

A Message from Fr. Matt ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Have you ever noticed that I have a very crooked middle finger on my right hand? I know that I have pointed it out in the past, but some of you whom I haven't known long, you may not have noticed. Now don't get distracted looking for it during Mass! It is crooked because of football

and probably some genetics. It is one of the main reasons that I don't think I will ever be Pope! That, along with the fact that I am not holy enough, smart enough or talented enough!



When my dad retired as an orthopedic surgeon

a number of years ago, we had a party. At the party, one of his partners saw my finger, grabbed my hand and said, "Matt, we can fix stuff like this!" I explained to him that I had shown my finger to my dad and he noted that it was healing crookedly. But my dad asked me, "Does it hurt?" It didn't. He asked me to make a fist and I could. My dad said, "You're fine." You know how they say that plumbers always have leaky pipes in their own houses? Well, I guess orthopedic surgeons' kids have crooked fingers!

That came into my head as I looked at the Readings this week, as our Readings focus on healing. We could say that the Readings focus on leprosy, right? The First Reading has instructions for when a person in a community has leprosy, and in the Gospel there is a man with leprosy. But did you notice that he isn't following the instructions of the First Reading? He isn't crying out "Unclean! Unclean!" He isn't staying away from others. He comes directly

to Jesus. And Jesus heals him. So in some ways the Readings are about leprosy, but Jesus isn't. Jesus is about the person and Jesus heals what needs healing.

The first healing that Jesus gives the man is even before the leprosy is gone. Jesus listens to him. He doesn't run away. He doesn't correct. He listens, because he can see the whole person, not just the sickness. The second way Jesus heals him is that He touches the man. Can you imagine how long it had been since this man had had any physical contact from another person? His physical isolation needed healing and so Jesus gave him what he needed. At this point Jesus could have waved his hand and healed the man, but he doesn't. The man with leprosy already had faith. He already had confidence in Jesus. That part of him didn't

need healing, so Jesus let it ride. All of this is done before what we would call the moment of healing. So there are many moments of healing in this passage. But Jesus only healed what was needed.

This week we start Lent and I want to encourage you to come to Jesus and ask Him to heal in you what needs healing. Call to mind the wounds in your heart that need healed, the parts of our lives, families and community that maybe need some rebuilding. Place it all before Jesus with trust, with faith, and let Him do His work. Believe that He will do it. But remember, Jesus knows more than you. He may leave a few crooked fingers in your life. Just trust that if he doesn't heal it, then you don't need it.

Does it hurt? Can you make a fist? You're fine.

IMPORTANT INFO FOR ASH WEDNESDAY

Ash Wednesday services on **February 17** will be different this year due to pandemic health guidelines. The sign of the cross with ashes on the forehead is eliminated and instead each person <u>WILL HAVE ASHES SPRINKLED ON TOP OF THEIR HEAD</u>. Registration is required for Ash Wednesday services by **Monday, February 15** at 3pm. Call 724-445-3713 X0 or email *registration@saintclareparish.com*.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fast and abstinence. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The obligation of abstinence (refraining from eating meat) begins at age 14. The law of fasting (limiting oneself to one full meal and two lighter meals) obliges all between the ages of 18-59. Individuals who have a medical condition in which fasting may be considered harmful are not obliged to fast, but can consider an act of penance or charity.

ONE CALL NOW UPDATING SYSTEM

Saint Clare Parish has purchased a subscription to One Call Now, a messaging service, which will allow the Parish to send text messages, emails, and phone calls with updates about important information. It is understandable that people do not like receiving robocalls similar to this, but there are numerous benefits. Not everyone has a computer to access the website or receive emails, but everyone does have a phone. Telephone numbers associated with the parish census will be used. 


