

#### Vicar's Corner

Fr. Edward Hoffmann

Early February marks about four months since a supposed right to abortion was enshrined in our state's Constitution. Unfortunately, as I think about how I've reacted, I'm afraid I've

already settled into a kind of resignation about the whole thing. In the weeks following the election, we shared some real sorrow over what happened. Four months later, I'm afraid many of us have just "moved on." I'm not suggesting that sorrow should dampen our Christian joy. Interestingly, joy and sorrow are not opposites of each other. Both are opposite to apathy. Apathy is the real enemy to joy, and I'm afraid so many of us live most of our lives in a kind of apathy. The early Christians were motivated by a zeal that came from true charity - we hear about that zeal in both the gospel and the second reading of Sunday's Mass. For them, apathy, the refusal to suffer with others, was the paradigmatic pagan vice. Genuine compassion, the willingness to suffer with and for others in imitation of Christ, was the distinctly Christian virtue.

This spring Queen of Peace parishioner Sarah Kissel and others are running a second 40 Days for Life campaign. Like the campaign last fall, it's an invitation to pray outside the local abortion facility, to take action in the local community, and to fast for an end to abortion. It's an invitation to shake off apathy and embrace the sorrow and the joy of genuine Christianity through prayer, fasting, and works of mercy. It's important to note that praying outside the abortion facility does not require stopping people, waving a sign, or doing anything confrontational. If you're standing in prayerful silence, people know why you're there. Statistics show that this mute witness is powerful in influencing people against having an abortion. By recognizing the reality of the child in the womb, simply being there is a silent but powerful act of compassion.

#### Feb. 4: Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time:

In the Gospel today, we find that Jesus would rise very early before dawn and go to a deserted place to pray and then he went out to preach and to heal.

Please pray for the poor and suffering, knowing that you are bringing the love and peace of Jesus to those who live in fear and doubt, loneliness and dread.

#### **Preface Dialogue**

The Eucharistic Prayer of every Mass begins with a three-part dialogue between the priest and the people. He issues a greeting, urging them to lift their hearts and give thanks. The people affirm each phrase. This dialogue entered the liturgy by the fourth century to introduce the prayer that evolved into Eucharistic Prayer II. It solemnly begins the Church's most solemn prayer.

You also hear a phrase like "The Lord be with you" at the start of Mass, before the Gospel, and in the preparation for Communion. That formula probably originated in the Preface dialogue and then entered broader usage to alert worshipers that something important was about to happen.

In the second part of the dialogue, the priest invites the people to lift up their hearts. They respond, "We lift them up to the Lord." An early English translation used the past tense: "We have lifted them up to the Lord," but people are to do this action right now. A literal translation of the Latin would be more like, "We hold them before the Lord." The dialogue asks us to become wholly present to God to prepare for what follows.

The priest then gives this explicit direction: "Let us give thanks to the Lord our God." During the Eucharistic Praver. consecration will take place, and people will pause for adoration, but its overall purpose is to give thanks to God. For many years people responded, "It is right to give him thanks and praise," but the historical response uses fewer words: "It is right and just." In the dialogue, priest and people inaugurate the Eucharistic Prayer, they lift their hearts to God, and they begin to do what it is right to do: give thanks.



A principios de febrero se cumplen unos cuatro meses desde que se consagró un supuesto derecho al aborto en la Constitución de nuestro estado. Desafortunadamente, cuando pienso en cómo reaccioné, me temo que ya me he

adaptado a una especie de resignación ante todo el asunto. En las semanas posteriores a las elecciones, compartimos un verdadero dolor por lo sucedido. Cuatro meses después, me temo que muchos de nosotros simplemente hemos "seguido adelante". No estoy sugiriendo que el dolor deba apagar nuestro gozo cristiano. Curiosamente, la alegría y la tristeza no son opuestos entre sí. Ambos son opuestos a la apatía. La apatía es el verdadero enemigo de la alegría y me temo que muchos de nosotros vivimos la mayor parte de nuestras vidas en una especie de apatía. Los primeros cristianos estaban motivados por un celo que provenía de la verdadera caridad; escuchamos sobre ese celo tanto en el evangelio como en la segunda lectura de la misa dominical. Para ellos, la apatía, la negativa a sufrir con los demás, era el vicio pagano paradigmático. La compasión genuina, la voluntad de sufrir con y por los demás a imitación de Cristo, era la virtud distintivamente cristiana.

Esta primavera, una feligresa de la iglesia Reina de la Paz, Sarah Kissel, y otras personas llevarán a cabo una segunda campaña de 40 Días por la Vida. Al igual que la campaña del otoño pasado, es una invitación a orar fuera del centro de aborto local, a actuar en la comunidad local y a ayunar por el fin del aborto. Es una invitación a sacudirnos la apatía y abrazar el dolor y el gozo del cristianismo genuino a través de la oración, el ayuno y las obras de misericordia. Es importante señalar que orar fuera del centro de abortos no significa tener que detener a la gente, agitar un cartel o hacer algo de confrontación. Si estás en silencio y en oración, la gente sabrá por qué estás allí. Las estadísticas muestran que este testigo mudo es poderoso para influir en las personas contra el aborto. Al reconocer la realidad del niño en el útero, el simple hecho de estar allí es un acto de compasión silencioso pero poderoso.

#### ¿Oué es la Cuaresma?

La Cuaresma es un tiempo litúrgico de conversión que se centra en tres pilares espirituales: la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. Durante los 40 días de Cuaresma, se nos exhorta a la reflexión, a realizar actos de caridad y hacer pequeños sacrificios como modo de preparación para la celebración alegre de la resurrección de Cristo el Domingo de Pascua.

La Cuaresma dura 40 días en alusión a los 40 años que pasó el pueblo de Israel en el desierto con Moisés y los 40 días que pasó Jesús en el desierto antes de iniciar su vida pública. La Cuaresma comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza (una fecha que cambia cada año), y va hasta la Semana Santa, conocida también como la "Semana Mayor". Al tiempo de Cuaresma y a la Semana Santa le sigue el triduo pascual (Jueves Santo, Viernes Santo y Sábado de Gloria), tiempo en el que conmemoramos la pasión, muerte y resurrección de Nuestro Señor llegando hasta el Domingo de Pascua.
