

Summer Mass Schedule: As we do every summer at St. John's, our daily Mass schedule (Monday – Friday) will be changed slightly. Instead of having Mass at 8:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon, our one daily Mass will be at 8:30 a.m. – starting Monday, July 5th. This extends until Tuesday after Labor Day (September 7th).

Independence Day: Although July 4th falls on a Sunday this year, next weekend will be a long weekend of celebration (because the federal holiday will be celebrated on Monday, July 5th). This is an occasion for legitimate pride in our country and its achievements. It is a time of reflection – on the need to continue to work together to achieve justice and equality, on the need to defend the freedoms which are so precious to us. We should also set aside some time on this Independence Day to give thanks for the religious freedom we enjoy in this country. Let us pray that God will continue to bless this great land of ours.

July 4th Holiday Schedule: Since July 4th falls on a Sunday this year, the official federal holiday marking Independence Day will be on Monday, July 5th; our rectory and school offices will be closed that day. We will have only <u>one</u> Mass on July 5th at 8:30 a.m., and the church and the chapel will be closed after that Mass.

A Call to Service: Our Religious Education Program at St. John's is growing! Our Director of Religious Ed., Mrs. Angela Minchilli is looking for volunteers who would be willing to assist us in preparing our children as they grow in faith. You may be able to assist in several ways: first as catechists - the men and women who teach in one of our eight grades (Mrs. Minchilli will assist anyone who may need help in preparing for this); second as catechetical assistants who are there to help as teacher "aides"; third as volunteers who welcome students and parents, direct visitors to classrooms, and generally act as "trouble-shooters." S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS June 27, 2021

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: The curse of death and God's power to overcome it fill this Sunday's readings. Our first reading (from the Old Testament's Book of Wisdom) shows that God made creation for good. It is sin and those who give in to the temptation to do evil that have brought death into the world.

In today's Gospel (Mark 5:21-43), Jesus cares enough for the life of a little girl and the wholeness of a long-suffering woman that He incurs ritual impurity to restore them. Listen to Jesus' tender concern for the little girl's basic needs, to give her something to eat. We too, do God's work when we feed the hungry and clothe the naked, just as when we gather for weekly worship.

In our second reading (2Cor. 8:7-15), St. Paul reminds us that taking care of the material needs of those in want is an integral part of our Christian commitment. When we have, we share; when we are in need, we receive. Some parishes seem to overemphasize their financial concerns, almost to the exclusion of the Gospel, but we must see material support of those in need as essential to our Christianity.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, June 28^{th} – St. Irenaeus

St. Irenaeus was born around 130 A.D. and became a leader of the 2^{nd} century Church – a Church composed of third generation Christians. He lived at a critically important time and helped keep the Church preserved from the many heresies and alien philosophies that had begun to grow. He emphasized apostolic authority, a clear and orthodox creed and fidelity to scripture and Church teaching – all still critically important in the Church's life.

<u>Tuesday, June 29th – Sts. Peter and Paul</u>
Sts. Peter and Paul are joined in today's celebration of the two great leaders of the first century Church. Peter symbolizes the tradition of the Church and the need for orthodoxy and fidelity; Paul symbolizes the missionary thrust of the Church and the need to be open to changing cultural and social conditions as the Church proclaims its gospel to all peoples in all times and places.

Wednesday, June 30th – First Roman Martyrs

Sts. Peter and Paul (celebrated yesterday) were only the best known of the Christians who perished during the Emperor Nero's brutal attempt to suppress the Church in the second half of the first century Rome. Though we do not remember their names, we honor them for their faith, their courageous witness, and the inspiring example they provide.

Thursday, July 1st - St. Junipero Serra

This day we celebrate the memorial of St. Junipero Serra, the Spanish Franciscan who worked so tirelessly in Mexico and California in the late 18th century. Pope John Paul II called him "an exemplary model of the selfless evangelizer".

- 1. The **Weekly Collection** remains absolutely essential to our parish operations. Second Collection: In order to limit the interaction between ushers and parishioners at Mass, we will <u>eliminate</u> second collections until further notice. The ushers will pass the baskets <u>only once</u> – at the usual time. If a second collection has been scheduled, we ask envelope users to place both envelopes for that Sunday in the collection basket – and we ask everyone to be as generous as their means permit.

<u>Sacrament of Penance</u>: Because of continuing Covid-19 restrictions we are still unable to use our confessionals for this sacrament. If you wish to receive the sacrament, please call the rectory to make an appointment. In addition on one Saturday of each month we will have a Penance Service at 4:00 p.m. in the church at which we will provide the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **Our next service will be on Saturday, July 31**st.

<u>Covid-19 Update</u>: At all the Masses several weeks ago Msgr. Maloney announced new Covid-19 "protocols" for attendance at Masses at St. John's based on new guidelines from the Archdiocese of New York:

A. FIRST: WHAT WILL NOT CHANGE:

- i) We will continue—at least for the time being—to leave the pew separations that we have had in place for the last several months; we will review that as we see how things develop;
- ii) We will continue to have a weekly deep cleaning of the church; and we will sanitize the church after every Mass; we will also maintain our current Mass schedule which allows for such sanitizing;
- iii) We will ask our ushers to wear masks when they take up the collection—even if they are fully vaccinated;
- iv) Our priests, deacons & Eucharistic Ministers—all of whom are fully vaccinated—will continue to wear masks during distribution of communion; they will also sanitize their hands before and after distribution; Holy Communion will continue to be distributed only in the hand & we will still omit the "exchange of peace";

B. SECOND WHAT WILL CHANGE:

- i) Fully vaccinated persons will <u>not have to wear masks</u> when they attend Mass—though they are free to continue doing so if they so choose;
- ii) Those who are <u>not fully</u> vaccinated must wear a mask in church and must keep socially distant from anyone not an immediate family member;

WE ARE NOT GOING TO CREATE A SEPARATE SECTION IN CHURCH WHERE THE NOT YET FULLY VACCINATED MUST SIT; NOR ARE WE GOING TO DEMAND PROOF OF THE FULLY VACCINATED PERSON'S STATUS. IF WE CANNOT HAVE AN HONOR SYSTEM IN CHURCH THEN WE HAVE FAR MORE SERIOUS PROBLEMS THAN COVID-19.
