How to use

1.-Introduction:

As Advent begins, we also begin a new Church year. This year we invite you and your families to think of these four weeks of Advent as a journey of gratitude. When we are grateful, our hearts are filled with joy which cannot be contained. It is also shared with others. Each guide helps your family focus in a particular way on how you can be grateful in your lives. Every week we will invite you to think of key figures in the Christmas story who have been on a journey: the shepherds, the magi, migrants today, and finally the Holy Family with their journey to Bethlehem. We pray they will inspire your family to receive the baby Jesus with gratitude and commit to share the joy of Advent with those in need.



Prepare your sacred space: Look for ideas on how to make an Advent wreath. Set up your family's Advent wreath in the sacred space and gather as a family around the wreath each week to reflect on the specific theme of the week



3.-Sharing the Good News:

Read the recommended reading for each Sunday of Advent. Look for the link to the reading in the guide for each Sunday. It will be good to use the family Bible.

2.-Opening Prayer:



Each week, take some time to pray around the Advent wreath. Make sure that each member of the family is present as you prayerfully reflect on the theme of the week.

Opening Prayer: In the opening prayer we turn to Jesus, preparing, and looking forward to his birth this Christmas. Feel free to include personal petitions, for a family member, relative or friend, or events that are happening locally or around the world.

4.-Reflect Together:

- Here we suggest some questions to encourage reflection and discussion in the family. Use your own words if you need to, so that the younger members of your family especially understand.
- Try to involve the whole family in the discussion and reflection. Listen attentively and respectfully. Try not to interrupt. Thank each person for showing up, for praying, for participating.

5.-Take action as a family:

- The goal in this section is to make the connection between faith and daily life. In it we
 propose some ideas for actions you can take as a family. However, feel free to:
 - o Come up with your own ideas as a family
 - Participate in what your parish is doing as a faith community
 - Organize something with your neighbors



6.- Closing Prayer:

In the final prayer we turn with gratitude to God the Father and ask for his Holy Spirit to help us understand the mystery of the coming of his Son, Jesus. Here too it is appropriate to add your personal intentions as well as intentions for your community, parish, neighborhood, and the world.


