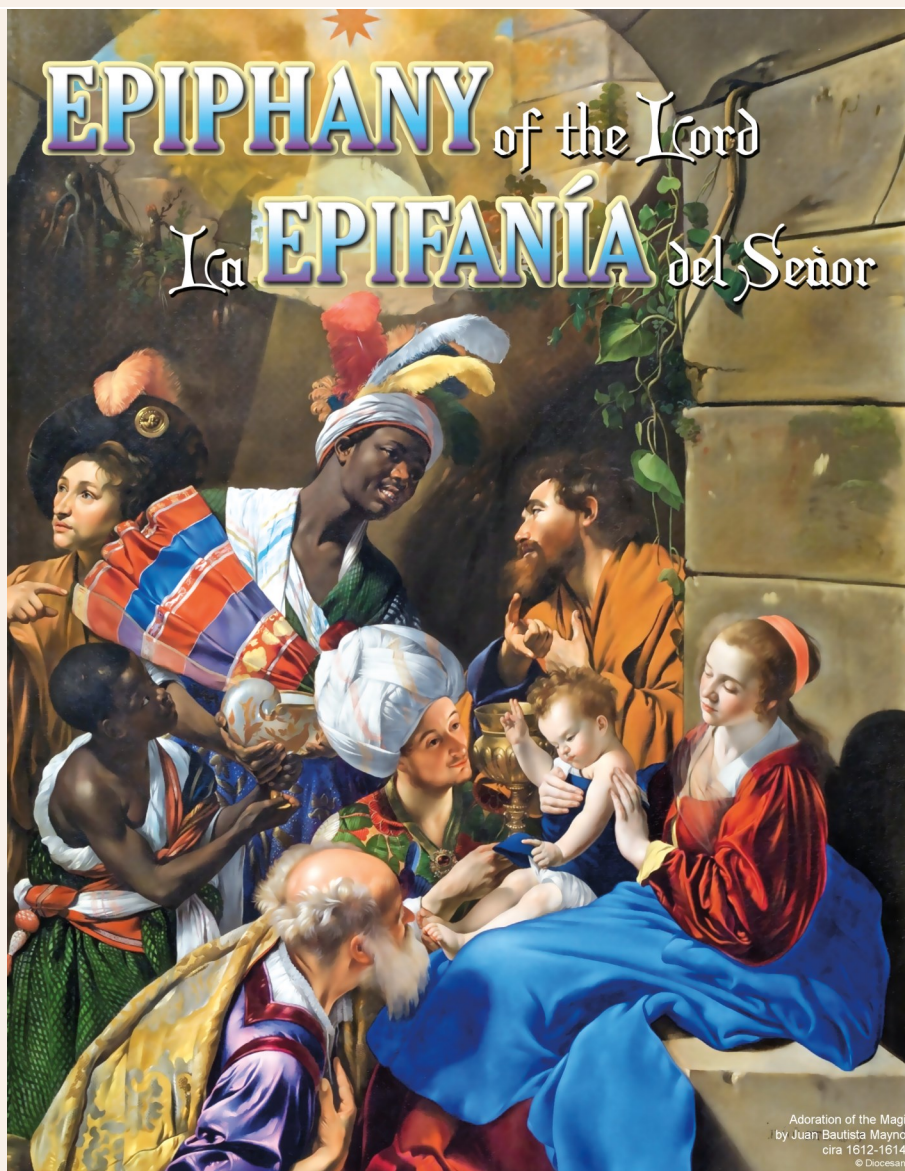

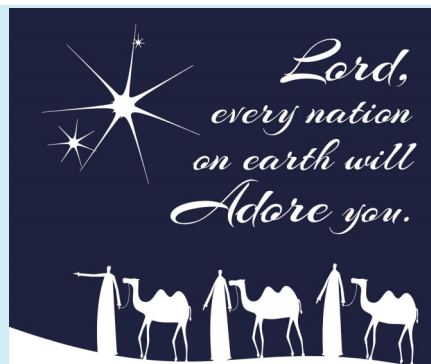

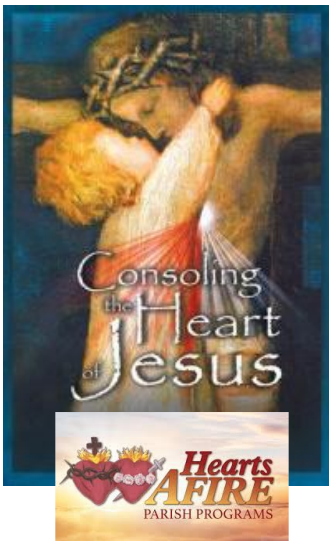
Shepherd's Call

For nearly a half century, the Catholic Church in the United States has celebrated National Migration Week the week of the Epiphany. The Epiphany is about outsiders recognizing and valuing what the people of Judah did not recognize or value. This is the statement from our Bishops Conference:

