



Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

This week the Church commemorates two feasts of the Cross - the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, and Our Lady of Sorrows, on September 14th and 15th. I'm sure we're all used to it by now, but occasionally, it should strike us as strange that we exalt the cross, celebrate Mary's sorrows, and for that matter, remember yearly the death of the saints with joy. All these things are backwards for the worldly-minded.

The Lord often repeats in the Gospels that anyone who desires to be His disciple - that is, to be a true Christian - must take up the cross and follow Him. The Letter to the Hebrews says, "let us also lay aside every weight and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God."

As Catholics we need to daily learn to despise the shame of the Cross - that is, we must prepare daily to endure the scorn of the world for the one who practices our faith. Some of the Church's teachings are embraced by the world, some are not. When we bear witness to the Church's unpopular teachings - on the sanctity of human life, the dignity of marriage, and the integrity of the family, for example - we will likely face ridicule. We should be glad of that. It's our chance to endure the cross and despise the shame. Let's pray that the Lord would exalt His Cross in us, through the intercession of Mary, Mother of Sorrows. ■

"Mass Moments"

The Responsorial Psalm

We often call the Responsorial Psalm the "response" to the First Reading. That's true, but it's really "responsorial" since it has a responsory—a refrain that occurs with each verse.

The psalm is indeed a response or a comment on the First Reading. In Ordinary Time, the Gospel text we hear falls in the Bible somewhere between last Sunday's Gospel passage and next Sunday's Gospel. The first reading leaps from some place in the Old Testament because its theme resembles the Gospel. The psalm echoes the reading we just heard. It's sort of a grandchild to Sunday's Gospel.

In the Book of Psalms, very few psalms have a refrain (e.g., Psalms 46 and 67). But on Sundays we treat them all alike. We give them refrains, and we put them in the mouths of our assemblies, often changing them into first person.

The refrains that appear in the lectionary, incidentally, are part of the official texts of the Mass. The verses are drawn from another translation. Refrains do not always match the wording in the verses.

We have quite a bit of freedom with the psalm. Since psalms were written as songs, the church urges us to sing them at every Mass. But because some assemblies struggle with new music, they can learn one or a few psalms for a whole season. Although easier to sing, their rapport with the first reading may suffer.

If we substitute, it's important to replace the psalm with a psalm. It's really not supposed to be a popular hymn, or even a song with a refrain that's drawn from, say, one of the epistles.

The reason has to do with how Christians use psalms. Jesus, a good Jew, surely prayed them daily. Many passages of the New Testament quote the psalms to show their fulfillment in the life of Christ. And they have proven useful for prayer in virtually every culture and age of history.

We also have freedom to change the structure of the psalm. It doesn't have to be responsorial. We can sing it all together, like a hymn.

Listen carefully to the first reading and figure out its connection to the psalm. Then we can really pray the psalm while we sing.





La Esquina del Vicario

Esta semana la Iglesia conmemora dos fiestas: la Exaltación de la Santa Cruz y Nuestra Señora de los Dolores, los días 14 y 15 de septiembre.

Estoy seguro de que ya todos estamos acostumbrados, pero de vez en cuando debe parecernos extraño que exaltemos la cruz, que celebremos los dolores de María. Y de hecho, que recordemos anualmente la muerte de los santos con alegría. Todas estas cosas son al revés para los de mentalidad mundana.

El Señor repite a menudo en los Evangelios que cualquiera que desee ser su discípulo, es decir, ser un verdadero cristiano, debe tomar la cruz y seguirlo. La Carta a los hebreos dice: "despojémonos también de todo peso y del pecado que nos asedia, y corramos con perseverancia la carrera que tenemos por delante, fijando los ojos en Jesús, el iniciador y consumidor de nuestra fe, quien para el gozo puesto delante de él sufrió la cruz, menospreciando el oprobio, y está sentado a la diestra del trono de Dios".

Como católicos debemos aprender diariamente a no tener vergüenza de la Cruz; es decir, debemos prepararnos diariamente para soportar el desprecio del mundo por aquel que practica nuestra fe. Algunas de las enseñanzas de la Iglesia son aceptadas por el mundo, otras no. Cuando damos testimonio de las impopulares enseñanzas de la Iglesia (sobre la santidad de la vida humana, la dignidad del matrimonio y la integridad de la familia, por ejemplo), probablemente nos enfrentaremos al ridículo. Mas Debemos alegrarnos de ello. Es nuestra oportunidad de llevar la cruz y despreciar la vergüenza. Oremos para que el Señor exalte Su Cruz en nosotros, por intercesión de María, Madre de los Dolores. ■
