

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS March 11, 2018

FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT: How many times have we seen at televised sports events someone holding a huge sign reading "John 3:16"? Today's gospel includes John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him may not perish but have eternal life."

God has always loved the world and has always brought life from death. Today's first reading (2 Chr. 36:14-23) explains how God brought the Jewish people back from Babylonian exile to a new beginning in Jerusalem. Saint Paul tells us in the second reading (Eph. 2:4-10) that when we were "dead through our trespasses," God "made us alive together with Christ." In the gospel, Jesus says that in Him, "the light has come into the world," and we can go from the darkness of sin and failure into His light.

When we are far away from where we should be, it is God who brings us back in Christ. When death seems to be in control, it is God who gives life in Christ. When we are overwhelmed by the darkness of failure, it is God who brings us the light of hope in Christ. "For God so loved the world..."

SPECIAL SAINT'S DAY - LENT WEEK FOUR

Saturday, March 17th – St. Patrick

This is a very special feast in the Archdiocese of New York – marked by a solemn Mass in the Cathedral of St. Patrick. St. Patrick was born in the late 4th century and died in 461. As a teenager he was captured by Irish raiders and sold as a slave in Ireland where he worked in terrible conditions for over six years. He escaped to France, studied to be a priest and returned to Ireland twenty years later to begin his extraordinary work of evangelization. He is honored as Patron Saint of Ireland, Nigeria and the Archdiocese of New York.

Advanced Planning: Please note that there is a special schedule for Easter because there is NO 5:00 p.m. Mass on Holy Saturday. The only Mass allowed on Holy Saturday is the Easter Vigil Service at 7:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 31st. Our Masses on Easter Sunday will be at 8:00 a.m.; 9:30 a.m. (children's Mass); 11:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. Our traditional Easter egg hunt will take place after the 9:30 a.m. Mass in the lower Church (or, if the weather is nice, outside on the lawn). Please note: despite the time between Masses that our schedule affords, Easter has historically caused parking problems – especially since parents with children will be staying longer after the 9:30 a.m. Mass. If the weather is nice and you don't live too far away, you might consider walking to Church on Easter Sunday!

Friday Lenten Devotion: On all the Fridays of Lent at 7:30 p.m. there will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by Stations of the Cross and a reflection by Fr. Daniel Ulloa, O.P. on the topic: "Lent: Deepening our Communion with God and with One Another." The evening Holy Hour will conclude with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

Lenten Fast and Abstinence: ALL THE FRIDAYS OF LENT ARE DAY OF ABSTINENCE - All Catholics above the age of 14 are obliged to abstain from meat on the days of abstinence (unless poor health excuses). Additionally, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are both fast and abstinence. Not only is meat prohibited, but on these two fast days, only one full meal is permitted. Two smaller meals may be taken to maintain strength, but these taken together should not equal another full meal. Fasting obliges from 18 to 59 (unless poor health excuses).

Latin Chant: During Lent at our sung Sunday Masses, we will use traditional Gregorian Chant whenever the Kyrie, Sanctus and Agnus Dei are sung. The chant melodies are very easy to sing and the words of these responses are so familiar in English that the Latin shouldn't pose a problem, even for someone who has never studied Latin. Moreover, it gives us an opportunity (however small) to recapture the long tradition of singing Gregorian Chant. The text of and music for these acclamations can be found in the Music Issue: Kyrie (#853); Sanctus (#846); Agnus Dei (#850).

LETTER FROM ROME III: As I begin, I would like to make one thing perfectly clear: the reports that I was seen throwing snowballs in the piazza of St. Peter's Basilica after Rome's recent snowfall are greatly exaggerated! I must admit that it was a little strange to hear about 70 degree weather in Yonkers shortly before we here in 'sunny Italy' were coping with snow and ice. Serves me right for leaving SJB during the winter. Well--that time away is growing ever shorter; our study sabbatical program is more than half completed! Our classroom sessions continue--most recently devoted to a study of St. Paul's Letter to the Romans and a very interesting review of the work of three 20th century Catholic authors: Dorothy Day; Mother (now Saint) Teresa of Calcutta; and Sister Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (known to the philosophical world by her name before she became a nun, Edith Stein).

Our experiences in Rome (especially its museums and churches) continue--but there is another aspect to our sabbatical which is also important--and which I haven't mentioned in my previous letters.

That aspect is the opportunity to visit some of the other important cities where significant contributions to the Church and Western Culture have been made. I have been able to visit two of those cities so far: Milan and Siena. In Milan I spent one morning in the beautiful church of Santa Maria della Grazia (which is cared for by members of the Dominican Order--the very same religious order to which Fr. Ulloa and Fr. Cameron belong). It is there--in the former refectory of the monastery (where the friars took their meals)--that Leonardo da Vinci's masterpiece, The Last Supper, is preserved. Being in the presence of such a work of genius is an experience to be treasured for a lifetime.

Later in the afternoon, I spent some time in Milan's "Duomo" (Cathedral)--a marvel of Gothic architecture--where the great 16th century theologian, St. Charles Borromeo was bishop. Since the latter part of the 20th century, they have been doing extensive archeological work in the area beneath and adjacent to the Cathedral--and some of that has been opened up to the public. What a privilege it is to explore the remains of a 4th century church where St. Ambrose celebrated Mass and preached. They have even identified the ancient baptistry where St. Ambrose baptized St. Augustine--who went on to become a bishop in his own right and who is one of the greatest teachers and theologians in the history of the Church.

Siena--like Florence--is one of the principal cities in a beautiful area of Italy (especially in summer): Tuscany! Some argue that this area (which includes a section called 'Chianti') produces the best wines in all of Italy. This is one argument that I prefer not to take part in. What no one argues about is the importance of Siena and Florence in the creation of some of the finest art and architecture in the Western world.

In a couple of weeks our program will take us to Assisi for a five day retreat--and on the way we will pass through Orvieto where we will celebrate Mass in another of Italy's magnificent cathedrals. During the retreat I will be praying that St. Francis will look kindly on everyone at St. John the Baptist.

Sunday Report: Last weekend 1,327 parishioners attended Mass; our collection totaled \$8843.00; average contribution: \$6.66. Thank you; and God bless you for your generosity to St. John's.