National Migration Week is an opportunity for the Church to reflect on the circumstances confronting migrants, including immigrants, refugees, children, and victims and survivors of human trafficking. The theme for National Migration Week 2020, "Promoting a Church and a World for All" draws attention to the fact that each of our families have a migration story, some recent and others in the distant past. Regardless of where we are and where we came from, we remain part of the human family and are called to live in solidarity with one another. Unfortunately, in our contemporary culture we often fail to encounter migrants as persons, and instead look at them as unknown others, if we even notice them at all. We do not take the time to engage migrants in a meaningful way, as fellow children of God, but remain aloof to their presence and suspicious or fearful of them. During this National Migration Week, let us all take the opportunity to engage migrants as community members, neighbors, and friends. To do so, we will look at the important role that foster care plays in the lives of unaccompanied immigrants and refugees, highlight MRS' Parishes Organized to Welcome Refugees, and examine local initiatives that are making important contributions in this regard.

In our Pastoral Region we obviously have migrants and refugees from various parts of Latin America. But we are also blessed in have people from other parts of the world. Fr. Rob, Fr. Richmond, and I are committed to help all those who call our Pastoral Region "home" to get to know and appreciate one another.

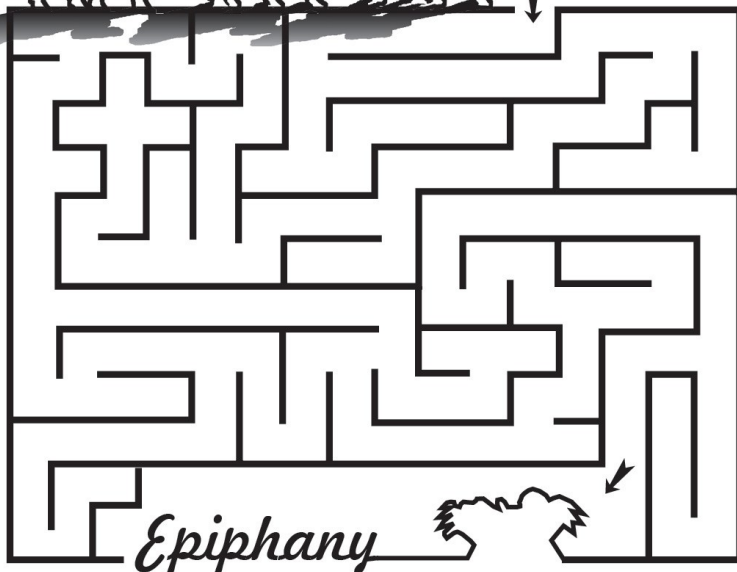
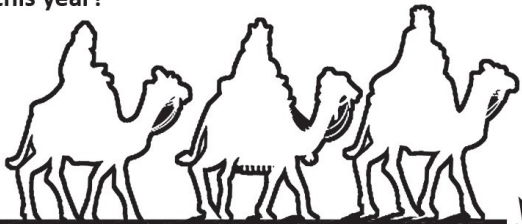

Since 2010 our parish was able to provide tuition assistance to 85 students from our parish who attend a Catholic School through the generous bequest of a parish member. We are blessed to have parish members who, even after they are enjoying their reward with Jesus in heaven, continue to support the work of our parish. We are often asked how to make such a bequest & it is very simple. When you call or visit your attorney, discuss adding the following language to your will or codicil: *"\$0.00 or % of estate to be distributed to St. Julie Billiard Catholic Church, currently located at 224 Dayton Street, Hamilton, Ohio 45011. If the church is not in existence at my death, the distribution to it shall be made to the successor institution into which it was merged. If there is no successor or merged institution, the bequest shall lapse."*
