

A Message from Fr. Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Easter! This Lent has flown by for me. I can't believe the great Feast of our Salvation is here already. I don't know why Lent seemed to go so fast. I guess because so much of it was new and different. I am so happy to celebrate Easter with you. I feel like the luckiest, most blessed person in the world to have the assignments that I have. You show such faith, hope and love. You are an inspiration to me. Thanks for opening your hearts to me and to Fr. Lou, Fr. Jim, and Fr. Ward. We love you a lot. Thanks for loving us and being patient with us.

I have a friend who is a pastor at a non-denominational Christian church. We met during my first assignment in Wexford. He is a good pastor and a good man. We were walking through our church one time and he looked up at the Crucifix and said to me, "That is something that I will never understand." I thought he was talking about the amazing love that Jesus showed by dying on the Cross for us. So I said, "That is love beyond all telling." He said, "No. I mean I will never understand why you guys have the body still hanging on the Cross. Aren't Christians supposed to be Easter people? You don't ever let anyone stop thinking about Good Friday."

Does he have a point? Aren't we supposed to be Easter people? Well, yes. Easter is a wonderful part of who we are. But, what does Easter mean without Good Friday? I think one of the coolest things about being Catholic is the three days that we call The Triduum. On Holy Thursday we begin Mass like we always do with a Sign of the Cross. But have you ever noticed that we don't end Holy Thursday with the Sign of the Cross, like we would every Mass? Do you know why? Because the Mass isn't over. On Good Friday we don't begin the service with the Sign of the Cross because it is a continuation of what we began the night before. Same with the Easter Vigil. The Sign of the Cross only comes at the end of the Easter Vigil. We do this because The Triduum, Holy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, are one, huge, three-day long, cannot-be-separated, solemn remembrance and celebration. Do you see what the Lord and His Church are teaching us here? We are not just an Easter people because you cannot separate Easter from Good Friday and Holy Thursday. Passion, Death and Resurrection. Any of them on their own do not make sense or have full meaning. We are not merely an Easter people. We are a Triduum people!




To me, that says our God is real! He isn't some "Don't worry. Be happy" God! That's not real. God knows that we have suffering, and He says to us in The Triduum that our suffering has meaning. God knows that things can be hard, but says that the tough stuff can help us to see the good stuff. This isn't a day for empty celebration. Today is a day to celebrate that we are alive, and life isn't easy but there is reason to hope. If for no other reason, because our God isn't distant and absent. Our God hurts with us, is abandoned like we are sometimes, is betrayed by those He loves. Our God dies with us and rises to tell us there is so much more to the story. Behold, He makes all things new! Our God is the realest!

Today, I hope that you celebrate. I hope you know that you have a reason to celebrate! Christ is risen from the dead. Christ is Crucified out of love for you. Christ's Body is broken and blood is poured out for you. Christ humbles Himself to be your servant so that you might be encouraged to serve others. None of these things on their own is a suitable answer, but together they are the only answer we need.

Keep these three - the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Jesus - always together in your heart because our God is real. He knows they are together in our lives. Be a Triduum person! May you have the most meaningful Easter ever!
