



## Vicars's Corner



Happy Easter! Remember that Easter is a day, an octave, and a season. That is, Easter Sunday is the day of the Resurrection, but the same joy of Easter Day is extended in our worship throughout the eight days following (already past now) and indeed the 40 days to the Ascension and through the remaining nine to Pentecost. It's not too late to enjoy Easter in reflection, prayer, and feasting!

That said, we shouldn't let Easter joy blind us to hard realities. If it did, our joy wouldn't be wholly genuine. Easter joy - the confidence that comes from real faith in the Resurrection, the truth that Christ has overcome sin and death - should give us the fortitude to face real problems head-on. That's good, because our news media makes it hard to dodge bad news. For example, there have been no less than three tragic mass shootings recent-

ly at the time I write. Instead of new life, these tragedies display death in a horrible form. It's worth thinking about what's at stake here. I'd like to direct you to a thoughtful article by author, editor, and moralist R.R. Reno, written five years ago, but still sadly relevant. The article asks more questions rather than giving easy answers, but they're questions that need asking: https://www.firstthings.com/article/2018/04/permission-to-kill (A new article on a different topic begins halfway down the page - this piece I'm recommending is quite short and an easy read.) It doesn't seem like this problem is going to simply go away. It's worth thinking about what a specifically Catholic response is - what can we do to overcome a fragmented society where young people feel so alone they turn to violence? Christ is risen and death is defeated - the Lord invites us to participate in his victory by fostering a culture of life everywhere.

La alegría pascual -la confianza que proviene de la fe real en la Resurrección, la verdad de que Cristo ha vencido al pecado y a la muerte- debe darnos la fortaleza para afrontar los problemas reales de frente. Eso es bueno, porque nuestros medios de comunicación hacen que sea difícil esquivar las malas noticias. Por ejemplo, ha habido no menos de tres tiroteos masivos trágicos recientemente en el momento en que escribo. En lugar de una nueva vida, estas tragedias muestran la muerte en una forma horrible. Vale la pena pensar en lo que está en juego aquí. Me gustaría dirigirlo a un artículo reflexivo del autor, editor y moralista R.R. Reno, escrito hace cinco años, pero que sigue siendo lamentablemente relevante. El artículo hace más preguntas en lugar de dar respuestas fáciles, pero son preguntas que deben hacerse: https://www.firstthings.com/article/2018/04/permission-to-kill (Este artículo que recomiendo es bastante corto y fácil de leer). No parece que este problema vaya a desaparecer. Vale la pena pensar qué es una respuesta específicamente católica: ¿qué podemos hacer para superar una sociedad fragmentada donde los jóvenes se sienten tan solos que recurren a la violencia? Cristo resucitó y la muerte fue vencida: el Señor nos invita a participar de su victoria fomentando en todas partes una cultura de la vida.

#### 2nd Collection Next Week—Catholic Relief Services

The Catholic Relief Services Collection supports Catholic Church organizations that carry out international relief and solidarity efforts. Programs include relief and resettlement for victims of persecution, war, and natural disasters; development projects to improve living conditions for the poor; legal and support services for poor immigrants; peace and reconciliation work for people suffering from violence; and advocacy on behalf of the powerless.



#### **Addressing Gun Violence**

Quite horrifically, school (and other mass) shootings continue to occur in our country. The #1 cause of death for young people is now firearms. Community after community is decimated by these tragic acts, and families are forced to faced the worst nightmare imaginable. We stand in solidarity with these communities and call on all people to demand changes that will protect our children and all lives.

Last year, the USCCB strongly supported the Safer Communities Act. Upon it's passage, Archbishop Paul Coakley, chair of the USCCB Committee on Domestic Justice and Human Development, said, "I commend members of Congress for their work thus far and encourage them to continue working to confront the plague of gun violence in our nation."

They have also spoken out in support of extreme risk protection orders (ERPOs), banning assault weapons and bump stocks, limiting civilian access to high-capacity weapons and magazines, criminalizing gun trafficking, a more appropriate minimum age for gun ownership, and in favor of improvements on background checks.\*

We offer this call to action issued by Archbishop Schnurr last year after the Uvalde shooting.

"There have been too many school shootings, too much killing of the innocent. Our Catholic faith calls us to pray for those who have died and to bind the wounds of others, and we join our prayers along with the (broader) community... As we do so, each of us also needs to search our souls for ways that we can do more to understand this epidemic of evil and violence and implore our elected officials to help us take action."

We strongly encourage you to join this effort: seek out groups in the community who are mobilizing to protect children and all people and join their work. We must ALL step up and raise our voices for peace.



# "I HAVE EARNESTLY DESIRED:" EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS

(June 29th, 2022)





**56.** The priest lives his characteristic participation in the celebration in virtue of the gift received in the sacrament of Holy Orders, and this is expressed precisely in presiding. Like all the roles he is called to carry out, this is not primarily a duty assigned to him by the community but is rather a consequence of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit received in ordination which equips him for such a task. The priest also is formed by his presiding in the celebrating assembly. **57.** For this service to be well done — indeed, with art! — it is of fundamental importance that the priest have a keen awareness of being, through God's mercy, a particular presence of the risen Lord. The ordained minister is himself one of the types of presence of the Lord which render the Christian assembly unique, different from any other assembly. (cf. <u>Sacrosanctum Concilium</u>, n. 7) This fact gives "sacramental" weight (in the broad sense) to all the gestures and words of the one presiding. The assembly has the right to be able to feel in those gestures and words the desire that the Lord has, today as at the Last Supper, to eat the Passover with us. So, the risen Lord is in the leading role, and not our own immaturities, assuming roles and behaviours which are simply not appropriate. The priest himself should be overpowered by this desire for communion that the Lord has toward each person. It is as if he were placed in the middle between Jesus' burning heart of love and the heart of each of the faithful, which is the object of the Lord's love. To preside at Eucharist is to be plunged into the furnace of God's love. When we are given to understand this reality, or even just to intuit something of it, we certainly would no longer need a *Directory* that would impose the proper behaviour. If we have need of that, then it is because *of the hardness of our hearts*. The highest norm, and therefore the most demanding, is the reality itself of the Eucharistic celebration, which selects words, gestures, feelings that will make us und
