Academic Program Student Centered Curriculum





St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School is fully accredited by the Board of Regents of the University of the State of New York, by Cognia®, and by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement. Our rigorous Core Curriculum prepares students for the challenge of post-secondary studies and inspires lifelong learners. Our wide array of electives provides students the opportunity to discover and enhance their God given gifts.

Students can qualify for Regents, Honors, Advanced Placement, or College Advantage level courses. Students are enrolled in courses based upon their individual strengths and interests. Our graduates exceed the NY State credit requirement for graduation. Through our College Advantage Program, many students graduate with at least a full semester worth of college credits. Our students have the opportunity to acquire college credit as early as freshman year! Our Seniors have applied, been accepted to, and have earned degrees from some of the most competitive Colleges and Universities across the country.

Preparation for post-secondary studies requires that all students take the NY State minimum sequence of Mathematics courses of Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II/Trigonometry. We follow the NY State recommendation in Science sequencing with Earth Science, Living Environment/Biology, and Chemistry. Many of our students take advanced level fourth year math and science courses to further enrich their academic program.

In preparing our students for a global community, students have a choice in their World Language Studies with options in French, Italian, or Spanish. Every student completes the Checkpoint B sequence (Level III course) while in attendance. Electives are available after their required sequence for deeper cultural knowledge in their chosen studies or students can select courses in American Sign Language.

Students have numerous choices to fulfill their NY State mandate for their Visual Art, Music, Dance, and/or Theater credit. Electives in our renowned Performing Arts Program, electives within our Art Department, as well as courses in our popular Engineering program offer students opportunities to satisfy these requirements while also pursuing their individual interests.

We require all students take at least a semester worth of Computer Science to ensure readiness and safety in utilizing the latest technology in our rapidly changing world.

Our students are not just enriched academically, but also spiritually. Students must complete five hours of volunteer community service each marking period as part of our Religious Studies Curriculum. Many of our students assist their classmates with our Peer Tutoring Program to help create that "family feel" at St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School.





Academic Research & Partnership Programs

Project Lead the Way

All students have the opportunity to enroll in our Engineering Program, Project Lead the Way (PLTW). Each PLTW Engineering course engages students in interdisciplinary activities like working with a client to design a home, programming electronic devices or robotic arms, or exploring algae as a biofuel source. These activities not only build knowledge and skills in engineering, but also empower students to develop essential skills such as problem solving, critical and creative thinking, communication, collaboration, and perseverance.



Students may receive three (3) college credits from the Rochester Institute of Technology upon completion of each course's required End of Course exam (EoC) and scores achieved.

GENESIS Research Program



The GENESIS Research Program was created to give students an opportunity to pursue areas of study in which they have a passion or interest that would go beyond the traditional classroom learning experience. Students will work with the Program Director and Project Mentors to design GENESIS projects in a field of their own interest, combining their passion and scientific methods for real life experiences.

Project Mentors may be teachers, college professors,

and/or professionals from the field of study who can share their interests and expertise with the student. Students in the GENESIS Program will learn and work in a challenging, supportive, high-tech environment where exploration, questioning, reasoning, and critical thinking are encouraged and required. The program will also afford students an opportunity to expand their personal awareness and perspectives beyond their local community to develop a global social consciousness and a lifelong desire to learn through exploration.



AP Capstone Program



AP Capstone™ is a diploma program from the College Board. It's based on two-year long AP courses: AP Seminar and AP Research. Rather than teaching subject-specific content, these courses develop students' skills in research, analysis, evidence-based arguments, collaboration, writing, and presenting. Students who complete the two-year program can earn one of two different AP Capstone awards, which are valued by colleges across the United States and around the world.

Good Samaritan University Hospital – WE CARE Partnership

Good Samaritan Hospital (GSH) and St. John the Baptist DHS (SJB) have partnered to bring various career professionals from GSH to SJB students. The program currently consists of two (2) components: 1) speakers from a variety of Departments from GSH will present information to interested students once a week after school during our Lecture Series within the first semester. These lectures include departments within the Medical Professionals, Plant Operations, Legal Careers, Medical Billing, and Administration. And 2) SJB students will be able to 'shadow' professionals from GSH in their areas of choice, once per week after school during the second semester. Participation in the program will result in the students receiving one (1) St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School credit, similar to our GENESIS Program.



Student Support





The Guidance Department consists of New York State Certified School Counselors to assist our students in facilitating their academic success.

Students are assigned a Counselor in their first year of attendance and remain with that Counselor until graduation.

Counselors will assist students in identifying their strengths and weaknesses to help create academic plans with realistic goals. Our Counselors guide students in selecting the most rigorous courses available to help reach their goals. Students are introduced to our College & Career Readiness Program; Naviance, during their first year to help plan and strategize for their high school academic plan. During the spring of the student's junior year (11th grade), a formal meeting with the student and their parent(s) is scheduled to discuss college planning and to personalize the process.

Our Counselors also offer support for students' emotional and social growth. The Guidance Center is equipped with a Quiet Room for students to decompress from the daily rigors of high school. The counselors will also direct students to access our <u>SJB Calming Room</u>; a virtual resource to assist students with techniques and strategies to help cope with any possible daily stressors.

