

FR. GUY'S REFLECTION



My Friends,

This Gospel for the 18th Sunday begins with a striking sentence "Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me". In that sentence, I can hear the voice of anger, frustration, perhaps even

jealousy. No doubt there has been an exchange of words between the brothers that preceded the man interrupting Jesus as He spoke. Though the man's request of Jesus has floated through 2000 years arriving at our doorstep, it remains relevant in 2025. Wills, testaments, estates, inheritances, 'fair share' can cause family division, rancor, and often result in people not speaking to one another... Even though these things might have been designed to avoid division.

If we heard only a negative message in today's good news, we have misunderstood Jesus. I don't think Jesus is attempting to judge (notice he does not condemn the man who interrupts him or the rich farmer) nor is Jesus trying to frighten us with the thought you may die tonight. Perhaps one may die tonight, but not as a punishment from God. However, he is warning us against a deadly trap.

He is reminding us we belong to God. Our future is secure with God. Jesus is also saying everything we have is a gift from God. However... All material gifts remain on earth. We leave and return to God... Things stay behind.

Jesus also does not condemn material things or money as inherently evil but he is warning us if we let them control us then we have fallen into a deadly trap.

The man who interrupts Jesus is clearly not listening to Him. His mind is preoccupied... Really he is like a slave to the inheritance he desires. It seems he is asking Jesus to validate his desire for wealth. The farmer building more barns is also trapped; all his thoughts revolve around himself, even to speaking to himself about pleasures. This is deadly.

Deadly and tragic because the parable digs deeply toward the heart. It reveals money's ability to impoverish our soul and rewire our values. It can enable a person to live in a self-absorbed world in which one doesn't have to give a damn about God or anybody else.

Are we listening? Knowing that God does demand our lives from us every day... Isn't that what Jesus meant when he said "take up your cross and follow me every day?"

How should we live? What should we leave behind? What should we carry forward? What should we give away?...

PREPARING YOUR FAMILY FOR PHOTOGRAPHY

Please allow up to 1 hour total for your portrait session and selection of your directory pose. **Please be on time** and check in with the Host/Hostess. They will direct you to your photography location.

The photographer will be using a Green Screen Program for the Photos. Therefore, there are things to consider as you prepare for your photo session.

Clothing:

Stay away from "Green" patterns, busy patterns such as stripes and polka dots. Solid colors produce better contrasting photos, however, avoid green clothing. Red, Blue, Orange, Brown, Purple, or other colors are slenderizing and produce better contrasting photos. Choose a color theme that unifies the look of your family. Long sleeves are better for adults and focus attention on the face. Short sleeves are better for kids and infants. Wrinkled clothing does not photograph well.

Hair:

Avoid haircuts within 48 hours of your portrait session. It is best to have any hair changes done 2 weeks prior. Try to avoid hairstyles with large or small uplifting curls whish may let the "green color background" show through the hair.

Make-up:

Apply make-up as you normally would for an evening out. Pay special attention to your eyes. (This is the focal point in a portrait). An extra coat of mascara can help bring out your eyes. Bring lipstick and powder for touch ups. ChapStick works well for men. (It keeps lips from looking dry and cracked). The Portrait Cafe offers retouching to help with any complexion issues (scars, blemishes, facial lines, etc.) and can also whiten teeth or remove glare from glasses.

Glasses & Accessories:

If you wear glasses normally, please feel free to wear them in your portrait. Our photographers are trained to minimize any glare, and this way we photograph the "real you". Avoid large distracting accessories. Smaller jewelry items compliment your face.

Nails:

If you wear nail polish, it is best to wear neutral colors so that they will match with what you are wearing.

Posing for Your Images:

If you have any special requests, please let us know. We encourage you to have fun during your portrait session. Let the photographer work with the children to bring out their natural smiles. You may bring your pets to photograph with your family.


