A Message from Fr. Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

I have said before that I was taught in Seminary that if a word is repeated in the Readings, this means we should pay special attention to it. Usually, a word is repeated twice or maybe three times. But, in our Readings this week there is a word that is repeated 13 times, if you count the Alleluia verse! Do you know what it is? Remain.



What does the word "remain" mean? When I hear it, I think of being on a plane and hearing the announcement, "Please remain in your seats until the captain has turned off the fasten seat belt sign." So Jesus is saying, "Hey everyone, just sit there. Remain in your seats and you will be my disciple." But that doesn't seem right. Maybe they should have used another word? Actually, no. Remain, if we understand it correctly, is a perfect word for what Jesus is telling us today.

Remain is a word that came to English through Old French and Latin. It is not a passive word. The prefix "re" signifies action. It is about doing something. We hear Jesus say, "Remain in me as I remain in you." He is not saying sit there and look at each other. He is not saying, "Keep your seats." That is not at all what He is saying. The word "remain" means to endure, to hold on, to keep going even though it is hard. To fight, to love, to struggle, to get pruned and to keep going, to keep faith in Jesus. This is what Jesus means by "remain". St. John says in the Second Reading that those who keep His Commandments "remain in Him". That sounds pretty active. So, no, today Jesus does not ask us to stay in our seats. In fact, he is telling us the opposite.

Fr. Larry Richards says that the reason we struggle to understand these Readings is that we have become fans of Jesus rather than disciples. Fans sit in their seats and watch. Disciples remain, endure, struggle, put others first, and love. They act. Look at St. Paul in the First Reading. The disciples fear him and don't accept him, but he keeps faith with Jesus. St. Barnabas encourages him and he endures, he keeps going. St. Paul wasn't merely a fan of Jesus, he was a disciple. Paul didn't just sit in his seat, he remained with Jesus.

Today Jesus is calling on us to remain in Him. In fact it is said 13 times! Remain is a word that can cause confusion, because we think it means that we should just stay in our seats, but it doesn't. Jesus is asking us to be daring, to hold on, to keep going. He is commanding us to believe in Him and love one another. If, of course, we want to be disciples of Jesus, not merely fans.

This week, ask yourself if you are a fan of Jesus or a disciple of Jesus. Jesus doesn't need fans. Showing up for Mass on Sunday is a good thing, but is that the extent of your relationship with Jesus? Is that all there is? For a fan, that's enough. But are you just a fan? Pray. Talk with Jesus everyday. Put other people before yourself. Be willing to suffer for those you love. Be willing to love those you dislike. Encourage others who are struggling. Show others Jesus by the way you live. Share your gifts. Be an active part of the Church. Don't just sit there. Endure. Keep going. Don't just be a fan. Be a disciple.

St. Clare of Assisi, our Parish namesake, is a beloved Italian saint born in 1193 to an aristocratic family. She renounced her wealthy status to follow St. Francis of Assisi's call to a lifestyle of humility and poverty. She joined other sisters in a small convent at the Church of San Damiano, given to them by Francis's Order, where she eventually became the Superior.

St. Clare ministered to many, and took up basic chores such as cooking and cleaning. Her devotion to the Eucharist was so great that she performed two miracles. On two different occasions, Saracen mercenaries were about to attack the convent and impose a siege on Assisi. St. Clare simply showed the invaders the Blessed Sacrament, and they ceased in their efforts. These miracles led to her 1255 canonization.

Later in her life, St. Clare became too sick to attend Mass. It is believed that one day, she was lying in bed, when a large image appeared across her wall, as if it were a television screen. The image showed her the Mass, so St. Clare was able to watch Mass from her own bed and make an Act of Spiritual Communion. When television was invented in the 1950s, Pope Pius XII named St. Clare the patron saint of televisions and screens, since she watched television before anyone had likely thought of the concept!

We honor St. Clare because she devoted her life to the wholehearted pursuit of Christ. We can imitate her virtues by visiting the lonely, caring for the sick, or doing our menial tasks with love and without complaint.
