

Father Rick's Reflections . . .



I found this reflection for us on the Trinity from "Living Liturgy 2022."

"Every time we bless ourselves, we mark our bodies with the sign of the cross and name the Three Persons, but does anything of their mystery plow its significance into our hearts? At the beginning of our Christian lives, at baptism, we are named for them; at the beginning and end of each Eucharist we sign ourselves with their memory; when our bodies are signed in death, we hope they claim us; when we bless our children, we remember the creativity the trinity shares with us. All these moments of naming the Trinity are occasions of life and love. When we are blessed "in the name of," we are incorporated into the personal history of the one named. The sign of the cross and the invocation of the Trinity, a prayer of gesture and words that we learned in childhood, are a simple yet profound statement that we belong to the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and are called to live in communion with them.

"In our short reading from John's gospel, part of the Last

Supper discourse, Jesus speaks about the Spirit, the great encourager, who will enable future communities of believers to have access to him and his Father after he is no longer with them in the flesh. For the Spirit there are no limitations of one place, one moment in history, one gathering of disciples. The Spirit gives the church a future and a hope. When Christians communities encounter new ecclesial, social, and global challenges, the Spirit enables past, present, and future to converge. The past and privileged words of Jesus will be remembered, but the Spirit will "pluck the strings of memory" so that a new melody is played, a new meaning will sound in the present context, and this song at the heart of the Church will accompany disciples into the future.

"The Spirit guides the teaching, interpretation, and witness of the church throughout the ages. It also places a great responsibility on those whose mission is to spark a creative conversation between believers and the words of Jesus, especially those who, week after week, break open the Scriptures in the homily. Likewise, each member of the assembly has a responsibility to enter into that conversation with openness to the Spirit.

"Theology has developed a word to describe the dynamic relationship between the Persons of the Trinity and the community of believers – "perichoresis" or "dance." in this metaphorical language, the Trinity is a partnership of encircling and

embracing, a graceful movement of loving attentiveness into which we are invited as partners who must, in our turn, draw others into the dance our loving outreach to them. With the imagery of the dance, we cannot think of God as solitary.

"Theology, preaching, metaphor may all help toward gaining some understanding of who and what we celebrate on this feast, but perhaps it is again the poet who has the insight to realize that it is only in the communion of death – when we are drawn into the community of those who the poet George Herbert calls the "the unnumbered Three" – that we will truly see and understand because it is only then, in death, that the dust we are will be transformed. No longer will it blow into our eyes to blind us, but it will become a seeing dust that sparkles with a revelation of the mystery of the Three in our mutually unveiled presence."

With the summer months, we have lots of comings and goings. We welcome back Fr Kevin from his retreat this week. We bid "bon voyage" to Sr. Ann as she heads to her provincial house in Reading, PA for her community's chapter. Please keep her and her community in prayer for the next three weeks. Now that school is out, many families are off for summer vacations and travel. Please be careful traveling and enjoy the summer.

The Most Holy Trinity

First Reading: Proverbs 8:22-31

The book of Proverbs is mostly a collection of wise sayings to help people live a good life. Today's passage from Proverbs, however, is a hymn to Wisdom which in the Old Testament is sometimes symbolically described as a person coming from God.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

Paul's letter to the Romans is his most detailed and important theological work. The Church chose this brief passage to be read on Trinity Sunday because, in these five verses, all three person of the trinity are mentioned.

Gospel Reflection: John 16:12-15

All three person of the Trinity are mentioned in this gospel. To Jesus, the Holy Spirit is the Spirit of Truth, whose work is to bring God's truth to us. Truth is not humanity's creation, it is god's gift. Truth is something already waiting to be discovered. This discovery is our continual invitation, a continual opening and receiving the meaning of Jesus. The nearer we live in the ways and word of Jesus, the better we will know him—the more we become like him.

For your reflection: How does the image of the fruit tree help you understand the Trinity: The Father is the root, the Son is a branch, and the Spirit is the fruit.

If you don't talk and more importantly, listen, to God every day, how else will you know what He is calling you to do? This is best done in silence, when you can hear His response.



Retirement for diocesan priests is much different. They continue to serve - in a variety of ways.

Some serve as sacramental ministers for parishes that do not have full-time priests. Others step in when an "active priest" is ill or away. They often continue presiding at Masses, celebrating sacraments, teaching, offering counsel and faithfully supporting parishioners well into their retirement years.

But, despite their continuing service, unlike most retired people, retired priests no longer receive a portion of their previous salary or benefits. When they answered the call from Christ to become a priest, they also placed their faith in God that He would provide for them in their later years.

The Catholic Diocese of Saginaw Priests' Retirement Fund provides a pension to our priests after they retire from full-time ministry. This special collection builds funds for *priests who are currently retired and for those who will retire in the future.*

Your gift to the Priests' Retirement Fund is your way to support those who have served, and continue to serve, you and your parish family.

Your gift goes directly to the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw's priests' pension plan, where it is invested and held in a trust account, which is administered by the Michigan Catholic Conference.



A retired priest is no longer paid a salary or provided housing by a parish. He has to provide for himself, and the pension provided by the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw Priests' Retirement Fund is a major source of income.
