

Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

This Advent, I intend to share some classics from the saints instead of my own thoughts. I can assure you that the column will be none the worse. We begin with St. John

Henry Newman, who teaches us what it is to watch for Christ: "Now I consider this word watching, first used by our Lord, is a remarkable word, remarkable because the idea is not so obvious as might appear at first sight. We are not simply to believe, but to watch; not simply to love, but to watch; not simply to obey, but to watch; to watch for what? for that great event, Christ's coming. Most of us have a general idea what is meant by believing, fearing, loving, and obeying; but perhaps we do not contemplate or apprehend what is meant by watching.

And I conceive it is one of the main points, which, in a practical way, will be found to separate the true and perfect servants of God from the multitude called Christians. True Christians, whoever they are, watch, and inconsistent Christians do not. Now what is watching?

I conceive it may be explained as follows: —Do you know the feeling of expecting a friend, expecting him to come, and he delays? Do you know what it is to be in unpleasant company, and to wish for the time to pass away? Do you know what it is to have a friend in a distant country, to expect news of him, and to wonder from day to day what he is now doing, and whether he is well? Do you know what it is so to live upon a person who is present with you, that your eyes follow his, that you read his soul, that you see all its changes in his countenance, that you anticipate his wishes, that you smile in his smile? To watch for Christ is a feeling such as all these.

This then is to watch; to be detached from what is present, and to live in what is unseen; to live in the thought of Christ as He came once, and as He will come again; to desire His second coming, from our affectionate and grateful remembrance of His first." - John Henry Newman, Parochial and Plain Sermons, Vol. IV – from Newmanreader.org (edited for brevity).

Rorate Mass

This year we'll observe a special Advent tradition, the Rorate (pronounced ro-rah-tay) Mass. This Mass takes its name from the entrance antiphon that starts it off - Rorate caeli... "drop down dew, you heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain down the Just One." This Mass in celebrated in a dark, candle-lit church and begins before dawn, so that the consecration (when the offerings of bread and wine are consecrated as the Body and Blood of Christ) occurs about the same moment as sunrise - Christ is the light of the world: waiting for His coming, we wait for the true dawn. The Mass will include some traditional elements of Catholic worship like Gregorian chant in Latin. It's a very beautiful tradition please come to enjoy it. Time and Date: 7:15 am, Saturday, December 9th Location: St. Joseph Church Note: No 8 am Mass this day - adoration and confessions will start after Mass and proceed until 9:30 as usual.

Advent Wreath

An Advent wreath symbolizes our longing for the coming of Christ. The wreath is a circle of evergreen branches into which are set four candles. Traditionally three candles are violet and one is rose, but four violet or four white candles may also be used.

The wreath symbolizes many things. Evergreens signify God's enduring promise of redemption, evident like green branches in the midst of snow. The circle signifies our hope for the return of Christ, whose Kingdom will have no end. The colors of the candles match the traditional colors of the vesture for the four Sundays of Advent. Violet garments signify our penitent hope for salvation. The rose color, which may be worn on Advent's Third Sunday, signals that the season is nearly over—joy is at hand!

The wreath's most luminous symbol is its growing light. One candle is lit on the First Sunday of Advent, two on the Second, three on the Third and all four on the Fourth. In the northern hemisphere, Advent comes at a time when the days decrease to their shortest length. As the hours of darkness increase, we light more candles on the wreath. The wreath, which symbolizes the coming of Christ, grows in intensity as the anniversary of Jesus' birth draws near.

The Advent wreath may be used at home or at church. It should be blessed on the First Sunday of Advent after the homily at one Mass, at evening prayer Saturday night, or during a prayer service including biblical readings and Advent songs. At home, a family member can bless the wreath. It may be lit during the evening meal, to remind everyone of the true meaning of this holy season.

Advent Wreath Week 1 Prayer: O God, who ask us to be watchful and alert because we do not know when you will come, let this candle give us light and help us stay awake. At those times when you ask us to act, give us strength to respond at once. Through Christ our Lord.



Este Adviento tengo la intención de compartir algunos clásicos de los santos en lugar de mis propios pensamientos. Puedo asegurarles que la columna no empeorará. Comenzamos con San John Henry Newman, quien nos enseña lo que es velar por Cristo:

"Ahora considero que esta palabra velar, usada por primera vez por nuestro Señor, es una palabra notable, notable porque la idea no es tan obvia como podría parecer a primera vista. No debemos simplemente creer, sino observar; no simplemente amar, sino observar; no simplemente obedecer, sino observar; ¿Observar qué? para ese gran evento, la venida de Cristo. La mayoría de nosotros tenemos una idea general de lo que significa creer, temer, amar v obedecer; pero tal vez no contemplamos ni aprendemos lo que se entiende por observar.

Y creo que es uno de los puntos principales que, de manera práctica, separará a los verdaderos y perfectos siervos de Dios de la multitud llamada cristianos. Los verdaderos cristianos, sean quienes sean, observan, y los cristianos inconsistentes, no. ¿Ahora qué está mirando?

Supongo que se puede explicar de la siguiente manera: Conoces el sentimiento de esperar un amigo, esperar que venga y se demora? ¿Sabes lo que es estar en compañía desagradable y desear que pase el tiempo? ¿Sabes lo que es tener un amigo en un país lejano, esperar noticias suyas y preguntarte día a día qué está haciendo ahora v si se encuentra bien? ¿Sabes lo que es vivir con una persona que está presente contigo, que tus ojos siguen los suyos, que lees su alma, que ves todos sus cambios en su rostro, que te anticipas a sus deseos, que sonríes en ¿su sonrisa? Velar por Cristo es un sentimiento como todos estos.
