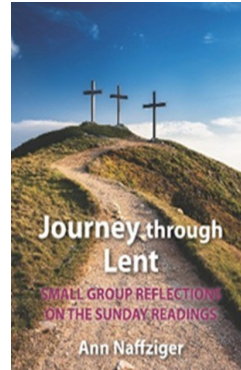

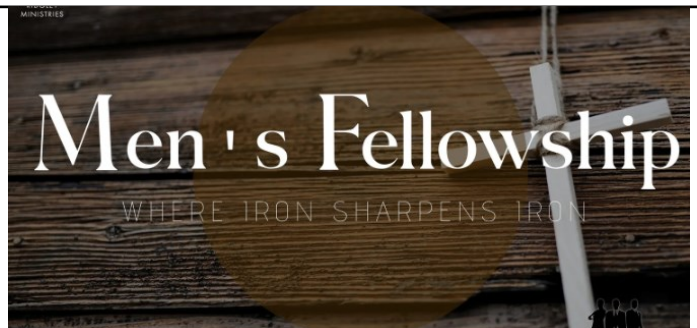

Second Sunday of Lent

Genesis 12:1–4a

An Act of Faith

“Abram went.” Those two words may not sound like much, but they set in motion the entire story of God’s chosen people.

God made a big promise to Abram. God promised to make him the father of a great nation, to have his name revered in blessings, to side with his friends, and to bring an end to his enemies. Who could refuse such a deal? God asked only one thing of Abram. God asked him to go.

Abram had been living in Ur, in modern-day Iraq. He probably had a very comfortable arrangement with property and family of his own. But God had other ideas. God wanted Abram to inhabit another place, where his family could prosper in number, productivity, and faith. These blessings would be his if Abram would just go.

Abram went. In that simple act of obedience, he demonstrated the hugeness of his faith and the sturdiness of his trust. In that simple act, he became the beneficiary of God’s great promise.

God may be asking you to go, to leave some place of comfort, to cross the threshold of a land you do not know, to believe that greater promises lie beyond. God needs only some sign of faith and trust.

2 Timothy 1:8b–10

Making an Effort

Sometimes other people see our gifts better than we do. Others recognize the abilities we have to make peace, to see hope, to lead a project, or to follow through on what we say we will do.

God has created us for a special purpose: to help announce the reign of God and bring it to fulfillment. God knows how each of us is made, what gifts we have, and how they can be used for good.

Knowing what to do does not always come easy. Even though we have gifts, it may require considerable effort to put them into play.

Sometimes we suffer greatly at the hands of others because we try to live according to what we believe and to what we can do.

The Second Letter to Timothy says, “Bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God.” God called us to a holy life “according to his own design and the grace bestowed on us in Christ.”

God wanted us to know that divine support will be with us always. For that reason, God’s support was made manifest “through the appearance of our savior Christ Jesus.”

Today we hear the story of the transfiguration. It signifies the shining wisdom and power of God, for whom all things are possible and who made us to share in this glory by the use of our gifts in spite of hardship.
