JOHN THE BAPTIST

John the Baptist was an itinerant preacher and a major religious figure. He is mentioned in all four Gospels. He is also mentioned in the Qur'an. He is described in the Gospel of Luke as a relative of Jesus. John led a movement of Baptism at the River Jordan. John is regarded as a prophet in Christianity and Islam. John anticipated the coming of a Messiah who would be greater than himself. In the New Testament, Jesus is the one whose coming John foretold.

BARUCH

The Book of Baruch is called the deuterocanonical book of the Bible.

Although it is not in the Hebrew Bible, it is found in the Septuagint and the Vulgate Bible. It is grouped with the prophetic books that also include Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel, and the twelve Minor Prophets.

Central themes of the book of Baruch:

Israel's disobedience to God. God exiles the Jews to Babylon because of their behavior. The just action of God. The need to repent, honor, and obey God's Word. I pray for God's mercy.



Second Sunday of Advent *light your first and second purple candle

All: In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

Reader: The **second Sunday candle** symbolizes **"faith".** It is also called the "Bethlehem Candle". The Prophet Isaiah says that the Messiah will be born in Bethlehem, coinciding with the birthplace of King David. This week invites us to have unwavering faith in God becoming man.

Be sure to use the table tent Advent prayer card provided, as well as, the Bible passage Is. 26: 2-4 for reflection.

To note: Advent, also called "little Lent," is the season where we spiritually wait in our "darkness" with hopeful expectation for our promised redemption. Just as the whole world awaited Christ's birth, we now eagerly await his promised return.
