

Vicar's Corner

"Man has nature whacked" someone once told C.S. Lewis in wonderful British slang. The remark typifies an attitude we modern people have about the world. Scientific progress, we believe, means that we take control of nature and find more and

more freedom. "Taking control of nature," though, often means "taking control of other human beings."

The furor over the recent ruling on IVF (in vitro fertilization) in Alabama is a great case in point. On the surface, IVF sounds like a great thing - it's a way to help people have a child who perhaps couldn't otherwise. Parents who put off having children for one reason or another can have them later in life when they're "ready." It gives parents greater control over their own lives. Technical prowess that gives freedom and autonomy! "Man has nature whacked" - perhaps.

Actually, some men have others "whacked." The expensive IVF process conceives "embryos" (children!) that are often not as viable as naturally conceived children. As a result, IVF clinics conceive several (5, give or take) children in the lab, and pick the "best" one to implant in the mother's womb. The others are frozen - now the property of the IVF clinic. If all goes well, the child who's eventually born is the result of artificial selection for viability or other desirable traits. Meanwhile, the child's siblings remain frozen (there are over a million embryos frozen - still viable, if adopted). "Man's dominion over nature" turns out to be dominion over other human beings, so that they can be manipulated to be available how and when others want them. The Church catches a lot of flack for her teachings on abortion, contraception, and IVF. Put simply, though, those teachings express the fundamental truth that human beings - even, or especially vulnerable ones like the unborn - should never be simply used as means to other people's happiness.

When Pontius Pilate had Christ scourged and dragged before the hostile crowd, he said "behold the man." The remark said more than lies on the surface. Pilate meant, "this is what man is. This miserable beaten creature is who we really are - nothing more." It was a cynical remark - but it contained more truth than he knew. Man is most himself when out of generous love he relinquishes power out of sacrificial love. May the Son of Man, Jesus Christ, teach us what being truly human really means.

(My argument in this piece was lifted from The Abolition of Man, a little book by C.S. Lewis that offers profound reflection on these and related issues.) ■

Mass Moments

Melchizedek

When an alliance of kings attacked the area surrounding Sodom (Genesis 14), their warriors kidnapped Lot, Abram's nephew, and stole his property. Abram mounted an army of 318 trained soldiers, conquered the enemy, and brought back Lot, his family, and his property. The king of Salem. a priest named Melchizedek, brought out bread and wine and blessed Abram and his God.

From this little story came a big name that Christians sometimes hear in their public prayer. The reason has to do with the New Testament Letter to the Hebrews, which presents Melchizedek in its treatment of Psalm 110. The psalm recalls the event from Genesis by naming Israel's king a priest forever, like Melchizedek. The Letter to the Hebrews applies this image to Christ, calling him God's eternal high priest (5:10; 6:20; 7:15-22). Hebrews further points out that Melchizedek means "king of righteousness" and that "king of Salem" means "king of peace" (7:1-3), both images of Jesus' ministry. Furthermore. Melchizedek appeared in the Book of Genesis without parents or descendants, making his mysterious arrival and departure a symbol of Jesus.

From the earliest centuries of Christianity, the bread and wine that Melchizedek offered were thought to foreshadow the Eucharist. This is one reason why the first Eucharistic Prayer includes the prayer that God will accept the offerings, "as once you were pleased to accept the offering of your high priest Melchizedek, a holy sacrifice, a spotless victim."

Christians, then, see in the story from Genesis themes that prefigure our belief in the eternity of Christ, his mission of peace and righteousness, and the offering of the Eucharist.





La Esquina del Vicario

"El hombre ha derrotado a la naturaleza," alguien lo dijo una vez a C.S. Lewis. El comentario tipifica una actitud que tenemos la gente moderna sobre el mundo. Creemos que el progreso científico significa que tomamos el control de la naturaleza y

encontramos cada vez más libertad. Sin embargo, "tomar el control de la naturaleza" a menudo significa "tomar el control de otros seres humanos."

El furor por el reciente fallo sobre la FIV (fertilización in vitro) en Alabama es un buen ejemplo de ello. A primera vista, la FIV parece una gran cosa: es una forma de ayudar a las personas a tener un hijo que tal vez no podrían tenerlo de otra manera. Los padres que posponen tener hijos por una razón u otra pueden tenerlos más adelante en la vida, cuando estén "listos". Les da a los padres un mayor control sobre sus propias vidas. ¡Proeza técnica que da libertad y autonomía! "El hombre ha derrotado a la naturaleza," tal vez.

En realidad, algunos hombres hacen "golpear" a otros. El costoso proceso de FIV concibe "embriones" (¡niños!) que a menudo no son tan viables como los niños concebidos naturalmente. Como resultado, las clínicas de FIV conciben varios (5, más o menos) niños en el laboratorio y eligen el "mejor" para implantarlo en el útero de la madre. Los demás están congelados y ahora son propiedad de la clínica de FIV. Si todo va bien, el niño que finalmente nazca es el resultado de una selección artificial de viabilidad u otros rasgos deseables. Mientras tanto, los hermanos del niño permanecen congelados (hay más de un millón de embriones congelados, que aún son viables si se adoptan). "El dominio del hombre sobre la naturaleza" resulta ser un dominio sobre otros seres humanos, de modo que pueden ser manipulados para estar disponibles cómo y cuándo otros quieran. La Iglesia recibe muchas críticas por sus enseñanzas sobre el aborto, la anticoncepción y la FIV. Sin embargo, en pocas palabras, esas enseñanzas expresan la verdad fundamental de que los seres humanos -incluso los especialmente vulnerables como los no nacidos- nunca deben ser utilizados simplemente como medios para la felicidad de otras personas.

Cuando Poncio Pilato hizo azotar y arrastrar a Cristo ante la multitud hostil, dijo "he aquí el hombre". El comentario decía más que mentiras en la superficie. Pilato quiso decir: "Esto es lo que es el hombre. Esta miserable criatura derrotada es lo que realmente somos, nada más". Fue un comentario cínico, pero contenía más verdad de la que él sabía. El hombre es más él mismo cuando por amor generoso renuncia al poder por amor sacrificial. Que el Hijo del Hombre, Jesucristo, nos enseñe lo que realmente significa ser verdaderamente humano.
