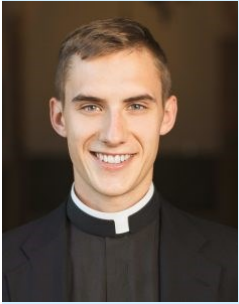

Vicars's Corner



The countdown to Lent continues, and this week I'll interrupt my usual rambling reflections with a pointed invitation directed to fathers - especially fathers with children still in the home. This Lent, I'm asking you to join the (2nd annual) Fathers' Lenten Challenge. It is a challenge. If you accept, you'll meet weekly (6:50 am on Saturday mornings, or 8:50 pm Thursday evenings), practice a common penance, and learn to lead your families in prayer. This is not a group at which we sit around the table and "sing Kum-ba-yah" or feel forced to spill our guts.

The goals are actions and results - actions: prayer, penance, and servant leadership; and results: God willing, lifelong faith for your children. Only you, with God's help, can achieve this. My goal is to provide you with the time-tested tools of our faith, which have too often been neglected. The jury is not out, the judgment is in: studies have always concluded that the way parents practice their faith is the #1 indicator for how and whether their children will remain faithful. The same studies show that the father's faith is the most influential. As one sociologist put it, "The good news is that, among all possible influences, parents exert far and away the greatest influence on their children's religious outcomes.

Stated differently, the bad news is that nearly all human responsibility for the religious trajectories of children's lives falls on their parents' shoulders." ("Keeping the Faith", First Things, May 2021) Fathers, if you're ready to embrace that responsibility anew this Lent, I'll see you at the St. Joseph rectory, 171 Washington St, 8:50 pm on Thursday, February 23, or 6:50 am on Saturday, February 25.

El juicio no está fuera, está dentro: los estudios siempre han concluido que la forma en que los padres practican su fe es el indicador #1 de cómo sus hijos permanecerán fieles. "Los padres ejercen la mayor influencia en los resultados religiosos de sus hijos.

Dicho de otra manera, toda la responsabilidad humana de la trayectoria religiosa de la vida de los niños recae sobre los hombros de sus padres". ("Manteniendo la fe", First Things, mayo de 2021) Esta Cuaresma, consideren orar juntos como familia. Las oraciones familiares no tienen que ser largas ni complicadas. Rezar oraciones cortas por la mañana o por la noche, una década del rosario o alguna otra devoción juntos deja un gran impacto en el corazón de los niños.

We'll have some time for fun and games, faith formation, and adoration and confession. The need for a serious and vital liturgical formation

[44 continued] We no longer have the gaze of St. Francis, who looked at the sun—which he called brother because so he felt it to be—and saw it beautiful and radiant with great splendour, and full of wonder, he sang that it bears a likeness of You, Most High One. To have lost the capacity to grasp the symbolic value of the body and of every creature renders the symbolic language of the Liturgy almost inaccessible to the modern mentality. And yet there can be no question of renouncing such language. It cannot be renounced because it is how the Holy Trinity chose to reach us through the flesh of the Word. It is rather a question of recovering the capacity to use and understand the symbols of the Liturgy. We must not lose hope because this dimension in us, as I have just said, is constitutive; and despite the evils of materialism and spiritualism—both of them the negations of the unity of soul and body—it is ready to re-emerge, as is every truth.

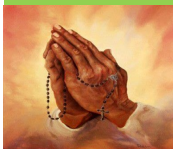
45. So, the question I want to pose is how can we become once again capable of symbols? How can we again know how to read them and be able to live them? We know well that the celebration of the sacraments, by the grace of God, is efficacious in itself (ex opere operato), but this does not guarantee the full engagement of people without an adequate way of their placing themselves in relation to the language of the celebration. A symbolic “reading” is not a mental knowledge, not the acquisition of concepts, but rather a living experience.

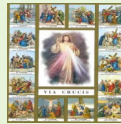

49. Como cualquier arte, requiere diferentes conocimientos.

En primer lugar, la comprensión del dinamismo que describe la Liturgia. El momento de la acción celebrativa es el lugar donde, a través del memorial, se hace presente el misterio pascual para que los bautizados, en virtud de su participación, puedan experimentarlo en su vida: sin esta comprensión, se cae fácilmente en el "exteriorismo" (más o menos refinado) y en el rubricismo (más o menos rígido).

Es necesario, pues, conocer cómo actúa el Espíritu Santo en cada celebración: el arte de celebrar debe estar en sintonía con la acción del Espíritu. Sólo así se librará de los subjetivismos, que son el resultado de la prevalencia de las sensibilidades individuales, y de los culturalismos, que son incorporaciones sin criterio de elementos culturales, que nada tienen que ver con un correcto proceso de inculturación.

Por último, es necesario conocer la dinámica del lenguaje simbólico, su peculiaridad, su eficacia.

50. De estas breves observaciones se desprende que el arte de celebrar no se puede improvisar. Como cualquier arte, requiere una aplicación asidua. Un artesano sólo necesita la técnica; un artista, además de los conocimientos técnicos, no puede carecer de inspiración, que es una forma positiva de posesión: el verdadero artista no posee un arte, ni es poseído por él. Uno no aprende el arte de celebrar porque asista a un curso de oratoria o de técnicas de comunicación persuasiva (no juzgo las intenciones, veo los efectos). Toda herramienta puede ser útil, pero siempre debe estar sujeta a la naturaleza de la Liturgia y a la acción del Espíritu. Es necesaria una dedicación diligente a la celebración, dejando que la propia celebración nos transmita su arte. Guardini escribe: «Debemos darnos cuenta de lo profundamente arraigados que estamos todavía en el individualismo y el subjetivismo, de lo poco acostumbrados que estamos a la llamada de las cosas grandes y de lo pequeña que es la medida de nuestra vida religiosa. Hay que despertar el sentido de la grandeza de la oración, la voluntad de implicar también nuestra existencia en ella. Pero el camino hacia estas metas es la disciplina, la renuncia a un sentimentalismo blando; un trabajo serio, realizado en obediencia a la Iglesia, en relación con nuestro ser y nuestro comportamiento religioso» [15]. Así es como se aprende el arte de la celebración.
