



Vicars's Corner



During the next few vicars' corners we'll tackle the three pillars of Lenten practice, penance, prayer, and alms. We'll tackle penance this week. Our guiding verse of Scripture is the beatitude, "blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God."

First, we should remind ourselves that while penance is encouraged during Lent, it's a year-round activity. It's an obligation for Catholics every Friday of the year (except a few special feasts). During Lent, that penance must be abstaining from meat. Other Fridays of the year, Catholics are free to pick their penance.

Why is penance (supposed to be) such an integral part of our lives as Christians? I'll focus on two reasons. The first is detachment. We're all attached to various things - some harmful, some more benign. A sign of attachment is to feel pain when the object is missed. I'm attached to outdoor activities. Take away my fishing trip, and I feel it.

That's attachment. It isn't bad in itself, but it can be a distraction. When we "give something up," we're breaking an attachment, eliminating a distraction. The more we break our attachments, the cleaner and purer our hearts can become, so that we can turn our hearts to God - we can "see God," in the words of the beatitude.

As we become free to "see God" we can begin to embrace the second purpose of penance - to share in Christ's suffering. Saints who practiced remarkable penances (so many - Catherine of Siena, Jean Vianney, Mother Teresa come to mind) did so because they wanted to share the Cross. St. Paul said, "I fill up in my body what is lacking in the sufferings of Christ." Every Christian is called to do that - to suffer with Christ for the salvation of souls. Through the school of suffering we learn love.

The purpose of penance? Detachment gives purity of heart, which frees us to suffer with Christ for our salvation. "Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall see God."

Nuestro versículo guía de las Escrituras es la bienaventuranza, "bienaventurados los limpios de corazón, porque ellos verán a Dios".

Primero, debemos recordarnos que, si bien se fomenta la penitencia durante la Cuaresma, es una Weekly actividad de todo el año. Es una obligación para los católicos todos los viernes del año (excepto algunas fiestas especiales). Durante la Cuaresma, esa penitencia debe ser abstenerse de comer carne. Los demás viernes del año, los católicos son libres de elegir su penitencia.

¿Por qué la penitencia (se supone que es) una parte tan integral de nuestras vidas como cristianos? Me centraré en dos razones. El primero es el desapego. Todos estamos apegados a varias cosas, algunas dañinas, otras más benignas. Un signo de apego es sentir dolor cuando se pierde el objeto. Estoy apegado a las actividades al aire libre, cancelo mi viaje de pesca, y lo siento. Eso es apego. No es malo en sí mismo, pero puede ser una distracción. Cuando "renunciamos a algo", estamos rompiendo un apego, eliminando una distracción. Cuanto más rompamos nuestros apegos, más limpios y puros pueden volverse nuestros corazones, para que podamos volver nuestros corazones a Dios: podemos "ver a Dios", en las palabras de la bienaventuranza.

"I HAVE EARNESTLY DESIRED:" EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS (June 29th, 2022) ON THE LITURGICAL FORMATION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

Ars celebrandi

One way of caring for and growing in a vital understanding of the symbols of the Liturgy is certainly the ars celebrandi, the art of celebrating. This expression also is subject to different interpretations. Its sense becomes clear if we refer to the theological sense of the Liturgy described in Sacrosanctum Concilium n. 7, to which I have already referred to several times. The ars celebrandi cannot be reduced to only a rubrical mechanism, much less should it be thought of as imaginative—sometimes wild—creativity without rules. The rite is in itself a norm, and the norm is never an end in itself, but it is always at the service of a higher reality that it means to protect.

49. As in any art, the ars celebrandi requires different kinds of knowledge. First of all, it requires an understanding of the dynamism that unfolds through the Liturgy. The action of the celebration is the place in which, by means of memorial, the Paschal Mystery is made present so that the baptized, through their participation, can experience it in their own lives. Without this understanding, the celebration easily falls into a preoccupation with the exterior (more or less refined) or into a concern only for the rubrics (mor or less rigid).

Then, it is necessary to know how the Holy Spirit acts in every celebration. The art of celebrating must be in harmony with the action of the Spirit. Only in this way will it be free from the subjectivisms that are the fruit of individual tastes dominating. Only in this way will it be free from the invasion of cultural elements that are taken on without discernment and that have nothing to do with a correct understanding of inculturation.

Finally, it is necessary to understand the dynamics of symbolic language, its particular nature, its efficacy.



importancia. Varias veces se prescribe expresamente en las rúbricas: toda la celebración eucarística está inmersa en el silencio que precede a su inicio y marca cada momento de su desarrollo ritual. En efecto, está presente en el acto penitencial; después de la invitación a la oración; en la Liturgia de la Palabra (antes de las lecturas, entre las lecturas y después de la homilía); en la plegaria eucarística; después de la comunión [16]. No es un refugio para esconderse en un aislamiento intimista, padeciendo la ritualidad como si fuera una distracción: tal silencio estaría en contradicción con la esencia misma de la celebración. El silencio litúrgico es mucho más: es el símbolo de la presencia y la acción del Espíritu Santo que anima toda la acción celebrativa, por lo que, a menudo, constituye la culminación de una secuencia ritual. Precisamente porque es un símbolo del Espíritu, tiene el poder de expresar su acción multiforme. Así, retomando los momentos que he recordado anteriormente, el silencio mueve al arrepentimiento y al deseo de conversión; suscita la escucha de la Palabra y la oración; dispone a la adoración del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo; sugiere a cada uno, en la intimidad de la comunión, lo que el Espíritu quiere obrar en nuestra vida para conformarnos con el Pan partido. Por eso, estamos llamados a realizar con extremo cuidado el gesto simbólico del silencio: en él nos da forma el Espíritu.
