

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS March 4, 2018

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT: Today marks the midpoint of our Lenten journey. Wisely in today's first reading (Ex. 20:1-17) the Church directs our attention to the law given to Moses by God on Mt. Sinai – the 10 Commandments - the conditions of God's covenant with ancient Israel. These timeless ordinances give us something to measure ourselves against, goals to aspire to, ideals to live up to. What other gods do we

bow before and worship? Power? Money? Status? How do we treat others? How do we treat the earth? Are we grateful for what we have or are we always grasping for more?

Today's second reading (1Cor. 1:22-24) takes us to Corinth – a commercial city that was full of diversity – and vices – like all such cities. St Paul hears that the Christians of Corinth have begun to divide themselves. Some seem to think more of those who baptized them than the Christ into whose body they had become members. St. Paul insists that such attitudes are in conflict with the true message of the gospel: justification comes only through the cross of Jesus. St. John's gospel is filled with "signs." The gospel today (Jn. 2:13-25) describes one of these signs, the cleansing of the temple. Outraged at the commercial activity going on in the temple area, Jesus creates quite a scene. Because of signs like this, people began to believe in Jesus.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS - LENT WEEK THREE

Wednesday, March 7th - Saints Perpetua and Felicity


These two women who lived in the third century in North Africa were martyred for the faith during a Roman persecution. Their powerful witness is remembered whenever the First Eucharistic Prayer is used at Mass.

Thursday, March 8th – St. John of God

Born in Portugal in 1495, John pursued a military career as a young man, until he was moved by God's grace to devote himself to the care of the sick and infirm. He spent his last years in southern Spain where he found a hospital and a small nursing order (Order of Hospitallers) devoted to the sick poor. He died in Granada in 1550.

Friday, March 9th – St. Frances of Rome

Frances was born in Rome in 1384; she married and had three sons. She lived during a time of plague and devoted her later life to care of the sick and the dying. In 1425 she founded the Congregation of Oblates under the rule of St. Benedict. She died in 1440.



Friday Lenten Devotion: On all the Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Stations of the Cross and a reflection by Fr. Daniel Ulloa, O.P. on the topic: "Lent: Deepening our Communion with God and with One Another." The evening Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence: ALL THE FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE DAY OF ABSTINENCE - All Catholics above the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on the days of abstinence (unless poor health excuses). Additionally, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both fast and abstinence. Not only is meat prohibited, but on these two fast days, only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken together should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from 18 to 59 (unless poor health excuses).

Latin Chant: During Lent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Kyrie, Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Kyrie (#853); Sanctus (#846); Agnus Dei (#850).

<u>Sunday Report</u>: Last weekend 1,295 parishioners attended Mass; our collection totaled \$8251.00; average contribution: \$6.93. Thank you; and God bless you for your generosity to St. John's.



Advanced Planning: Please note that there is a special schedule for Easter because there is NO 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday. The only Mass allowed on Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil Service at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 24th. Our Masses on Easter Sunday

will be at 8:00 a.m.; 9:30 a.m. (children's Mass); 11:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Our traditional Easter egg hunt will take place after the 9:30 a.m. Mass in the lower Church (or, if the weather is nice, outside on the lawn). Please note: despite the time between Masses that our schedule affords, Easter has historically caused parking problems – especially since parents with children will be staying longer after the 9:30 a.m. Mass. If the weather is nice and you don't live too far away, you might consider walking to Church on Easter Sunday!

S.J.B. Senior News: During the Season of Lent, at the Senior Leisure Club meeting at 12:45 in the lower Church, Deacon Olivieri will present selected tapes from Archbishop Fulton Sheen's "Christ: His Passion & Death." The schedule is as follows: Wednesday, February 28th – "Death March to Jerusalem" (14 minutes); First Friday, March 7th – "Palm Sunday" (16 minutes); Wednesday, March 14th – "The Last Supper" (17 minutes); Wednesday, March 21st – "The Crucifixion" (20 minutes). All parishioners are welcome.



Mass Requests for 2019: The Mass "book" for 2019 will be open for reservations as of Tuesday, March 6th. Because of the number of Parishioners who wish to arrange Masses at St. John's, we must request that Mass

reservations be made in person. On March 6th those seeking to make Mass reservations should do so in the <u>lower church</u> (<u>not the rectory</u>) starting at 9:00 a.m. Someone will be there all morning and in the afternoon until 3:00 p.m. After March 6th, Mass requests for 2019 should be made in the rectory, Monday-Friday from 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. Our office staff is simply unable to handle requests by phone if they are to complete the regular volume of work they have. In addition, individual Mass reservations are <u>limited to three on March 6th</u> so we may accommodate as many parishioners as possible. (<u>After the initial day, more Mass reservations may be made at the rectory later in the week.</u>) We remind everyone that there are a number of retired priests who are able to take Mass requests – even for 2018. We are happy to provide Mass cards for these Masses; however, they will not be celebrated here at St. John's.
