

#### Vicars's Corner



This week we look at the Lenten discipline of prayer. Let's be guided by the Lord's teaching on prayer in the gospel for Ash Wednesday. First, the Lord says "take care not to perform your righteousness before men." The phrase "perform your righteousness" is a Hebrew-ism meaning "do the works which we owe to God in justice." That's an important reminder. We don't pray primarily for our sake. First and foremost, we pray to repay a debt of justice we owe to God. We pray to adore Him. Not praying is a grave act of ingratitude and injustice, far worse than the sad case of an ungrateful child who decides never to speak to his loving parents. We simply must pray.

How? The Lord tells us, "But when you pray, go to your inner room, close the door, and pray to your Father in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will repay you." Now, the Lord isn't speaking about the inner room of a literal house, as if we cannot pray in Church but only in closets. He's speaking about the inner room of our hearts - the secret sanctuary at the core of our being which was created to be His Temple. There's a million ways to pray - liturgical prayer - the Mass - is the best. But every form of prayer necessarily presupposes the inner "secret" reminder of God's presence. One saint used to begin every time of prayer with these words: "Lord, I firmly believe that you are here, that you see me, and that you hear me."

We pray to "perform our righteousness" to God, and the Lord blesses that endeavor, saying "blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied."

No orar es un grave acto de ingratitud e injusticia, mucho peor que el triste caso de un niño desagradecido que decide no hablar nunca con sus amados padres. Simplemente debemos orar.

Oramos para "hacer nuestra justicia" a Dios, y el Señor bendice ese esfuerzo, diciendo "bienaventurados los que tienen hambre y sed de justicia, porque ellos serán saciados".

# "I HAVE EARNESTLY DESIRED:" EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS (June 29th, 2022)

#### ON THE LITURGICAL FORMATION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD

**50.** From these brief indications it should be clear that the art of celebration is not something that can be improvised. Like every art, it requires consistent application. For an artisan, technique is enough. But for an artist, in addition to technical knowledge, there has also to be inspiration, which is a positive form possession. The true artist does not possess an art but rather is possessed by it. One does not learn the

art of celebrating by frequenting a course in public speaking or in persuasive techniques of communication. (I am not judging intentions, just observing effects.) Every tool can be useful, but it must be at the service of the nature of the Liturgy and the action of the Holy Spirit. A diligent dedication to the celebration is required, allowing the celebration itself to convey to us its art. Guardini writes: "We must understand how deeply we remain entrenched in individualism and subjectivism, how unaccustomed we have become to the demands of the 'great,' and how small the parameters of our religious living are. We must regain the sense for the 'great' style of praying, the will towards the existential in prayer too. The way to achieve this, though, is through discipline, through giving up weak sentimentality, through serious work, carried out in obedience to the Church, on our religious being and acting." This is how the art of celebrating is learned.







53. Cada gesto y cada palabra contienen una acción precisa que es siempre nueva, porque encuentra un momento siempre nuevo en nuestra vida. Permitidme explicarlo con un sencillo ejemplo. Nos arrodillamos para pedir perdón; para doblegar nuestro orgullo; para entregar nuestras lágrimas a Dios; para suplicar su intervención; para agradecerle un don recibido: es siempre el mismo gesto, que expresa esencialmente nuestra pequeñez ante Dios. Sin embargo, realizado en diferentes momentos de nuestra vida, modela nuestra profunda interioridad y posteriormente se manifiesta externamente en nuestra relación con Dios y con nuestros hermanos. Arrodillarse debe hacerse también con arte, es decir, con plena conciencia de su significado simbólico y de la necesidad que tenemos de expresar, mediante este gesto, nuestro modo de estar en presencia del Señor.
