

A Message from Fr. Matt....

Dear Brothers and Sisters,


Have you ever tasted a Meyer Lemon? I did, and not on purpose. I thought it was a Clementine or Cutie or whatever you call those little oranges now. It certainly was not. But it really did look like one. It was deep yellow, almost orange. It was the same size. It tasted good, but not as sweet and a lot more tart than a clementine. I thought I knew what it was looking at the outside. The inside was a whole different story.

The Pharisees in the Gospel this week would have felt right at home with us in the last year and a half! The hand washing and sanitizing that we all have done is right up their alley. They would have watched us all like a hawk! I think I met some people like them this year! How about you?

The Pharisees were focused on the performance of the external action above all else. Now we all wash our hands for a purpose, to keep ourselves and others healthy. That was really the original intention of the Law that the Lord gave to Israel. He gave it to keep His people safe. It wasn't an end in itself. It had a purpose, a larger purpose. God wanted Israel to take possession of what He had won for them, as Moses said in the First Reading. The Pharisees paid such strict attention to the rule, that they forgot what it was for. They turned the Law into a god. They worried about the outside not what was within.

It is what is within us, within our hearts, that God wants to cleanse. All of the rules and laws God gives us are given so that we might be open and willing to say yes to him and take possession of what He has won for us. When Moses proclaimed this to Israel, he was talking about taking possession of the Holy Land. With Jesus, it is Eternal Life.

So let me ask you this...what is inside you? What is in your heart? This is the measure of who we are and how ready we are to take possession of what God has for us. We need to think about this. It is not about what other people think of us. It is not about who we claim to be. It is not about how well we preach or even the actions we take. No, not in themselves. Jesus wants to know what is in our hearts. We can do many good things, but what is our motivation for doing them? That is found in our hearts and that is what Jesus cares about.



So what is in your heart? If I pick up a Meyer Lemon, looking so much like a little orange, and squeeze it, lemon juice comes out, not orange juice. What if we were squeezed. When bad stuff comes our way. When we are tired or overwhelmed. No matter what we look like on the outside, what would come out from within?

This week I think that the Lord is challenging us to look into our hearts and see what is in there. There is stuff in each of your hearts that only you and God know. This is what God wants to work on. Each day this week spend a little time looking into your hearts. Show the not so good stuff to the Lord. Let Him work with you on it. Let God change your heart. God wants to do this, because He loves you and wants you to take possession of what He has won for you.

Let God love you in the deepest darkest corner of your hearts. Let God see and heal what is inside.
