

Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

Next Saturday is the Men's Eucharistic procession in downtown Cincinnati. I attended it every year I could during seminary, and while I have other obligations on Saturday mornings these days, I'd be there if I could. It's about a two-mile Eucharistic procession through downtown Cincinnati, from our Cathedral to beautiful Old St. Mary's Church in Over the Rhine. It's grown every year - last year I believe attendance was over 500 men. I highly encourage all men of every age to head down for the procession. You'll see details posted on our church bulletin boards and in our bulletin.

For one and all, this procession is a sign of hope. It's not the only one. There are men's groups, family activities, women's societies, and more springing up across our archdiocese. Our very own "Second Sunday" event is one of these "signs of hope." Thriving young-adult groups and revived campus ministry programs at Miami, UC, and Wright State are another sign of hope. Our seminary is the largest it's been in decades. More parishes are offering perpetual adoration, or at least adoration for an extended time weekly. Most of these great things are spearheaded by active laypeople, who are embracing their baptismal vocations - they're part of a grassroots movement. The Church is alive!

If your experience of our local Church misses this exuberance, it can be a little disheartening - but that might just be a sign that you're the one to bring some new vigor to your corner of our family of parishes. This week's gospel is all about invitation. Through all these signs of life, the Lord is inviting us to shake off our lethargy and join the renewal. Think about how you might help others see the joy of the gospel. ■

"Mass Moments"

For Us Men

During the recitation of the Nicene Creed, when we profess our belief in the mission of our Lord Jesus Christ, we say that he came down from heaven "for us men." Everyone rejoices that Christ came for our salvation, but many English-speakers have objected that the words "for us men" sound gender-exclusive. It is not our belief that Jesus came for the salvation of males alone; he came for the salvation of men, women, and children.

Before the revised English translation was finalized, the bishops of the English-speaking world voted for these words to say simply "for us." The context would have made it clear that the words referred to everyone. However, the Vatican reinserted the word "men."

At issue is a subtle, but important theological point. The phrase in Latin is propter nos homines. In Latin, the word homines refers to males and females. A few lines later, the singular form of the same word is used for the incarnation: homo factus est. We say that Jesus "became man," but the Latin word is gender-neutral. The proximity of the words homines and homo expresses our belief that Jesus became what he came to save. Without a word like "men," the relationship between the incarnation and salvation is not as clear. Other words don't work as well: "people," "humans," or "flesh"—none of these fits both phrases.

No solution handles all the issues. Other modern languages—Spanish, French, German, and Italian, for example—use the plural and singular forms of the same word. It seems that, for the sake of uniformity, the Vatican desired the same solution in English.

This will not silence the objections that the phrase sounds gender-exclusive. Some Catholics will still probably omit the word "men" in order to make another important belief clear: Jesus came for us all.
