

LORD, TEACH ME TO PRAY Develop a deep, personal relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ through Ignatian prayer!



Imagine their joy after searching and traveling for perhaps months or even years to finally discover the baby Jesus. They were overjoyed because they knew that in Jesus they had discovered the real happiness and meaning in this life. Where are we looking for joy?

2.-Opening Prayer: 👳 🔊

Dear Jesus

Our life is a search for you. Sometimes we get lost and discouraged because we make bad choices and take the wrong path. Help us to always come back to you, to follow your light. Like the Magi help us to find good friends to make the journey with us. Amen.

4.-Reflect Together:

• Share a time when you discovered something after looking for it for a long time? It could be a thing or a place or an idea or a solution.

- How did you feel afterwards?
- If you were to go on a long journey like the Magi and could take two people with you (who you didn't live with).
 - Who would you take?
 - o How come?
- Challenge each member of your family to look for (discover) God each day. At the end of the day, perhaps during supper, ask, "Where did you find God today?" If someone didn't find God that day, it's okay. Remember that the Magi searched a long, long time before they found Jesus.
- Use the Epiphany Door Blessing to bless the door of your home.
- Take an Epiphany Family Photo where family members dress up as royalty. Use things you find around the home to make crowns, royal cloaks etc. Post your family photo on social media as an Epiphany greeting
- The Magi came from different corners of the world. Invite someone from another culture/country to an Epiphany celebration at your home.



6.- Closing Prayer:

Gather around your sacred space and share what you are most grateful for this Advent. Then pray together:

Loving God who sent Jesus to be born among us,

Help us always to be grateful for the greatest of all gifts in our lives- Jesus your son. Send your Spirit that we may always make room for Jesus in our lives. Teach us to remember that the best gift we can give others is to love them like Jesus loves us.
