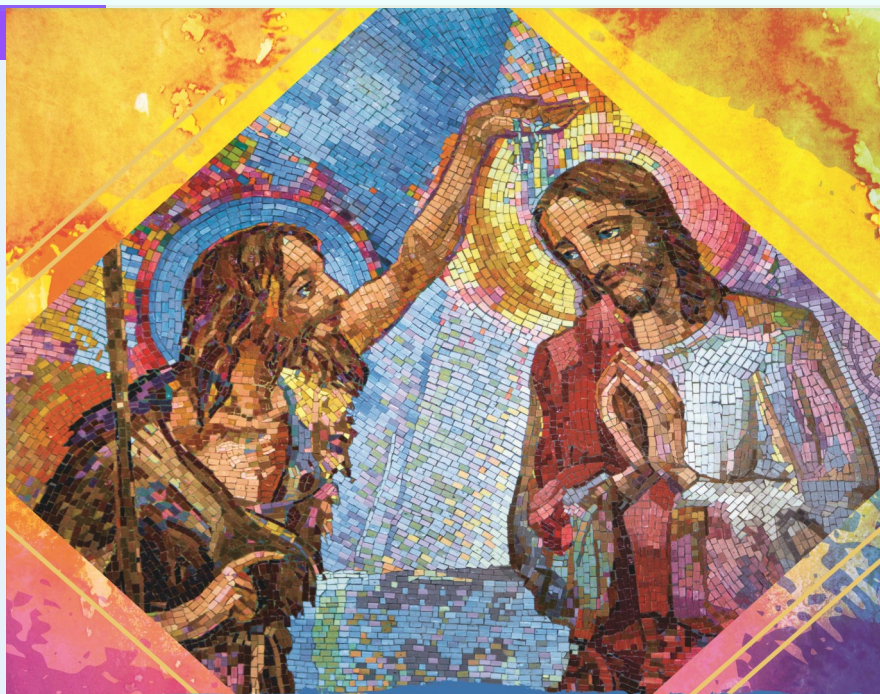

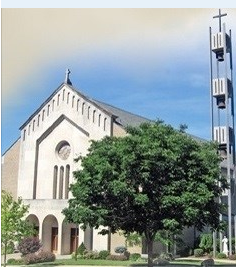

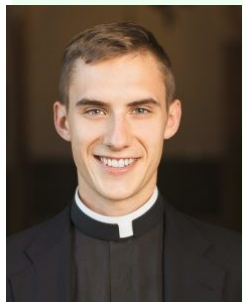

The US Catholic bishops have begun a nationwide campaign of Eucharistic revival. This year the renewal program is in full swing. There are some local events (for example, St. Maximilian Kolbe parish in West Chester is hosting the relics of Bl. Carlo Acutis, a contemporary saint of the Eucharist, this week). There are national events, like the planned Eucharistic processions which will span the country (see an article in The Pillar: "A 'deeper walk with Jesus' - Eucharistic revival plans walking US pilgrimages"). There are also diocesan efforts. In our Archdiocese, Archbishop Schnurr has made available a week-

ly email update with a documentary on the Mass by Bishop Robert Barron. See the bulletin or call the parish office for details. The Fr. Butler Council of the Knights of Columbus is hosting a weekly donut social to watch this video series and discuss it every Sunday after the 10 am Mass at our very own St. Peter in Chains in Hamilton. However you decide to participate, I encourage you to take part in this renewal. A body that isn't always renewing itself is simply dead. Souls and parishes that do not always renew their devotion to the great source of our life - the Lord Jesus in the Eucharist, are in danger of the same fate. I encourage you to join in this great year of renewal through prayer and study devoted to the greatest of our Sacraments - the source and summit of our faith, the Holy Eucharist.

En Español

UU."). También hay esfuerzos diocesanos. En nuestra Arquidiócesis, el arzobispo Schnurr ha puesto a disposición una actualización semanal por correo electrónico con un documental sobre la Misa del Obispo Robert Barron. Vea el boletín o llame a la oficina parroquial para más detalles. El Consejo de los Caballeros de Colón (Butler) está organizando una reunión semanal social (Se compartirán Donas) para ver esta serie de videos y discutirla todos los domingos después de la Misa de las 10 a. m. en nuestro propio St. Peter in Chains en Hamilton. Independientemente de cómo decidas participar, te animo a participar en esta renovación. Un cuerpo que no se renueva está simplemente muerto.

Las almas y las parroquias que no siempre renueven su devoción a la gran fuente de nuestra vida, el Señor Jesús en la Eucaristía, corren el mismo destino. Los animo a unirse a este gran año de renovación a través de la oración y el estudio dedicado al más grande de nuestros Sacramentos: la fuente y cumbre de nuestra fe, la Sagrada Eucaristía.

