<u>S.J.B ANNOUNCEMENTS</u> November 12, 2017

THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: As the liturgical year draws to a close and nature prepares to surrender to the stark beauty of winter after the green of summer and the reds and golds of fall, the Church invites us to contemplate our own mortality. Much as our own society would have us ignore or even deny the fact, we will, all of us, die. The question is not whether we will die or even when we will die. The truer question is how we will meet this moment of transition, this Day of the Lord.

Today's first reading from the Book of Wisdom (Wis. 6:12-16) points the way, reminding us that the greatest goal in life is not riches but faith, the mysterious gift that opens us up to praise God. If we seek Wisdom, we shall not be disappointed, for she graciously appears to those who watch her. If, with the psalmist, we thirst for God, we can be reassured that Wisdom will satisfy our longing.

In our second reading (1 Thes. 4:13-18) and the gospel (Mt. 25:1-13) we are reminded to be prepared to meet the Lord. Christians in Paul's day believed that Jesus' Second Coming – the Parousia – was imminent, that the end was, quite literally, near. Using cosmic images appropriate to the time, Paul assures the Thessalonians that no one who believes in Jesus will "miss out" on the glory to come. Although we see the world differently today, we can still take comfort in Paul's confidence about the glorious destiny awaiting us.

Our Blessed Lord, too, offers an image of the end of the world. Since we do not know when Jesus will return, we must be ever vigilant. His message seems to be one of warning; we have to be prepared for a long wait. We must not allow the oil of our good deeds, our commitment, our faith, to run out.

SPECIAL LITURGICAL DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, November 13th - St. Frances Xavier Cabrini

Born in Lombardi, Italy in 1850, the woman who came to be known as Mother Cabrini was a powerful evangelist in her native country where she started an order of Missionary Sisters and established schools, hospitals and orphanages. Then in 1889 Pope Leo XIII asked her to go across the ocean and help the young church in America. Her zeal and capacity for hard work was equal to her love for Christ and His people. She founded more schools, more hospitals, more orphanages – working until her death in 1917. She became a citizen of the United States and was the first U.S. citizen to be canonized as a saint.

<u>Wednesday, November 15th – St. Albert the Great</u>
This great 13th century scholar and teacher was dedicated to exploring truth wherever it was to be found – in science, philosophy or theology. A gifted teacher, he promoted Aristotle as a thinker who could help Christians understand God's revelation. Albert was a member of the Dominican Order and taught St. Thomas Aquinas.

Thursday, November 16th – St. Margaret of Scotland

Born in Hungary in 1046, she married the King of Scotland and was mother of eight children. She was a queen whom her people loved and she devoted herself to the care of the poor and the sick. She is the patroness of Scotland.

Friday, November 17th – St. Elizabeth of Hungary
Born in 1207, this daughter of a king became the wife of another – but despite her royal connections, she devoted her life to prayer and work with the poor. She is the patroness of Catholic Charities.

Saturday, November 18th - Dedication of the Basilicas of Sts. Peter and Paul in Rome

The original churches dedicated to these two pillars of the early church were built in the 4th century; the great edifices which every pilgrim to Rome visits today were built in the 17th and 19th century respectively. This feast reminds us of the ongoing debt that Christians owe to

St. Peter and St. Paul.
