century, Paul and a group of associates dedicated themselves to caring for the poor and the sick. The group eventually was recognized as a religious order – known as the Passionists -whose primary work is retreats and parish missions.
