

A Message from Fr. Matt

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I was with my uncle, Fr. Bob, earlier this week. He had been in the hospital many weeks, and was moved recently to a nursing home in hopes of getting him back to his home at St. Augustine Friary in Lawrenceville. Man does he want to go home! He is a pretty saintly guy, but I have to admit, even knowing that, his attitude has been amazing. His struggle has been mighty these last few weeks, but today he told me that he had two thoughts about what was going on. First, he said, it has been amazing to see the unfolding of God's Providence for him these last weeks, and second, he has to eat well and drink his Ensure so that he can go home to the friary! I was thinking that if I was in his shoes, I don't know if I would have the same attitude. I might be outwardly sweet, but I'm pretty sure I'd be grumbling to those close to me. Not him. Oh he doesn't lie and say everything is fine. He knows he is still in a tough spot and he freely admits that it isn't easy. But even in the midst of that, he is able to see God providing for him. It gives him a sweetness and a peace that goes much deeper than the surface. My uncle's attitude and his motivation have seen him through days and are preparing him for a peaceful, even happy death.

I think today's readings challenge us about attitude and motivation. The First Reading and the Gospel speak of the generous and sometimes mysterious love of God. God is so good to us. God provides for us. God is so kind and so humble. All that God asks for is the smallest amount of faith, "the size of a mustard seed" our Gospel says, and He will respond with abundance. God will "lift high the lowly tree" our Fist Reading tells us. God's attitude toward



us is generosity and humility. God's motivation is love. This is what my uncle means when he speaks of God's providence. He is experiencing God's attitude of generosity. He knows in the depths of his heart that God is motivated by love of him.

It is in the Second Reading that St. Paul lays down our challenge. St. Paul says that "we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ." I think sometimes we like to downplay this judgment thing, but God doesn't lie. We will all be judged based on what we have done. It is just a fact. How does this make you feel? Is it fear? Is it dread? Or does it make you think that you better get to work fixing some things before you are judged? Maybe this is just good old "Catholic guilt". But why would we feel this way? Think about it. You will be judged, and so will I (in fact I will be judged based on you because I am responsible for helping to get you to Heaven!). But we will be judged by Jesus! He who ate with sinners, who wouldn't condemn the woman caught in adultery, who said "Father forgive them" as they mocked him on the Cross. We should have proper sorrow for our sins and proper fear of judgment, don't get me wrong, but how can we be anything but hopeful, knowing who our judge is?

What about our motivation? St. Paul says that we should "aspire to please Him." This aspiration can also be motivated by fear, but is this what St. Paul is challenging us to do? Will this bring us peace and trust in God's Providence? No. Fear will never lead to this. One thing will. Love. If love is our motivation then peace and trust will be ours.

In today's readings we see our God, generous and hopeful about us. A God motivated by love for us. We are challenged to look into the very core of our being and see if we find the same. Saint John Paul said in his first address as Pope, "Do not be afraid!", I know that our world, our lives, our health, our relationships can all be scary sometimes, but those words still ring true. Ask the Lord to open the eyes of your heart to see His generous providence for you, that you might have hope. Ask the Lord to let you know and feel His love, that you might be motivated to love in return.


Catholic Identity Program