St. John the Baptist Diocesan High School has full-time Licensed Clinical Social Workers. Our Social Workers serve as a resource for referrals to community agencies and outreach to help address any personal health or family issues. They also coordinate support groups to help address issues such as anxiety, bereavement, and depression. The students have access to our Social Workers for individual counseling in addition to any support groups. Our Social Workers advocate on behalf of the student to ensure that the students' educational, social, emotional and material needs are met in agreement with NY State and school laws, rules and regulations.

The Social Work Office collaborates with the Guidance Department and Campus Ministry as part of the Student Crisis Response Team to provide psychosocial support and crisis intervention for all students and their families.



Technology



Every student is issued a touchscreen Chromebook during Orientation before instruction begins in September. Students are shown how to access their SJB Google Account and their school Plus Portals account. The use of the Chromebook in conjunction with the classroom Smartboard technology is part of our daily instruction in addition to tradition instructional methods.

Students have access to four (4) Computer labs; a MAC lab, two (2) PC labs, and a PC lab attached to our Engineering classroom. The MAC lab, located within our state-of-the-art library, is utilized by the GENESIS Research Program and our Media Firm Club. After school, the library can be used for independent study or as a location for students in need of Peer Tutoring from our National Honor Society. Students can study a variety of Computer Science topics ranging from Advanced Placement level to introductory level. Students also have access to three (3) 3-Dimensional printers on campus.






Every day begins with a morning prayer, the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by the morning announcements conducted from our TV Studio and streamed live into the classrooms via the Smartboard technology. The TV studio is student-run with the guidance of qualified personnel to help the students master skills necessary in TV/Video production such as camera angles, lighting, sound boards, green screen technology, graphics, and broadcast techniques.

Our campus is also equipped with a Digital Radio Station where students can record podcasts that can be found on our YouTube page. Students interested in photography and film development have access to our fully operational Photography Dark Room.

A newly funded Science Anatomage Table has been installed for our future medical students.

The table is the most technologically advanced 3D anatomy visualization and virtual dissection tool for anatomy and physiology education and puts St. John the Baptist DHS on the cutting edge of curriculum advancement. Growing publications show improved test scores, more efficient lab sessions, and enhanced student experiences leading to more effective educational outcomes.

How to Become an SIB Cougar



How to Apply:

- Current 8th graders should register for the <u>TACHS Exam</u> and indicate <u>SJB</u> as one of your choices using our <u>code</u> #698. The test is administered the first Saturday in November. After the exam, a TACHS Academic Report must also be submitted to SJB. Scholarship considerations are based upon TACHS scores and 1st and 2nd choice applicants. Acceptances, based upon the TACHS results and Academic Reports, will be sent out in early January.
- Any 8th grader that missed the exam, can still apply using our **Online Application**. There will be additional documents that are required before we will review the application. An interview with the Director of Admissions will be scheduled after review of the completed application. Please see our website to access the **Online Application**.
- Students looking to transfer into SJB (grades 9-11) need to complete the **Online Application** and submit the subsequent required documents. An interview with the Director of Admissions is also required. Applicants looking to enroll for the current school year need to apply before the end of the 1st semester. We do not accept current senior year (12th grade) transfers or entering 12th grade transfers. Please see our website to access the **Online Application**.



September-October

- **1.** Check the SJB website, SJB social media, parish bulletins and print media for date and time of SJB Open House.
- **2.** Register to take the TACHS exam (Test for Admissions into Catholic High Schools) @ TACHSINFO.COM. Be sure to enter St. John the Baptist DHS code #698 as your 1st or 2nd choice.
- 3. Schedule a Private Tour of our campus after Open House.
- **4.** Schedule your child to be a Cougar for a Day after Open House.

November

1. First Saturday in November is the TACHS Exam.

December

- **2.**Be sure SJB HS Code #698 is listed on admission ticket for the exam.
- 1. Send TACHS Academic report to SJB. (NOTE: Students attending Catholic Elementary Schools will have their info automatically sent via the TACHS Portal. Students attending Public or non-Catholic Private Schools must request their records be sent by their school.)
- 2. Submit any legacy forms for consideration of acceptance.
- **3.** Student receiving services via an IESP/IEP or 504 Accommodation Plan must submit the most recent document to the admissions office.
- **4.**Students that missed the TACHS exam should apply online utilizing our Online Application from our website. An interview with the Director of Admission will be scheduled after review of completed application.



January

February - May

- 1. Acceptance notices sent home in early January via postal mail and email.
- **2.** Attend Accepted Student's evening for a 2nd look Open House.
- **3.** Secure your child's seat for the subsequent school year by submitting your Registration Fee by the Priority deadline.
- 4. Purchase your SJB Swag for Catholic Schools week.
- **1.**Submit your application for Financial Assistance via TADS account @secure.tads.com.
- **2.**Attend the Welcome Evening for instructions on selecting courses, complete your Big Sibling Interest Form, and meet your future Cougar classmates!

- **4.**Submit all remaining required documents by deadlines to ensure a smooth enrollment for September.
