Attention All Cooks FROZEN CASSEROLE SALE

The Ladies Association will hold their annual Frozen Casserole Sale on Saturday, November 21, 2020. This sale is the Ladies largest fund raiser and always the Saturday before Thanksgiving. The sale features side dishes, such as sweet potatoes, dressing, broccoli rice and cheese, corn and hash brown casseroles as well as cornbread dressing for your holiday meal as well as many other delicious casseroles to help make the busy holiday season easier. The community, as well as our own church members looks forward to this sale. We believe with just a few changes we can go forward with this fundraiser this year.

We are asking each family to donate at least one frozen casserole dish and if at all possible more this year. It can be anything you like. We have had chicken pot pies, chicken broccoli, rotel chicken, lasagna, Mexican dishes, squash, green beans, beef enchiladas, pork chop, stuffed bell peppers and quiche. We also love to have frozen desserts. We need soups, such as gumbo, vegetable beef, chicken noodle, taco and cowboy soup. It can be anything you want to prepare.

The best thing about this fund raiser is that it doesn't require anything away from your home. The next time you are preparing your family's favorite casserole, simply make a double recipe and freeze the extra for the sale. If you use the pans with the tall plastic lids, we ask you to cover the casserole with heavy foil and discard the tall plastic one. The tall lids take up too much freezer space.

Before you freeze the casserole, we ask that you place a label on the top with the name of your casserole, main ingredients, cooking instructions, number of servings, your name and phone number. It is important to put labels on before freezing, because the labels will not stick to a frozen product. Been there done that – it is true!!!

For anyone who is new to our Parish Family, we want to encourage you to take part in this "fund raiser". We have a very "faithful following" in our community and don't have to depend on the parish to buy our casseroles. Of course, we welcome all of you to buy if you wish. This year we are doing preorders. Be sure and pick up your pre-order form in the Narthex and return it with your payment before October 18.

We also try and keep to the following sizes, for making the most of freezer space, 7" round, 9" round, 8×8 , and 8×11 . Having like sizes also helps us in pricing.

We appreciate the support we have had in the past years and look forward to your support again this year. The proceeds for this sale go to the Ladies Association. 
