From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the second Sunday of Ordinary time; though this is a brief season in that Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent is February 10.

With the coming of January is the Pro Life March in Washington D.C. on January 22. As followers of Christ we continue to be that voice crying out in the wilderness affirming that all human life is sacred. We will stand up for the unborn as well as the terminally ill. Sadly, the medical killing lobby is slowly moving across our country. Using the slogan "Death with Dignity", they promote the deliberate killing of those patients who ask to die. Even the definition of dignity becomes a debate. As followers of Christ, we acknowledge that all persons have inherent dignity because each person is made in the likeness and image of God. The secular view of dignity is quite different, and is typically utilitarian. The secular world view would affirm that dignity is based on being productive and independent. So is a person able to contribute to society in some aspect of goods and services, they are okay, if not, strike one. Then is a person independent, or instead does he or she depend on others to live? Well if there is the absence of that independence – strike two. This is especially relevant to people who require long term care. Furthermore, the death with dignity agenda will invariable make reference to some poor soul who is suffering from a terminal illness and ask why this person can't be killed. Then, once an exception is made, the parameters of who qualifies to for medical killing quickly expands.

Furthermore, medical killing is usually done in a passive manner, i.e. withdrawing hydration and nutrition; again language is used to change the perspective. Hydration is water, nutrition is food, so in other words a person is left in a hospital bed without food or water, well most of us wouldn't last too long under those conditions. Then there is also the active process of medical killing – where a patient is simply injected with poison and dies. What can we do? Well at one time we could turn to our representatives in congress and oppose such legalization. Sadly, most advances by the medical killing lobby are made through the courts, because they know their agenda would not get through the legislative process. Presently, this is legal in five states, hopefully we can contain this problem and instead offer our Culture of Life.
