

Vicar's Corner



This week I'd like to reflect on Christian Funerals. Sometimes people mistakenly call a funeral a "celebration of life" or a "remembrance." These are both important

aspects of grieving. In fact, we have a duty to keep alive the memory of our parents and grandparents. That duty certainly doesn't end at death!

However, honoring the memory of father and mother is not the essence of a funeral. The funeral is not about the past. The funeral is about the present, because it accompanies the deceased on the journey to the next life. It is about the future because it anticipates our hope of communion in Heaven.

This is especially true of the funeral Mass. The Catechism of the Catholic Church tells us: "...the Eucharist is the heart of the Paschal reality of Christian death. In the Eucharist, the Church expresses her efficacious communion with the departed: offering to the Father in the Holy Spirit the sacrifice of the death and resurrection of Christ, she asks to purify His child of his sins and their consequences, and to admit him to the Paschal fullness of the table of the Kingdom." According to the Catechism, the funeral Mass has two purposes. First, we pray that the soul of the deceased would be purified of sin, that is, we assist the departed through purgatory with our prayers. Second, we ask God to welcome the departed soul into heaven and express our hope in the resurrection. The funeral Mass is far from a backward glance on the past. We are people of hope!

"Mass Moments"

GLORY TO YOU, O LORD

When the priest or deacon announces the Gospel at Mass, the people respond, "Glory to you, O Lord." The response marks the tiniest change introduced in the revised English translation of the Mass. It inserts the word "O."

This brief dialogue serves two purposes—one practical, the other spiritual. The announcement tells the community which of the four Gospels provides today's excerpt. Spiritually, though, the people respond by glorifying the Lord. Their words acclaim Jesus Christ the Lord, who is about to speak to them through his word. The proclamation of the Gospel is a sacramental moment. Christ is present to his people. He is speaking to them. This is not a mere reading of an old book; it is a living proclamation of Christ's word to his people today.

For this reason, the people greet Christ before and after the Gospel: "Glory to you, O Lord," at the beginning, and "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ" at the end. They do not address the deacon or the priest who proclaims the Gospel. They address Jesus Christ, whose word they hear.

The word "0" appears in this acclamation. Some people were saying it all along. Others make a slight adjustment. Throughout the revised translation of the Missal, the word "0" has been inserted into prayers addressing "Lord" or "God" to soften the way we speak, to sound more humble, and to show respect for the one we are addressing. This happens most often in the prayers of the priest, but occasionally in the texts assigned to the people. When you respond, "Glory to you, O Lord," you are greeting Jesus Christ who is about to speak to you, and you show him respect with your word and vour heart.





Esta semana me gustaría reflexionar sobre los funerales cristianos. A veces la gente llama erróneamente a un funeral una "celebración de la vida" o un "recuerdo". Ambos son aspectos importantes del duelo.

De hecho, tenemos el deber de mantener viva la memoria de nuestros padres, abuelos y demás familiares. ¡Ese deber ciertamente no termina con la muerte!

Sin embargo, honrar la memoria del padre y de la madre no es la esencia de un funeral. El funeral no se trata del pasado. El funeral es el presente, porque acompaña al difunto en el viaje hacia la otra vida. Se trata del futuro porque anticipa nuestra esperanza de comunión en el Cielo.

Esto es especialmente cierto en el caso de la Misa funeraria. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica nos dice: "...la Eucaristía es el corazón de la realidad pascual de la muerte cristiana. En la Eucaristía, la Iglesia expresa su comunión eficaz con los difuntos: ofreciendo al Padre en el Espíritu Santo el sacrificio de la muerte y resurrección de Cristo, pide purificar a su hijo de sus pecados y de sus consecuencias, y admitirlo en la plenitud pascual de la mesa del Reino". Según el Catecismo, la Misa exequial tiene dos finalidades. Primero, orar para que el alma del difunto sea purificada del pecado, es decir, ayudamos al difunto a salir del purgatorio con nuestras oraciones. En segundo lugar, le pedimos a Dios que le dé la bienvenida al cielo, el alma del difunto y le exprese nuestra esperanza en la resurrección. La misa fúnebre está lejos de ser una mirada retrospectiva al pasado. ¡Somos Personas de Esperanza!




