

S.J.B. ANNOUNCEMENTS September 19, 2021

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today's readings from Sacred Scripture give us the opportunity to reexamine our attitudes about Church governance and to reflect prayerfully about the essential nature of our Church in this new millennium. Vatican II and its challenge of personal and ecclesial reform has been in place for more than a halfcentury, yet its challenges remain, in many cases, poorly understood and only partially implemented.

Written roughly a century before Christ's birth, the Old Testament's Book of Wisdom from which today's first reading (Wis. 2:12-20) is taken reflects the division in the Egyptian city of Alexandria between those Jews who were strict adherents of the law and tradition and those who felt compromise was possible between Jewish faith and Greek culture. In today's second reading (Jas. 3:16-4:3) St. James speaks of conflict within the Christian community, a conflict that has its roots in false wisdom. Earlier in the third chapter, St. James insists that true wisdom manifests itself in humble service. False wisdom, however, leads to arrogance and jealousy.

In today's gospel (Mk. 9:30-37) St. Mark assures us that even those closest to Jesus fell into the trap of envy and competition. Knowing that they had been arguing about which one of them was the most important, Jesus offers one criterion of greatness, namely, the willingness to serve others. Using a child as a model emphasizes His point, since children had little or no status in the society of Jesus' day.

SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, September 20th - St. Andrew Kim and Companions

In the middle of the 19th century, Andrew, born in Seoul Korea, a convert and the first native Korean priest, and over a hundred other men and women evangelized the people of Korea and were martyred for their heroic witness.

Tuesday, September 21st – St. Matthew

This Jewish man – a despised tax collector who worked for the occupying Romans, was called by Jesus to be one of the first apostles. He is the one credited with the gospel that appears first in the New Testament; his gospel indicates the way Jesus fulfilled the promises God made to the Jewish people as recorded in the Old Testament.

Wednesday, September 22nd – St. Padre Pio

This Capuchin priest born in Italy in 1887 spent fifty years of his life in a monastery far from the capitols of the world, where he worked, prayed, was a spiritual mentor to thousands and inspired millions by the courage with which he bore the "stigmata" – the sign of the Lord's wounds – in his own body.

Practical Matters:

- 1. The **Weekly Collection** remains absolutely essential to our parish operations. Parishioners may contribute via WeShare (go to sjbyonkers.org –look for "online Donations" on the title page) or by bringing or mailing your contribution to our rectory office or dropping it into one of the baskets in church on Sunday.
- 2. Throughout the summer we will continue to have <u>only</u> <u>one</u> collection; if you have two (2) envelopes on any given Sunday, please put both in the one collection.
- 3. Our parish office is open Monday Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- 4. Please consult our parish website (www.sjbyonkers.org) for updates on parish events and activities.
- 5. Upon recommendation of the Archdiocese we will continue not filling holy water fonts; we will maintain the weekly sanitizing of the church (and sanitizing between Masses); there will be no "exchange of peace" and communion will be in the hand.
- 6. We continue to expect those who are not yet <u>vaccinated</u> to wear masks at all Masses and services.

<u>Sacrament of Penance</u>: Because of continuing Covid-19 restrictions we are still unable to use our confessionals for this sacrament. If you wish to receive the sacrament, please call the rectory to make an appointment. In addition on one Saturday of each month we will have a Penance Service at 4:00 p.m. in the church at which we will provide the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **Our next service will be on Saturday, October 2**nd.

Being and Becoming Catholic: Very shortly we will begin a series of meetings that will prepare teenagers and adults to receive the sacrament of baptism, communion, and/or confirmation. Often adult and young adult Catholics (for a variety of reasons) have never received confirmation. In other cases, persons from another (non-Catholic) Christian tradition wish to become Catholics; such persons are prepared for reception into the Church by this program. Finally, there are individuals who were never baptized who may wish to become Catholics – this group is meant for them as well. If you know any such an individual, please have him or her contact the rectory at 963-1486.

Religion Education Program Mass: Our Religious Education Program begins this Sunday, at the 10:30 a.m. Mass. This is "Catechetical Sunday" – the day when all the teachers and associates in our Religious Education Program are formally commissioned for their important work on handing on the faith to the younger generation. All the catechists will be present and we expect our students to be there as well. We ask the parents to make every effort to attend this Mass with your children and support the teachers in our Religious Education Program. N.B.
