Happy Mothers' Day! I hope today is a blessed day for all mothers. First, though my Mom doesn't read our bulletins, I have to give her a public shout out! Thank you, Mom. She was not (and isn't...yet...) Catholic, but she was a wonderful example of what it means to be totally open to the call of the Lord, wherever that leads, and she lived her life totally for us. Everyone please say a "hail Mary" for my Mom today. (She's the mother of two priests and a future fighter pilot... so she needs it.) Thank you, Mom. I'd have to think about it before I said this "dogmatically," but here it is, I'm going to say it: motherhood is the highest human calling. It is certainly the calling for women. I don't mean that every woman has to become a biological mother. Certainly the greatest mother ever (sorry Mom, it's Mary) did not become a mother in the usual way. The woman that the whole modern world called "Mother" was never married and never gave birth to any children: Mother Teresa. Edith Stein, a German-Jewish philosopher who became a Carmelite Nun and was later martyred by the Nazis, (we know her as St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross) said this: "the woman's soul is fashioned as a shelter in which other souls may unfold." The way a mother bears a child in her womb bodily is in image for the way she's called to bear children in her heart and soul. Mary does that for us all - though her womb only bore one Child. Mothers give themselves totally to their children. They don't hold anything back. In this way, they're like God. The doctrine of the Trinity means that there's no part of God that's "just for himself." The Father is for the Son, and the Son for the Father in the Spirit. God doesn't (can't) hold anything back - it's his nature to give. I think of my own Mom and all the mothers I know as images of this. God is Love, and being a mother means being like that. Unlike God, you women can say "no" to this calling to love, but you can't do it and still be happy - it's written in your nature (if Edith Stein is right). "Throw nature out the door with a pitchfork," said Horace, "and she'll come back in by the window." We can't dodge who God made us to be, but we can cause ourselves and others a lot of suffering by trying. Our culture today says, "you can be happy however you want" to young men and women. It's a devilish lie. Motherhood teaches us that happiness comes through loving in the way God made us to love. Thank you, Mom, and thank you, every mother, for being living witnesses to that lesson.

¡Feliz día de la madre! Espero que hoy sea un día bendecido para todas las madres. Primero, aunque mi mamá no lee nuestros boletines, ¡tengo que saludarla públicamente! Gracias, mamá. Ella no era (y no es...todavía...) católica, pero fue un maravilloso ejemplo de lo que significa estar totalmente abierto al llamado del Señor, a donde sea que te lleve y vivió su vida totalmente para nosotros. Les pido que recen un "avemaría" por mi mamá hoy. (Ella es madre de dos sacerdotes y futura piloto de combate... así que lo necesita). Tendría que pensarlo antes de decir esto "dogmáticamente", pero aquí está, lo voy a decir: la maternidad es la más alta vocación humana. Sin duda es la vocación de las mujeres. No quiero decir que toda mujer tenga que convertirse en madre biológica. Ciertamente, la madre más grandiosa de todos los tiempos (lo siento mamá, es María) ella no se convirtió en madre de la manera habitual. La mujer que todo el mundo moderno llama "Madre" nunca se casó y nunca dio a luz a ningún hijo: la Madre Teresa. Edith Stein, una filósofa judía alemana que se convirtió en monja carmelita y luego fue martirizada por los nazis (la conocemos como Santa Teresa Benedicta de la Cruz) dijo esto: "el alma de la mujer está hecha como un refugio en el que otras almas puede desarrollarse". La forma en que una madre da a luz a un hijo en su vientre corporalmente es una imagen de la forma en que está llamada a dar a luz hijos en su corazón y en su alma. María hace eso por todos nosotros, aunque su vientre solo dio a luz a un Niño. Las madres se entregan totalmente a sus hijos. No se guardan nada. De esta manera, son como Dios. La doctrina de la Trinidad significa que no hay parte de Dios que sea "solo para él". El Padre es para el Hijo, y el Hijo para el Padre en el Espíritu. Dios no retiene nada (no puede), está en su naturaleza dar. Pienso en mi propia mamá y en todas las madres que conozco como imágenes de esto. Dios es Amor, y ser Madre es ser así. A diferencia de Dios, ustedes, las mujeres, pueden decir "no" a este llamado al amor, pero no pueden hacerlo y seguir siendo felices: está escrito en su naturaleza (si Edith Stein tiene razón). "Tira a la naturaleza por la puerta con una soga", dijo Horace, "y volverá a entrar por la ventana". No podemos eludir lo que Dios nos hizo ser, pero podemos causarnos mucho sufrimiento a nosotros mismos y a los demás si lo intentamos. Nuestra cultura actual dice, "puedes ser feliz como quieras" a hombres y mujeres jóvenes. Es una mentira diabólica. La maternidad nos enseña que la felicidad viene a través del amor en la forma en que Dios nos hizo amar. Gracias, mamá, y gracias a todas las madres por ser testigos vivos de esa lección.

