FR. GUY'S REFLECTION



Dear Friends,

Happy Ascension Thursday...Or Ascension Sunday. In some dioceses this feast is celebrated on the traditional 40 days after Easter (Thursday) but in most

dioceses, it has been transferred to Sunday. You might ask "how can we move Jesus around like that?" Well... Fewer and fewer people attend holy days of obligation on weekdays when work and other obligations take precedence so it makes sense that it is transferred to the weekend closest to the feast. The Feast of the Ascension may suffer because it competes with First Communion and Confirmation, college commencements, high school graduation, Mother's Day, and sometimes even Memorial Day.

When it is observed isn't really the issue. What does the Ascension mean? Why is it important? Does it make any difference in our lives? These are the concerns that matter.

The meaning of Ascension is not that Jesus is leaving us, but he is with us for all time. This is one of the paradoxes of our faith like Jesus Christ, fully God and fully man. Bread and wine become the body and blood of Christ, but we perceive only the appearances of bread and wine. Mary, Virgin and Mother... How can this be? The images of Jesus being taken up into the clouds and seated at the right hand of the Father might also contribute to a mistaken idea of Jesus' absence. We believe His presence is in a new mode, through the Holy Spirit.

Ascension is a glorious mystery and remain so even with the various definitions/meanings we might give it. The challenge remains, how do we incorporate Jesus' enduring presence in the midst of all the challenges of this world in our lives? I do not worry how Jesus ascended or where He ascended to. Instead, I imagine Jesus has gone on ahead of us... Not as in a 'left behind' scenario, but beckoning us forward. Not deserting us to find our own way, but following Him into an eternal way. I believe that at His Ascension, our lives became the space of His divine love.

VENERABLE LEO DEHON

Fr. Leo John Dehon: : The Pope's Preacher

In 1878, Pope Leo XIII issued a Decree of Praise for the Priests of the Sacred Heart, recognizing the invaluable ministries being done by the religious order Fr. Dehon founded. Fr. Dehon travelled to Rome to thank the Pope personally for this affirmation. At that meeting, Pope Leo XIII asked Fr. Dehon to "Preach my encyclicals." The Pope had been writing on contemporary issues of employment, the economy, and the need to protect the rights of workers. One of the Pope's major writings was *Rerum Novarum*: Encyclical of Pope Leo XIII on Capital and Labor, published May 15, 1891.

For the next 15 years, Fr. Dehon was a tireless interpreter of Leo XIII's social teachings. He promoted Christian social values mainly through his publications, such as the periodical "The Reign of the Heart of Jesus in Souls and Societies", his Christian Social Manual, and many other writings. He also participated in numerous Congresses of Social Studies throughout the region. Dehon particularly addressed the clergy, writing, "Social activity is not opposed to priestly work; it is by means of it that we prepare the social reign of Christ." His writings are still influencing seminary education today.
