Vicars's Corner



A few weeks ago I wrote about the virtue of hope. Hope is a virtue directed toward heaven, but while we're here below we can nourish our hope by seeking places where glimpses of heaven can be found. That's why we should always follow the advice of St. Paul: "Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things." The liturgy is the foremost place where heaven meets earth. Only in the Eucharist can our eyes see and our hearts adore our Lord and God in the flesh.

But heaven can also meet earth through genuine acts of charity and service when we serve Christ present in the poor. These acts of love can make a powerful difference in people's lives, and give us a reason to hope.

Several local charities have caught on to this theme and have made hope a part of their name. Pathways to Hope is the local crisis pregnancy center, and HOPEfull Pastures is a local therapeutic farm that helps families heal by introducing them to the beauty of creation. Pathways to Hope provides a full range of pregnancy care services. Their website describes their mission briefly and eloquently: "We serve women and men facing unexpected pregnancies with free resources, accurate information about their choices, ongoing support for families, and lasting hope."

From Jonathan Alexzander, Music Director: What does singing in the choir mean?

Being in the choir means many things. It means having a group of people to have fun with. It means sharing in prayer with others. It means being there for the other members of the choir, and in turn, having people to be there for you, both in times of joy and in times of sorrow. It means the choir director sleeps easier because there are more people in the choir. It is much more than just practicing and singing. More than just having a place to sit at the front of the church. The choir is a community of believers-- a community that is caring supportive, fun, out-going, and just a great group of people to be around. Singing in a choir is proven to be good for our brains in many ways. "Music is awash with neurochemical rewards for working up the courage to sing. That rush, or "singer's high," comes in part through a surge of

endorphins, which at the same time alleviates pain. When the voices of the singers surrounding me hit my ear. I'm bathed in dopamine, a neurotransmitter in the brain that is associated with feelings of pleasure & alertness. Music lowers cortisol, a chemical that signals levels of stress. Studies have found that people who listened to music before surgery were more relaxed and needed less anesthesia and afterward they got by with smaller amounts of pain medication. Music also releases serotonin, a neurotransmitter associated with feelings of euphoria and contentment." (https:// slate.com/human-interest/2013/07/singing-in-achoir-research-shows-it-increases-happiness.html) The Choir has something for everyone. And everyone has something that they can bring to the choir. What can you bring?

Choir practices are Thursdays at 7PM at St Julie Billiart Church starting September 8.

Would you like to learn the language that Abraham spoke?

We are looking at offering a 10-to-12 week course to help learn to write the alphabet of Biblical Hebrew, correctly pronounce the 22 Hebrew letters, and begin to read Biblical Hebrew words. In order to proceed, we need a minimum of 10 interested & committed students.

Hebrew was the <u>original</u> language of the Israelites. The Hebrew alphabet & language remained pure until the Babylonian Exile in 586 BC, when spoken Hebrew came under the influence of Aramaic. Aramaic then became the prevailing language of the entire Middle East from about 700 BC through the

time of Christ. Tradition holds that Ezra, skilled in both languages, employed the Aramaic square script alphabet in place of the old (Paleo-Hebrew) alphabet around 500 BC.

While the Aramaic alphabet still served the Aramaic language, it also began to be used for the Hebrew alphabet. The Biblical Hebrew text available to us today is thus written in the Hebrew language with the Aramaic square script adopted. Biblical Hebrew contains 22 letters, as noted in Psalm 119, all of which are consonants, and is written from right to left.


