

The Shepherd's Call

Today we celebrate the Epiphany – a Greek word that could be translated to English as "manifestation" or "appearance." At every Mass Jesus is truly present, and even if He does not appear to our senses, he does appear to eyes

of faith. For four weeks, beginning next week, my homilies and Shepherd's Call will aim to strengthen our eyes of faith to better recognize His presence and better recognize what is really happening when Mass is celebrated. The real payoff is that once you better understand what the Mass is, you then better understand the valuable part you play in it.

As part of this effort, you will see incense for the next four weeks and begin to hear bells rung at Mass. (The bells will continue as long as I am celebrating Mass.) The incense and the bells call attention to certain moments of the Mass that are important to our understanding of the Mass. Over the course of the next four weeks I will point out the significance of those moments, though, I do not have the time to develop it on this page.

As you come to a deeper understanding of the Mass, consider ways you might use your imagination during Mass or during the proclamation of Gospel. The imagination forms images; in itself it is not a bad thing. If the images we allow distract us from the Mass it is bad. But if the images we form correspond to what is really happening, then it is good and a help to our prayer and participation. For example, when the Gospel is read you might imagine the scene playing out in your mind. Or else, at the singing of the "Holy, Holy," it is the song of all the Saints and angels in heaven. So you might imagine angels, Saints, or even loved ones who have died gathered above the altar. Such an image corresponds to reality – so long as it doesn't deprive your loved ones of your prayers should they be in purgatory. Because it reinforces what is really happening, it would be a good use of your imagination - so long as it doesn't replace hearing the words of the priest who is praying in the person of Christ. It's always a challenge having your mind wonder during Mass. I get that; I struggle with it, too, at times. But one of the best remedies or safeguards is to apply one's mind to what is really happening - or even to employing the imagination in a manner that corresponds to what is really happening.

It is a joy to know, love, and serve the good God...and to be so near to Him in the Most Holy Eucharist.
