



Vicars's Corner



I wrote in the last article about some history of the Rosary and gave some reasons to pray this wonderful prayer. In my view, we can pray the Rosary in basically three different ways. First, as meditative prayer, the Rosary can lead us to contemplate the events of Christ's incarnation, life, death, and resurrection in a deeply personal way. Secondly, the Rosary is a wonderful family devotion – a prayer to be prayed with and for our families – it's an easy prayer for

children to learn and even enjoy. Lastly, if nothing else, the rosary is good daily routine of prayer which can keep us grounded in the life of faith – G.K. Chesterton's wonderful maxim applies here: "anything worth doing is worth doing poorly!" But of

course, we want to pray the Rosary well out of love for our God and Mary His and our Mother. Like everything worth doing, this isn't easy. Mostly through a lively conversation with veteran Rosary pray-ers at last weekend's "Second Sunday at Ars" gathering, I have a few tips to share:

- When praying on one of the mysteries of the rosary, it might be easier to focus on some aspect of the mystery – e.g., when pondering the 5th sorrowful mystery, one could specifically meditate on the Lord's pierced hands or feet, rather than trying to take everything in at once.
- You could try a Scriptural rosary, inserting relevant Bible verses between Hail Mary beads. Here's an example online: https://www.ourcatholicprayers.com/scriptural-rosary.html
- Another approach is a guided Rosary meditation, such as the free podcast offered daily through the ministry called "School of Faith:" https://www.schooloffaith.com/daily-rosary-meditations
- Perhaps reading a book on the Rosary might help us appreciate its depth and pray it better. I like a short book by Romano Guardini, one of Pope Francis's favorite theologians, called The Rosary of our Lady (despite Guardini's acumen, the book is simple – and short). Praying the Rosary Like Never Before by Edward Sri comes highly recommended as well.



"I HAVE EARNESTLY DESIRED:" EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS (June 29th, 2022) ON THE LITURGICAL FORMATION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

The Church: Sacrament of the Body of Christ

14. As Vatican Council II reminded us (see number 5 of the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy), citing the scriptures, the Fathers and the Liturgy—the pillars of authentic Tradition—it was from the side of Christ as He slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth "the wondrous sacrament of the whole Church." The parallel between the first Adam and the new Adam is striking: as from the side of the first Adam, after having cast him into a deep sleep, God draws forth Eve, so also from the side of the new Adam, Sleeping the sleep of death on the cross, there is born the new Eve, the Church. The astonishment for us lies in the words that we can imagine the new Adam made his own: "Here at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh" (Genesis 2:23). For our having believed in His Word and descended into the waters of Baptism, we have become bone of his bone and flesh of his flesh.

15. Without this incorporation there is no possibility of living the fullness of the worship of God. In fact, there is only one act of worship, perfect and pleasing to the Father; namely, the obedience of the Son, the measure of which is his death on the cross. The only possibility of being able to participate in his offering is by becoming "sons in the Son." This is the gift we have received. The subject acting in the Liturgy is always and only Christ-Church, the mystical Body of Christ.

This distinction notes that the parish and school are putting effort into caring for God's creation, whish is part of out faith's teaching. The award takes its name from Pope Francis' encyclical, Laudato Si.

Parishioners completed household surveys with assistance from Fran Jacoby, a member of the Pastoral Region's Outreach Committee. Parish and school staff members, Liz Moran, Don Austing and Dr. Joel Anderson, attended to surveys of the parish and school facilities. Key to that assessment was the LED lighting installed in the church and church gardens tended by parishioners, known as the Gardening Angels.

Students at St. Peter's also participated in an inventory and engaged in a presentation with Mrs. Chris Schell of the Archdiocese's Care for Creation Task Force. Teacher Angie Wirtz hosted the presentation in her classroom.

St. Peter students, Remy Phipps and Elly Raines, accepted the Laudato Si banner on October 4th. Attending with the student were their parents, Lyndsay & David Phipps and Monica Raines, along with St. Peter School Principal, Dr. Joel Anderson, and Pam Long, Outreach Coordinator for the Hamilton Catholic Pastoral Region.

Now two of five parishes in our parish family have received the Laudato Si designation for their care for God's creation. St. Julie Billiart parish received the recognition in 2019.

La Iglesia: sacramento del Cuerpo de Cristo


14. Como nos ha recordado el Concilio Vaticano II (cfr. Sacrosanctum Concilium, n. 5) citando la Escritura, los Padres y la Liturgia —columnas de la verdadera Tradición— del

costado de Cristo dormido en la cruz brotó el admirable sacramento de toda la Iglesia [4]. El paralelismo entre el primer y el nuevo Adán es sorprendente: así como del costado del primer Adán, tras haber dejado caer un letargo sobre él, Dios formó a Eva, así del costado del nuevo Adán, dormido en el sueño de la muerte, nace la nueva Eva, la Iglesia. El estupor está en las palabras que, podríamos imaginar, el nuevo Adán hace suyas mirando a la Iglesia: "Esta sí que es hueso de mis huesos y carne de mi carne" (Gén 2,23). Por haber creído en la Palabra y haber descendido en el agua del bautismo, nos hemos convertido en hueso de sus huesos, en carne de su carne.

15. Sin esta incorporación, no hay posibilidad de experimentar la plenitud del culto a Dios. De hecho, uno sólo es el acto de culto perfecto y agradable al Padre, la obediencia del Hijo cuya medida es su muerte en cruz. La única posibilidad de participar en su ofrenda es ser hijos en el Hijo. Este es el don que hemos recibido. El sujeto que actúa en la Liturgia es siempre y solo Cristo-Iglesia, el Cuerpo Místico de Cristo.

Debemos rezar el Rosario por amor a nuestro Dios y a María nuestra madre. Al rezar sobre uno de los misterios del rosario, podría ser más fácil concentrarse en algún aspecto del misterio; por ejemplo, al reflexionar sobre el quinto misterio doloroso, uno podría meditar específicamente en las manos o los pies perforados del Señor, en lugar de intentar tomar todo a la vez.