“I HAVE EARNESTLY DESIRED:” EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS (June 29th, 2022) ON THE LITURGICAL FORMATION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

The need for a serious and vital liturgical formation



41. From all that we have said about the nature of the Liturgy it becomes clear that knowledge of the mystery of Christ, the decisive question for our lives, does not consist in a mental assimilation of some idea but in real existential engagement with his person. In this sense, Liturgy is not about “knowledge,” and its scope is not primarily pedagogical, even though it does have great pedagogical value (see *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, number 33). Rather, Liturgy is about praise, about rendering thanks for the Passover of the Son whose power reaches our lives. The celebration concerns the reality of our being docile to the action of the Spirit who operates through it until Christ be formed in us (see *Galatians 4:19*). The full extent of our formation is our conformation to Christ. I repeat: it does not have to do with an abstract mental process, but with becoming Him. This is the purpose for which the Spirit is given, whose action is always and only to confection the Body of Christ. It is that way with the Eucharistic bread, and with every one of the baptized called to become always more and more that which was received as a gift in Baptism; namely, being a member of the Body of Christ. Leo the Great writes, “Our participation in the Body and Blood of Christ has no other end than to make us become that which we eat.”

As part of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati's pastoral planning process, Archbishop Schnurr is asking us to participate in the "Discipleship Maker Index" survey (DMI). DMI is an anonymous survey of parishioners which provides insights into the level of engagement with the parish, as well as the effectiveness of the Mass experience, preaching and other aspects of the parish. DMI was developed by Catholic Leadership Institute in 2013 to be an instrument which is statistically sound while at the same time focusing on important aspects of our Catholic Faith. Data from the DMI is intended to be used as input for planning, to help parishes identify key strengths and areas of opportunity, which can be further refined into priorities and goals for the parish. 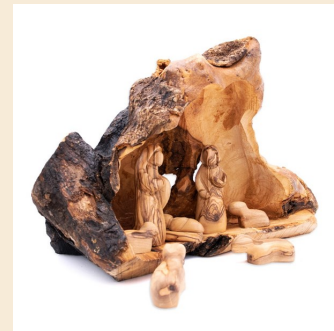
SAVE THE DATE: CARE FOR CREATION CONFERENCE, SATURDAY, MARCH 4 -

41. De cuanto hemos dicho sobre la naturaleza de la Liturgia, resulta evidente que el conocimiento del misterio de Cristo, cuestión decisiva para nuestra vida, no consiste en una asimilación mental de una idea, sino en una real implicación existencial con su persona. En este sentido, la Liturgia no tiene que ver con el "conocimiento", y su finalidad no es primordialmente pedagógica (aunque tiene un gran valor pedagógico: cfr. Sacrosanctum Concilium, n. 33) sino que es la alabanza, la acción de gracias por la Pascua del Hijo, cuya fuerza salvadora llega a nuestra vida. La celebración tiene que ver con la realidad de nuestro ser dóciles a la acción del Espíritu, que actúa en ella, hasta que Cristo se forme en nosotros (cfr. Gál 4,19). La plenitud de nuestra formación es la conformación con Cristo. Repito: no se trata de un proceso mental y abstracto, sino de llegar a ser Él. Esta es la finalidad para la cual se ha dado el Espíritu, cuya acción es siempre y únicamente confeccionar el Cuerpo de Cristo. Es así con el pan eucarístico, es así para todo bautizado llamado a ser, cada vez más, lo que recibió como don en el bautismo, es decir, ser miembro del Cuerpo de Cristo. León Magno escribe: «Nuestra participación en el Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo no tiende a otra cosa sino a convertirnos en lo que comemos» [11].

42. Esta implicación existencial tiene lugar –en continuidad y coherencia con el método de la Encarnación– por vía sacramental. La Liturgia está hecha de cosas que son exactamente lo contrario de abstracciones espirituales: pan, vino, aceite, agua, perfume, fuego, ceniza, piedra, tela, colores, cuerpo, palabras, sonidos, silencios, gestos, espacio, movimiento, acción, orden, tiempo, luz. Toda la creación es manifestación del amor de Dios: desde que ese mismo amor se ha manifestado en plenitud en la cruz de Jesús, toda la creación es atraída por Él. Es toda la creación la que es asumida para ser puesta al servicio del encuentro con el Verbo encarnado, crucificado, muerto, resucitado, ascendido al Padre. Así como canta la plegaria sobre el agua para la fuente bautismal, al igual que la del aceite para el sagrado crisma y las palabras de la presentación del pan y el vino, frutos de la tierra y del trabajo del hombre.37. La configuración del estudio de la Liturgia en los seminarios debe tener en cuenta también la extraordinaria capacidad que la celebración tiene en sí misma para ofrecer una visión orgánica del conocimiento teológico. Cada disciplina de la teología, desde su propia perspectiva, debe mostrar su íntima conexión con la Liturgia, en virtud de la cual se revela y realiza la unidad de la formación sacerdotal (cfr. Sacrosanctum Concilium, n. 16). Una configuración litúrgico-sapiencial de la formación teológica en los seminarios tendría ciertamente efectos positivos, también en la acción pastoral. No hay ningún aspecto de la vida eclesial que no encuentre su culmen y su fuente en ella. La pastoral de conjunto, orgánica, integrada, más que ser el resultado de la elaboración de complicados programas, es la consecuencia de situar la celebración eucarística dominical, fundamento de la comunión, en el centro de la vida de la comunidad. La comprensión teológica de la Liturgia no permite, de ninguna manera, entender estas palabras como si todo se redujera al aspecto cultural. Una celebración que no evangeliza, no es auténtica, como no lo es un anuncio que no lleva al encuentro con el Resucitado en la celebración: ambos, pues, sin el testimonio de la caridad, son como un metal que resuena o un címbalo que aturde (cfr. 1Cor 13,1).
