

Pastor's Corner

Fr. Mike's Corner

You may have heard or read about a priest in Phoenix who was baptizing by saying "We baptize" instead of "I baptize". That diocese said that those baptisms were invalid and people he had baptized using that formula needed to be baptized again.

One of our parishioners asked me, "What about baptism of desire?" "Baptism of desire" is a belief that God recognizes the yearning of the human heart even if that desire is not fulfilled in a sacrament. On the other hand, the Church does not see as God sees and so needs to depend on externals. So, as is sometimes said, God has some the Church doesn't have and the Church has some God doesn't have.

The following is a statement from the Diocese of Phoenix

It is important to note that, while God instituted the sacraments for us, He is not bound by them. Though they are our surest access to grace, God can grant His grace in ways known only to Him. According to St. Thomas Aquinas, God has bound Himself **to** the sacraments, but He is not bound **by** the sacraments. This means that while we can be certain that God always works through the sacraments when they are properly conferred by the minister, God is not bound by the sacraments in that He can and does extend His grace in whatever measure and manner He wills. We can be assured that all who approached God, our Father, in good faith to receive the sacraments did not walk away empty-handed.

On a completely different note, our Archdiocese has publicly stated that it "will not be sponsoring, promoting or participating in this year's rendition of the event [Catholic Men's Conference]." That is because two main speakers advocate political positions of the radical right. I personally would add that I would strongly discourage anyone from attending.

St. Katharine Drexel | March 3

With a family like hers, it's no wonder that St. Katharine Drexel (November 26, 1858 – March 3, 1955) grew up to become one of the first American-born saints.

Born in Philadelphia in 1858, her mother passed away when she was only five weeks old. Her father, a renowned banker, remarried a wonderful woman, and together they raised St. Katherine Drexel and her two sisters in a life of privilege. Both financially and spiritually well-endowed, the Drexels were devout Catholics and set an excellent example of true Christian servitude with prayer and care for the poor.

After her father's death, St. Katharine Drexel gave up her inheritance and instead devoted her life to the material and spiritual well-being of black and native Americans. Mother Drexel, as she would become known as, established the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, and together they opened a boarding school in Santa Fe, the first of 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states.

At 77, she suffered a heart attack and was forced to retire from active ministry. She spent the next 20 years of her life in quiet yet intense prayer. She died at the age of 96 and was canonized in 2000 by Pope John Paul II. ©LPi





Por el otro lado la Iglesia no ve como Dios ve y por tanto tiene que depender en lo externo. Pues, como a veces se dice, Dios tiene a Igunos que la Iglesia no tiene y la Iglesia tiene algunos que Dios no tiene.

Lo siguiente es una cita de la Diócesis de Phoenix:

Es importante señalar que, si bien Dios instituyó los sacramentos para nosotros, no está obligado por ellos. Aunque son nuestro acceso más seguro a la gracia, Dios puede conceder Su gracia de maneras que solo Él conoce. Según Santo Tomás de Aquino, Dios se ha obligado a sí mismo a los sacramentos, pero no está obligado por los sacramentos. Esto significa que si bien podemos estar seguros de que Dios siempre obra a través de los sacramentos cuando el ministro los confiere debidamente, Dios no está obligado por los sacramentos en el sentido de que Él puede y extiende Su gracia en cualquier medida y manera que Él desee. Podemos estar seguros de que todos los que se acercaron a Dios, nuestro Padre, de buena fe para recibir los sacramentos no se fueron con las manos vacías.
