

FR. GUY'S REFLECTION

Dear friends,

When we read a Gospel like this from Luke, we know Advent is at our doorstep and we are being advised to prepare.

Luke's words are not a prophecy regarding events to come, therefore not meant to terrorize us. The events Jesus speaks of: the destruction of the temple, the attack by Rome and Jerusalem, arrests and persecution, earthquakes, and famine...have already happened. Luke is interpreting these events for the people of his time, not to raise our anxiety in the 21st-century.

However, we can say life has always reflected the extremes Luke speaks of. Our time is no worse, even though many are convinced it is. One of the big differences between the church of Luke and our present church, their time and our time, is the Internet... We hear and see events around the world with an astonishing immediacy which piles up right before our eyes making us fearful. Or complacent...

The advice Luke gives to his church community is sound advice for us... Listen for Jesus, trust in Jesus.

For the most part, we are privileged people, not persecuted. Yes, it is true some of us suffer with illnesses that will undo us, others can barely survive under the harsh economic situation of our time. But we are not persecuted for our faith. No one watches us entering churches to worship and report our names to the authorities. To pretend that Christianity is under attack, mocks the people who suffer real persecution in other countries! We might wonder if our faith does challenge or makes a difference in our culture and country since really no one bothers us. We are perceived to be just like everybody else.

And yet... Many today have a compass for voting about our future. I often hear the current state of politics being described as dark or hateful. At each daily mass, I celebrate, before I comment on the gospel reading, I give a brief summary mentioning the events of the day in history. Famous and infamous people's achievements, battles, and wars... Hurricanes, tornadoes, it has all happened before. How did people of faith survive either the injustices inflicted on them by others or by natural disasters? They must've listened for Jesus, trusted in Jesus and must've realized they would gain their soul by their endurance... That nothing could separate them from the love of God manifest in Jesus Christ!

As we prepare to open the door to Advent, we recommit ourselves to the adult Jesus who gave us every reason by His life, death and resurrection to entrust our future into His hands...no matter what the future brings.

46 ROSARIES OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Mary is the star of our rosary. This venerable tradition links the month of October, dedicated to the Holy Rosary, from the 28th, to December 12th, the date of the Feast of Saint Mary of Guadalupe.



The devotion began more than a hundred years ago on the initiative of Monsignor Antonio Plancarte y Labastida, Abbot of the Tepeyac temple in the 19th century, who had a great devotion to the Virgin Morena and to whom the origin of this devotion is attributed. It was thanks to the initiative of Monsignor Plancarte that the Virgin Morena received the pontifical coronation in 1895 and that the old Basilica of Guadalupe was ordered to be built and enlarged. The origin of this devotion came from the habitual daily praying of the holy rosary in the gardens of the Sanctuary (current Basilica) until the day of the Feast of Saint Mary of Guadalupe, December 12th, and it was established that there were 46 rosaries in reference to the 46 stars that are seen on the mantle of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Each day, a quality, a capacity, a gift, a virtue, a response from Mary to God's plan, and her motherly mission with us is discovered, based on Mariano's original account."