EXCERPTS FROM THE APOSTOLIC LETTER OF POPE FRANCIS

(June 29th, 2022)

ON THE LITURGICAL FORMATION OF THE PEOPLE OF GOD



[61. In this letter I have wanted simply to share some reflections which most certainly do not exhaust the immense treasure of the celebration of the holy mysteries. I ask all the bishops, priests, and deacons, the formators in seminaries, the instructors in theological faculties and schools of theology, and all catechists to help the holy people of God to draw from what is the first wellspring of Christian spirituality. We are called continually to rediscover the richness of the general principles exposed in the first numbers of *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, grasping the intimate bond between this first of the Council's constitutions and all the others. For this reason we cannot go back to that ritual form which the Council fathers, *cum Petro et sub Petro*, felt the need to reform, approving, under the guidance of the Holy Spirit and following their conscience as pastors, the principles from which was born the reform. The holy pontiffs *St. Paul VI* and *St. John Paul II*, approving the reformed liturgical books *ex decreto Sacrosancti Œcumenici Concilii Vaticani II*, have guaranteed the fidelity of the reform of the Council. For this reason I wrote *Traditionis custodes*, so that the Church may lift up, in the variety of so many languages, one and the same prayer capable of expressing her unity. [23]

As I have already written, I intend that this unity be re-established in the whole Church of the Roman Rite.

62. I would like this letter to help us to rekindle our wonder for the beauty of the truth of the Christian celebration, to remind us of the necessity of an authentic liturgical formation, and to recognize the importance of an art of celebrating that is at the service of the truth of the Paschal Mystery and of the participation of all of the baptized in it, each one according to his or her vocation.

All this richness is not far from us. It is in our churches, in our Christian feasts, in the centrality of the Lord's Day, in the power of the sacraments we celebrate. Christian life is a continual journey of growth. We are called to let ourselves be formed in joy and in communion.

63. For this I desire to leave you with yet a further indication to follow along our way. I invite you to rediscover the meaning of the *liturgical year* and of the *Lord's Day*. Both of these were also left us by the Council. (Cf. *Sacrosanctum Concilium*, nn. 102-111)

64. In the light of all that we have said above, we see that the liturgical year is for us the possibility of growing in our knowledge of the mystery of Christ, immersing our life in the mystery of His Death and Resurrection, awaiting his return in glory. This is a true ongoing formation. Our life is not a random chaotic series of events, one following the other. It is rather a precise itinerary which, from one annual celebration of the His Death and Resurrection to the next, conforms us to Him, *as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ*. 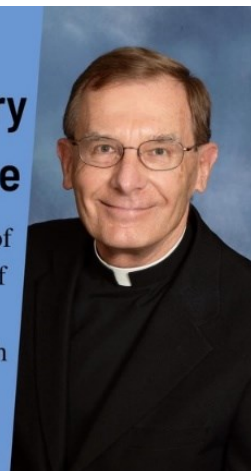

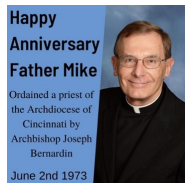
